# Examination in Subsidiary Subjects

- (i) x x x . Every candidate for the Degree of BA Honours shall, in addition to his Honours subject, be required to pass an examination in each of the Subsidiary subjects. The Subsidiary subjects which may be taken with a particular Main subject shall be those as detailed in the Schedule of subjects given hereafter. The Academic Council may in special cases, permit a candidate in the second or the third year of study to offer a Subsidiary subject other than the one he had previously been studying or in which he had failed.
- (i) The examination in English and a Modern Indian Language which form part of the Subsidiary subjects, may be taken at the end of the first year and the examination in the rest of the Subsidiary

subjects at the end of the second year and shall be identical with the paper set for the B.A. (Pass) Degree Examination of that year in those subjects.
