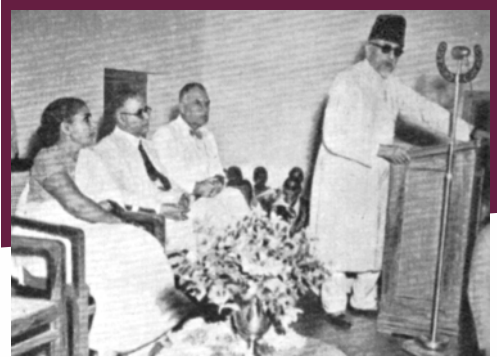

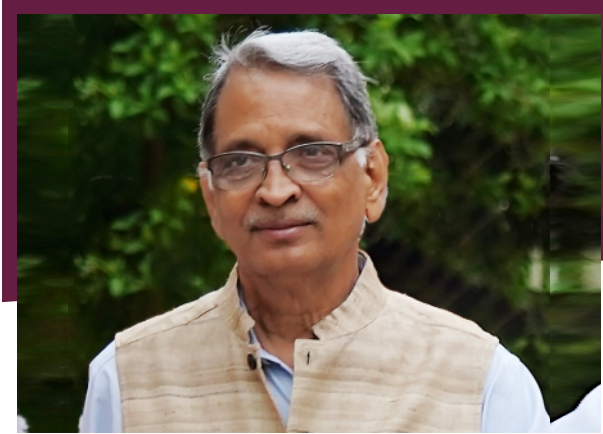

लाला देशबन्धु गुप्ता (14.06.1901 - 21.11.1951)

लाला देशबन्धु गुप्ता का जन्म 1901 ई. में पानीपत में रति राम गुप्ता के रूप में हुआ था। उन्हें स्वामी श्रद्धानन्द और महात्मा गाँधी ने 'देशबन्धु' अर्थात् 'राष्ट्र का मित्र' की उपाधि से अलंकृत किया था। अतः वह लाला देशबन्धु गुप्ता के नाम से अधिक जाने जाते थे। वे एक प्रख्यात भारतीय स्वतंत्रता सेनानी, विधायक और पत्रकार थे। उन्होंने लाला लाजपत राय के समाचारपत्र 'वन्देमातरम्' में सम्पादक के रूप में भी अपना योगदान दिया था। इस तरह पत्रकारिता के साथ उनकी जीवनभर की यात्रा आरम्भ हो गयी।

पत्रकार एवं संविधान सभा का सदस्य होने के नाते उन्होंने भारत में प्रेस की स्वतंत्रता का पुरजोर समर्थन किया और केन्द्र प्रशासित क्षेत्र दिल्ली को राज्य विधानसभा का दर्जा प्राप्त कराने के लिये बहस किया। उन्होंने दिल्ली में साम्प्रदायिक तनाव को नियंत्रित करने एवं सामाजिक समरसता को स्थापित करने में महत्वपूर्ण भूमिका निभायी। दुर्भाग्यवश कलकत्ता जाते समय 21 नवम्बर 1951 ई. को विमान दुर्घटना में उनकी मृत्यु हो गयी। एक विशिष्ट विधायक, प्रतिष्ठित पत्रकार एवं एक क्रान्तिकारी स्वतंत्रता सेनानी के रूप में देश के प्रति उनके योगदान के स्मृतिस्वरूप महाविद्यालय का नाम देशबन्धु महाविद्यालय रखा गया। यह हमारे लिये गौरव की बात है कि हम इस महाविद्यालय का अंग हैं।

Born as Rati Ram Gupta in 1901 in Panipat, Haryana, Deshbandhu Gupta was a veteran freedom fighter, legislator and journalist. He was given the epithet 'Deshbandhu', meaning 'friend of the nation', by Swami Shraddhanand and Mahatma Gandhi and ever since, has more popularly been known as Lala Deshbandhu. He was an editor for Lala Lajpat Rai's newspaper 'Vande Mataram' and later, along with Swami Shraddhanand, started the newspaper Daily Tej, published in Urdu as the Rozana Tej.

He also co-chaired the *Indian News Chronicle* (now named *The Indian Express*) with Mr. Ramnath Goenka. As both a journalist and a member of the Constituent Assembly, he stood staunchly for press freedom. He had a momentous role to play in maintaining communal harmony during the partition of India. He died in a plane crash in November 1951. His contribution to the country as a distinguished legislator, a journalist with integrity and a legendary freedom fighter is memorialized in the name of the college that we are all proud to be a part of. A statue of Lala Deshbandhu, unveiled by the college administration in the presence of his family members on August 6, 2022, stands tall on campus as a mark of honor to him.



देशबन्धु महाविद्यालय / Deshbandhu College



देशबन्धु कॉलेज दिल्ली विश्वविद्यालय द्वारा पूर्ण रूप से अनुरक्षित संबद्ध कॉलेज है, जिसे दक्षिण दिल्ली में सबसे पुराना और सबसे बड़ा सह-शिक्षा संस्थान होने का गौरव प्राप्त है। कॉलेज की स्थापना 1952 में पुनर्वास मंत्रालय द्वारा एक अनुभवी स्वतंत्रता सेनानी और संसद सदस्य लाला देशबन्धु गुप्ता की स्मृति में की गई थी। कला और विज्ञान के लिए एक प्रेप कॉलेज के रूप में अपनी छोटी शुरुआत से, इसने अब तक विभिन्न विषयों में सात स्नातकोत्तर और अठारह स्नातक पाठ्यक्रमों के साथ अपने दायरे का विस्तार किया है, जो प्रतिवर्ष 5000 से अधिक छात्रों का भविष्य-निर्माण करता है।

'कर्मण्येवाधिकारस्ते', जैसे बोध-वाक्य के द्वारा निर्देशित यह कॉलेज आकार और कद में वृद्धि को प्राप्त कर रहा है। एनआईआरएफ 2022 में कॉलेज कैटोरी के अंतर्गत अखिल भारतीय 28वीं रैंक प्राप्त किया साथ ही इंडिया टुडे रैंकिंग 2022 में हमारे कॉलेज ने विज्ञान में अखिल भारतीय 48वीं रैंक, वाणिज्य में 53वीं रैंक और कला वर्ग में 75वीं रैंक व सर्वश्रेष्ठ प्लेसमेंट रिकॉर्ड में 6वीं रैंक प्राप्त किया। कॉलेज को जैव प्रौद्योगिकी विभाग द्वारा 'डीबीटी-स्टार कॉलेज योजना' से सम्मानित किया गया है, जिसके तहत हाल ही में अंतर्विषयक अनुसंधान के लिए कॉलेज में आई-4 केंद्र (छात्र अनुसंधान केंद्र) स्थापित किया गया है। कॉलेज अपने संकाय के साथ एक मजबूत शोध प्रोफाइल को प्रस्तुत करता है, जिसने एससीआई/स्कोपस/यूजीसी-केयर अनुक्रमित अंतरराष्ट्रीय और राष्ट्रीय रेफरीड पत्रिकाओं में 220 से अधिक शोधपत्र प्रकाशित किए हैं। कॉलेज लाइब्रेरी, जो दिल्ली विश्वविद्यालय की सबसे बड़ी लाइब्रेरी में से एक है, को डी.आर.डी.ओ. के डी.ई.एस.आई.डी.ओ.सी. 'जर्नल ऑफ लाइब्रेरी एंड इंफॉर्मेशन टेक्नोलॉजी' में प्रकाशित एक अध्ययन में 2020 में विश्वविद्यालय में 'सर्वश्रेष्ठ कॉलेज लाइब्रेरी' का दर्जा दिया गया था।

देशबन्धु कॉलेज छात्रों को विभिन्न प्रकोष्ठों, क्लबों और सोसाइटियों के माध्यम

Deshbandhu College, a constituent college of the University of Delhi, is the oldest and largest co-educational institution in South Delhi. Established in 1952 by the Ministry of Rehabilitation, in memory of Lala Deshbandhu Gupta, a veteran freedom fighter and Member of Parliament, it was the first college outside the University campus. Deshbandhu College was set up specially for those displaced during the Partition and it began as a humble Prep College for Arts and Sciences with just 72 students. Today it is a highly regarded institution that offers 7 post-graduate and 18 undergraduate courses and caters to over 5000 students annually. Guided by the motto of 'karmanye vadhikaraste', it continues to grow in stature.

Distinctions

Deshbandhu College proudly celebrated 70 years of its foundation this year. The college has secured an All India Rank of 28 under the Colleges Category of the NIRF (National Institutional Ranking Framework, Govt. of India) in 2022. In the India Today rankings of 2022, it secured All India Ranks of 48, 53 and 75 in the Sciences, Commerce and Arts categories respectively. It also ranked 6 in the 'Best Placement Record' category in the India Today rankings of 2021. The college boasts of an accomplished faculty, who have published more than 220 research papers in SCI/SCOPUS/UGC-CARE indexed international and national refereed journals in the last academic year. In the various and generous research grants it has attracted together with a research oriented faculty, Deshbandhu College embodies a strong research infrastructure and profile. The college was awarded the 'DBT-Star College Scheme' by the Department of Biotechnology (Govt. of India), as part of which, an i-4 Centre (Student Research Centre) for interdisciplinary research has been set up. Deshbandhu College library, one of the largest in the university, was ranked the best college library in the university in 2020 in a study

से अपने कौशल और दक्षताओं के पोषण और संवर्धन के लिए पर्याप्त अवसर प्रदान करता है। हम अपने छात्रों को एक ऐसे वातावरण में ज्ञान और सीखने के सभी संभावित तरीकों की जांच और अन्वेषण करने के लिए प्रोत्साहित करते हैं, जो खुली बहस और चर्चा को जन्म देता है। हम न केवल जिज्ञासा की भावना पैदा करते हैं, बल्कि बाहरी दुनिया के मुद्दों और चिंताओं के साथ उनकी कक्षा की शिक्षा को समझने और जोड़ने का उत्साह भी पैदा करते हैं। कॉलेज ने अत्यधिक प्रतिबद्ध और प्रेरित एनसीसी और एनएसएस के माध्यम से समाज से जुड़ाव और आउटरीच के क्षेत्र में अपने लिए एक जगह बनाई है, जिसने अपनी गतिविधियों और प्रदर्शन के लिए कई प्रशंसा और पुरस्कार जीते हैं। समाज की बेहतरी हेतु अपना योगदान देने और लोकाचारपूर्वक कॉलेज ने हाल ही में 'उन्नत भारत अभियान योजना' के तहत 5 गाँव को गोद लिया है। संस्थान 'विद्या विस्तार योजना' में भी भारीदार है, जिसके तहत उसने अकादमिक और शोध आदान-प्रदान हेतु मणिपुर के दूरवर्ती एक कॉलेज के साथ करार किया है। इसके अलावा, कॉलेज ने छात्रों की क्षमताओं और दक्षताओं का पोषण करने और उन्हें रोजगार योग्य बनाने और जीवन-कौशल प्रदान करने में सक्षम बनाने के लिए, विभिन्न कंपनियों के अलावा, चार विभिन्न क्षेत्र के स्किल काउंसिल के साथ समझौता ज्ञापन पर हस्ताक्षर किया है।

कॉलेज ने एक कुशल आंतरिक गुणवत्ता आश्वासन प्रकोष्ठ (आईक्यूएसी) की स्थापना की है जो कॉलेज के शैक्षणिक मानकों को बनाए रखने और उसके विस्तार पर केंद्रित है। महिला विकास प्रकोष्ठ (डब्ल्यूडीसी) सतत लैंगिक समानता, लैंगिक न्याय और लिंग जागरूकता से संबंधित मुद्दों से और ऐसे तरीकों से जुड़ा हुआ है जिसका उद्देश्य है छात्र निकाय के बीच महिला सशक्तिकरण और लैंगिक मुद्दों के बारे में जागरूकता बढ़ाना। हमें न केवल अपनी विस्तृत और सुदृढ़ खेल सुविधाओं पर गर्व है, बल्कि हम खेल और शारीरिक प्रशिक्षण पर औपचारिक पाठ्यक्रम भी पढ़ाते हैं। हमारे पास अत्याधुनिक वेब एक्सेस सेंटर है जो हमारे छात्रों की आवश्यकताओं को भी पूरा करता है। कॉलेज मेधावी और जरूरतमंद छात्रों को वित्तीय सहायता भी प्रदान करता है ताकि वे कॉलेज की डिग्री प्राप्त कर अपने सपने को पूरा कर सकें।

60 प्रतिशत से अधिक हरित आवरण के साथ विशाल परिसर में अवस्थित इस कॉलेज में फ्लोरा की 35 से अधिक प्रजातियाँ, विशाल लॉन, खेल के मैदान एक परेड ग्राउंड और बॉटनिकल गार्डन है। कॉलेज परिसर एक प्रशासनिक और शैक्षणिक ब्लॉक, 200 लोगों के बैठने की क्षमता वाला एक वातानुकूलित सभागार, अच्छी तरह से सुसज्जित प्रयोगशालाओं, छात्रों के कॉमन रूम, व्यायामशाला, कैंटीन, फोटोकॉपी की दुकान, चिकित्सा कक्ष, बैंकिंग सुविधा, सेमिनार हॉल और विशाल स्मार्ट कक्षाओं से युक्त है जो ज्ञान-प्रसार और ज्ञान-निर्माण के लिए सही सेटिंग प्रदान करते हैं। कॉलेज 72 किलोवाट की स्थापित क्षमता वाली सौर पैनलों, प्रयोगशालाओं में पीएनजी, एक हरित ईंधन, वर्षा जल संचयन प्रणाली, 80 प्रतिशत एलईडी के साथ ऊर्जा संचयन प्रकाश व्यवस्था जैसी पहलों के साथ एक ग्रीन कैम्पस में बदलने की प्रक्रिया में है। प्रकाश व्यवस्था और 5 स्टार और वीआरएफ रेटिंग एयर कंडीशनिंग सिस्टम और जैविक खाद के उत्पादन के लिए एक एकीकृत कंपोजिटिंग सुविधा का निर्माण किया। कॉलेज परिसर अलग-अलग दिव्यांग व्यक्तियों के लिए निर्धारित मानदंडों के अनुसार 100 प्रतिशत सुविधाओं से युक्त है।

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Life and learning at Deshbandhu

The college has instituted an efficient Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) that is focussed on maintaining and enhancing the academic standards of the college. Green and smart campus

Admission Process

For admission to Undergraduate programs of the University of Delhi, all candidates (Including those applying for supernumerary seats) must register for CUET-2022 at <https://cuet.samarth.ac.in>

The University shall consider the subject-based "Normalized Scores" as declared by the NTA in the CUET (UG)-2022 Score Card of the candidates.

Merit will be based only on the 'combination of subjects in which a candidate has appeared in CUET' as mentioned in the respective Program-Specific Eligibility.

1. GENERAL GUIDELINES

1. The applicant must be a citizen of India. (Note: 10% of supernumerary seats are reserved for foreign nationals. Candidates seeking admission under Foreign Students' category are required to apply on Foreign Students' Registry website, <http://fsr.du.ac.in>).
2. The applicant should have passed the Class XII examination of any Board/ University examination in India or in any foreign country recognized as equivalent to the 10+2 system by the Association of Indian Universities (AIU).
3. Admissions to all Undergraduate Programs at the University of Delhi will be based on the scores obtained in CUET 2022.
4. Merit will be based only on the 'combination of subjects in which a candidate has appeared in CUET' as mentioned in the respective Program-Specific Eligibility.
5. Only the scores obtained in CUET 2022 will be considered for admissions to the academic year 2022-23.
6. As per ordinance-I of University, there is no minimum age bar for admission to the undergraduate programs in the University and its colleges.
7. Gap year will not be a bar for the purpose of admission to undergraduate programs. However, such candidates must have appeared in CUET-2022 for admissions in academic year-2022.

2. EQUIVALENCE OF BOARDS

The applications for admission to all the UG programs in the Colleges in respect of candidates belonging to the Examining bodies of Boards / Universities recognized/accredited by the Association of Indian University (AIU) / University Grants Commission (UGC) / Ministry of Education (MoE) shall be considered in terms of the following recommendations as mentioned in the University circular letter of 13.01.2005.

- Senior School Certificate of various Boards recognized by AIU /Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) is considered as equivalent to the Senior School Certificate of Central Board for the purposes of eligibility to various Undergraduate programs.
- Candidates who pass various Degree / School Examination of Foreign Universities / Boards as having already been approved by the Equivalence Committee, from time to time, will be considered eligible as a matter of routine. The cases of only those Candidates who do not fall in the list of AIU /UGC /Council of Boards of School Education in India (COBSE) / MoE recognized accredited Boards/ Universities shall be referred to the University on an individual basis.

3. ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS FOR UNDERGRADUATE ADMISSIONS

3.1 Common Minimum Eligibility

The candidate must have passed the Class XII or its equivalent examination from a single recognized board.

4. SEAT ALLOCATION AND ADMISSION

- On declaration of the allocation list/s, the candidate must check the lists carefully and log on to his/her CSAS-2022 dashboard for acceptance of the allocated seat, if offered.
- It is the responsibility of the candidate to login to the dashboard and check if a seat is allocated in a given round of seat allocation, and if allocated s(he) must complete all admission formalities.

4.1: ACCEPTANCE OF THE PROVISIONALLY ALLOCATED SEAT

- Once a seat has been allocated in a particular round, the candidate must 'Accept' the Allocated Seat before the last date/time specified for the given allocation round.
- The provision for acceptance of a particular Allocated Seat will be valid only for the round in which the seat was allocated to the candidate.
- In case a candidate is offered multiple seats in a particular round, s(he) must "Accept" ONE Allocated seat ONLY.
- Inactivity/no-action will be taken as non-acceptance to the Allocated Seat. It will be treated as a decline to the provisionally Allocated Seat and the candidate will no longer be able to participate in subsequent rounds of CSAS-2022

4.2: ONLINE APPROVAL BY THE COLLEGE

Once the candidate "Accept" the provisionally Allocated Seat, the concerned College will check the eligibility and documents uploaded by the candidate. The College will verify the following within the stipulated timeline:

1. Minimum Eligibility of the Candidate.
2. Program-Specific Eligibility of the Candidate.
3. Subject Mapping: UoD will consider only those CUET subjects in which s(he) has passed Class XII.
4. Validity and authenticity of Documents/Certificates submitted by the Candidate.

During the online approval process, if a college seeks more clarity/information from the candidate, it may raise a query to the Candidate (refer to Section 6.3).

After verification, the College will either 'Approve' or 'Reject' the provisionally Allocated Seat of the candidate. No application will be left unattended by the Colleges.

In case of Approval:

Once the College accords the approval, the candidate will have to pay the 'Admission Fee'.

In case of Rejection:

At the time of online verification, if an application gets rejected, the College will state the reason for rejection. For rejecting an application, the College will indicate any of the following reason/s:

1. Non-fulfillment of the Minimum Eligibility by the Candidate.
2. Not-fulfillment of Program-Specific Eligibility by the Candidate.
3. Non-fulfillment of the subject-mapping criteria.
4. Invalid documents/certificates submitted by the candidate.
5. Failure to respond to the query(ies) raised by the College within the stipulated time.

4.3: RESPOND TO QUERIES (IF ANY) DURING COLLEGE APPROVALS

- During the online approval process, if a College raises a query(ies) then the candidate must respond online (through the candidate's dashboard) within the stipulated time.
- Failure to respond to the query(ies) will lead to rejection of the Allocated Seat and the candidate will be out of CSAS-2022.

4.4: ADMISSION TO THE PROVISIONALLY ALLOCATED SEAT

- After the College approves, the candidate will have to pay the Admission Fee for the approved seat
- The admission process will be treated as complete only after successful payment of the admission fee
- If a candidate fails to pay the admission fee within the stipulated time, it will be considered as a cancellation of the provisionally Allocated Seat.
- The Allocated Seat shall be forfeited and the candidate will not be considered for any subsequent CSAS-2022 allocation rounds.
- The candidate will forfeit all the rights of the allocated seat and will not be considered for any subsequent CSAS-2022 allocation rounds.

5. SUBSEQUENT ROUNDS OF ALLOCATION

- Based on the availability of the seats that arise due to rejections, cancellations, and withdrawals, the University may announce multiple allocation rounds.
- The UoD will display the vacant seats on its admission website (admission.uod.ac.in) before every allocation round.
- All candidates who have applied for CSAS-2022 will be eligible for all allocation rounds, except those whose allocated seat/admission has been canceled for whatever reason.
- All admitted candidates who opt for the "Upgrade" option in a particular round will be considered for respective CSAS-2022 allocation round, subject to the availability of seats.
- Candidates who were allocated their first preference in any round will not be considered in subsequent rounds of allocation.

6. UPGRADE OR FREEZE

Before the announcement of a round, the University will open an "Upgrade" Window for all admitted candidates

6.1: UPGRADE

- An admitted candidate can select the 'Upgrade' option, which will allow upgradation to a higher preference submitted by the candidate. Admitted candidates who opt for upgradation will automatically be upgraded based on the allocation policy.
- Choosing the option 'Upgrade' will mean that the candidate consents to consideration of an offer of admission to a Program + College Combination of his/her higher preference in the subsequent round (if any). His/her current admitted seat will be auto canceled if new preference/s is/are allocated.
- A candidate who opts for 'Upgrade' can also reorder the Program + College Combinations that were higher in preference than the allocated one.
- The Program + College Combination in which s(he) had taken an admission earlier will never be offered to the candidate in any subsequent round.
- Similarly, the Program + College combinations which were below in the preference order at which the candidate had taken an admission earlier will never be offered again to the candidate in any subsequent round.
- The upgrade option will not be available for the candidate who was allocated his/her first preference. It will be the responsibility of the candidate to keep checking for 'Upgrade' options in all rounds of seat allocations. Failure/inability to participate in the upgradation process will not be considered a grievance in any circumstance.
- **A candidate who gets upgraded will have to 'Accept' the upgraded seat and complete the admission procedures on the upgraded Allocated Seat/s. If a candidate does not do any activity on the upgraded seat/s, it will, by default, be considered canceled and the candidate will be out of CSAS-2022.**
- In case, a candidate does not get upgraded, his/her admission to the earlier seat will be retained.

6.2: FREEZE

- A candidate who has taken admission on an Allocated Seat and desires to continue with it should submit a 'Freeze' request through his/her dashboard. **On selecting 'Freeze', such a candidate will never be allowed to opt for "Upgradation."**
- If an admitted candidate neither opts for upgradation nor opts for Freeze, and remains inactive for a round, the admission taken by him/her will be retained and he/she will not be considered for upgradation.

7. CANCELLATION OF PROVISIONALLY ALLOCATED SEAT/ADMISSION

1. Failure to 'Accept' the provisionally Allocated Seat within the stipulated timeline will lead to the cancellation of the Allocated Seat.
2. The provisionally Allocated Seat will be canceled if a candidate fails to pay the Admission fee within the stipulated time.
3. The provisionally Allocated Seat/Admission will be canceled if, at any time, any of the document(s)/certificate(s) is/are found to be invalid/fraudulent.
4. The provisionally Allocated Seat/Admission will be canceled if, at any time, it is found that a candidate does not meet the Minimum Eligibility Criteria as declared by UoD.

A candidate whose provisionally allocated seat/admission is canceled due to the above-mentioned reasons will forfeit the right to seek admission to UoD through CSAS-2022.

8. WITHDRAWAL OF ADMISSION BY THE CANDIDATE

- A candidate who has taken an admission but wishes to withdraw can do so through his/her dashboard by selecting the 'Withdraw' option and paying a withdrawal fee of Rs. 1000.00 (non-refundable).
- A candidate who withdraws his/her admission will be out of CSAS-2022.
- He/she will forfeit his/her eligibility for admission to UG Programs of UoD.
- No further participation in any of the subsequent allocation rounds (if any) will be allowed.

There will be no option to withdraw the admission once the Spot Admission round is announced.

9. MID-ENTRY

- Candidates who failed to apply for CSAS-2022 within the stipulated time and are desirous of participating in CSAS-2022 can participate through the Mid-Entry window (whenever University announces it), by paying a Mid-Entry fee of Rs. 1000.00 (non-refundable).
- A candidate who makes a Mid-Entry may be considered for allocation only after all the candidates who had applied earlier and have the merit score/s higher than the lowest declared score have been allocated.
- A candidate who applies to CSAS-2022 mid-way will not hold any right to claim the seats allocated to candidates who had applied to CSAS-2022 during the initial Application Phase.
- Allocation of seats to such candidates may be considered for subsequent rounds (if any), subject to fulfillment of eligibility criteria, availability of seats, and other CSAS-2022 rules.
- It will be mandatory for the Mid-Entrant to take admission on the seat allocated to him/her, if offered. Failure to accept the allocated seat will forfeit the candidate's admission to UoD.
- There will be no option of 'Upgrade'. The seat allocated in a particular allocation round will be final and will not be upgraded in any subsequent allocation round.
- Mid-Entry will only be considered after successful remittance of the Mid-Entry fee.
- **Merely applying through Mid-Entry does not guarantee a seat through CSAS-2022.**

Mid-Entry will not be allowed for Performance-Based Programs (B.A.(Hons) Music, B.Sc Physical Education, Health Education, and Sports), and ECA, Sports Supernumerary Quota.

10. SPOT ADMISSION

- After the completion of regular CSAS-2022 rounds, if seats remain vacant, UoD may announce Spot round/s of admission.
- Candidates who applied for CSAS-2022 but were not admitted to any College on the date of declaration of the Spot Admission round can participate in Spot Admissions.
- On the announcement of Spot Admission, the admission of all already candidates will be locked and they will not be considered for upgrades.
- Similarly, the admitted candidates will not be allowed to withdraw their admissions.
- To be considered in a Spot Admission round, the candidate will have to opt for 'Spot Admission' through his/her dashboard.
- For every Spot Admission round the University will display the vacant seats of each Program. A desirous candidate will be able to select ONLY ONE Program.
- In Spot Admissions, allocations will be done on the basis of the following criteria:
 - Availability of seats.
 - Program-Specific merit.
 - Order of Preference of College.
 - Category.
 - Any other allocation rules, policies, or criteria as mentioned in this document (CSAS-2022), UG BOI – 2022, or published on the admission website of UoD
- It will be mandatory for the candidate to take admission to the seat allocated in a Spot round. Failure to accept the allocated seat in the Spot Admission round will forfeit the candidate's eligibility for admission to UoD and s(he) will be out of CSAS.
- There will be no option of 'Upgrade' and 'Withdraw' during the Spot Admission rounds. **The seat allocated in a particular Spot Admission round will be final** and will not be upgraded in any subsequent round of Spot Admission rounds.

11. TIE-BREAKING RULES

In the event of a tie, where two or more candidates have the same CUET(UG) - 2022 merit score for a Program + College Combination, the following rules will be applied in the stated order to break the tie:

1. The candidate with a higher percentage of aggregate marks in the Best 3 subjects of Class XII will be given preference
2. The candidate with a higher percentage of aggregate marks in the Best 4 subjects of Class XII will be given preference.
3. The candidates with a higher percentage of aggregate marks in the Best 5 subjects of Class XII will be given preference.
4. Age of the candidate; preference will be given to the candidate having an earlier date of birth (as mentioned in the Class X certificate).

Note:

1. If the mark sheet contains both Class XI and Class XII marks, only Class XII marks will be considered.
2. Any discrepancy in the entry of marks pertaining to the Theory, Practical or Total, will be the sole responsibility of the candidate.
3. If the Class XII mark sheet contains CGPA/Grades, the candidate will have to convert the Grades into equivalent marks/percentages as per the issuing examination board (refer to Annexure II for Grade conversion).

12. REMITTANCE OF FEE

- Admission of a candidate will be deemed confirmed only after the successful realization of the Admission Fee.
- The admission fee must be paid only through the candidate's dashboard.
- If the admission fee is not successfully remitted within the stipulated time, the admission will not be considered complete under any circumstances. For all payments, candidates should use any of these payment modes: Net Banking / Debit Card / Credit Card / UPI.

12.1: VIRTUAL WALLET

- Upon the successful remittance of the Admission Fee, a virtual wallet will be created for a candidate.
- In case a candidate gets upgraded and the Admission Fee of the upgraded seat is more than the amount in the virtual wallet of the candidate, s(he) will have to pay the differential amount within the stipulated time.
- In case the Admission fee of the upgraded seat is less than the amount in the virtual wallet of the candidate, it will be auto-debited upon receiving approval from the College.

12.2: PAYMENT FAILURES

1. If the amount is not deducted from the account, the candidate must try paying again before the payment deadline.
2. Candidate must ensure a stable internet connection is used for making the online payment.
3. Candidate must use the correct credentials to make a successful payment.
4. If the amount is deducted, but a notification is not received, the candidate may seek confirmation from his/her source bank.
5. If a successful transaction is confirmed from the source Bank and the payment failure continues to be reflected on the dashboard.
6. In that case, the candidate may contact the ICICI Eazypay Payment Gateway Helpline between 9.30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m., Monday to Saturday (except second and fourth Saturdays) at the following numbers.

13. RULES OF REFUND OF FEE

Admission Fee on account of withdrawal of the admission by the candidate will be refunded completely only if the withdrawal has been made before the last date of admission, as announced by UoD. Admission fee for withdrawals done after the last date of admission will not be refunded in any circumstance.

Refunds will not be done for the following:

- CSAS-2022 Application Fee.
- Mid-Entry Fee.
- Withdrawal Fee.

14. MANDATORY REQUIREMENT OF PHYSICAL VERIFICATION OF ORIGINAL DOCUMENTS

At the conclusion of CSAS-2022, all admitted candidates would have to report to the admitted College and complete all the admission formalities of the concerned College, including physical verification of the documents/certificates.

Admission of a candidate is purely provisional and is subject to verification of original documents by the respective College. The College will recheck all the documents/certificates. During physical verification, if any document/certificate is found inadequate/ insufficient/ inappropriate, it will lead to cancellation of the admission, ipso facto. Further, such a candidate will forfeit the opportunity for admission to any UG Program of UoD for the Academic Session 2022-23.

15. CHANGE OF CLASS XII PASSING STATUS

The Class XII passing status of a candidate may change (due to re-totalling, re-evaluation, etc.) by the examination board after the closure of CSAS-2022 Application form.

The following shall apply consequently to such a revision of passing status only during the seat allocation period:

- Due to revision of Class XIIth passing status, a candidate may become ineligible because of not fulfilling the 'Minimum Common Eligibility' (i.e., the Candidate must have passed Class XII or its equivalent from a single recognized board) criteria. In such a case, the candidate will be ineligible at any stage of seat allocation/acceptance/document verification or even at a later stage. The admission of such candidates will stand canceled without any prior notice in this regard
- Due to revision of Class XIIth passing status, if a candidate fulfills the 'Minimum Common Eligibility' (i.e. the Candidate must have passed Class XII or its equivalent from a single recognized board) criteria and becomes eligible for admission, then such a candidate may apply to CSAS-2022 through Mid-Entry.

The decision of the University shall be final and binding in all such cases



RESERVATIONS

Reservation of Seats for Scheduled Caste (SC) and Scheduled Tribe (ST) Candidates

22.5% of the total numbers of seats is reserved for Candidates belonging to Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribes (15% for Scheduled Caste and 7.5% for Scheduled Tribes, interchangeable if necessary).

The Candidate must be in possession of the Caste/Tribe certificate in his/her own name at the time of Registration and Admission. The Caste certificate should clearly state:

- (a) Name of his/her caste/tribe
- (b) Whether candidate belongs to SC or ST
- (c) District and the State or Union Territory of Candidate's usual place of residence, and
- (d) the appropriate Govt. of India Schedule under which his / her caste / tribe is approved as SC or ST.

Candidate will have to produce the valid original SC or ST caste/tribe certificate at the time of admission.

The following are empowered to issue the requisite SC / ST certificate:

- a. District Magistrate / Additional District Magistrate / Collector / Deputy Commissioner / Addl. Deputy Commissioner / Deputy Collector / 1st class Stipendiary Magistrate / City Magistrate / Sub-Divisional Magistrate / Taluka Magistrate / Executive Magistrate / Extra Assistant Commissioner.
- b. Chief Presidency Magistrate / Addl. Chief Presidency Magistrate / Presidency Magistrate.
- c. Revenue Officer not below the rank of Tehsildar.
- d. Sub- Divisional Officer of the area where the Candidate and/ or his family normally resides.
- e. Administrator / Secretary to the Administrator/ Development Officer (Lakshadweep Islands).

Candidates to note that the SC / ST Certificate from any other person / authority shall not be accepted in any case. If the Candidate happens to belong to SC or ST, Candidate's caste / tribe must be listed in the appropriate Govt. of India Schedule.

It is a statutory obligation on the part of Colleges to fill all seats reserved for Scheduled Caste / Scheduled Tribe Candidates.

Colleges shall not refuse admission to any SC / ST Candidate on the basis of medium of instruction. Any deficiency in the knowledge of any particular language should be addressed; for this purpose remedial classes may be arranged by the College by utilizing grants available from University Grants Commission.

Reservation of Seats for Other Backward Classes (OBC, Non-Creamy Layer, Central List)

27% seats are reserved for the Candidates belonging to Other Backward Classes (OBC - Non-Creamy Layer, Central List).

At the time of giving admission to an OBC Candidate, the College will ensure that the caste is included in the Central List of OBC (the OBC status is to be determined on the basis of the Central (Govt. of India) List of OBCs notified by the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment on the recommendations of the National Commission for Backward Classes (available at the website http://ncbc.nic.in/backward_classes/index.html.)

The certificate must mention non-creamy layer status of the Candidate (Non-creamy layer status issued by an authority mentioned in DOPT Office Memorandum no. 36012/22/93- Estt. (SCT) dated 15.11.1993).

The OBC Candidates who belong to the 'Non-Creamy Layer' and whose caste appears in the Central List of the OBCs only, shall be eligible to be considered for admission under the OBC category (Validity period of OBC certificate in respect of 'non-creamy layer' status of the Candidates as per DOPT Office Memorandum No. 36036/2/2013-Estt. (Res- I) dated 31 March 2016). The certificate should be issued on or after 31st March, 2022.

It is a statutory obligation on the part of Colleges to fill all the seats reserved for OBC Candidates.

Reservation policy for Economically Weaker Sections (EWS)

As per the University of Delhi notifications (Reference No. Aca. I / Reservation of EWSs / 2019/ 63 Dated 28th March 2019 and Reference No. Aca. I / Reservation of EWSs / 2019 / 101 Dated 15th May 2019), for the reservation for Economically Weaker Sections (EWSs) Category, the University Departments / Centres / Colleges have reserved 10% seats for admission of candidates belonging to EWS category.

Admission to Supernumerary Seats

Admission to all supernumerary seats will be through CUET 2022. Candidates desirous of taking admission on Supernumerary seats must appear in CUET 2022.

Reservation of Seats for Persons with Benchmark Disabilities (PwBD)

“Person with benchmark disability” means a person with not less than forty percent (40%) of a specified disability where specified disability has not been defined in measurable terms and includes a person with disability where specified disability has been defined in measurable terms, as certified by the certifying authority.

Five percent (5%) of the total sanctioned strength in each Program of all Colleges are reserved for PwBD candidates. Separate Merit List/s will be declared for candidates seeking admission under PwBD quota.

Reservation for Children/Widows of Personnel of the Armed Forces (CW)

Five percent (5%) of seats are reserved for Candidates under this category, program-wise in all colleges.

Candidates desirous of taking admission under the CW quota of the University must appear in CUET 2022.

All such Candidates have to upload the Educational Concession certificate issued by any of the following authorities on the proper letterhead:

- Secretary, Kendriya Sainik Board, Delhi.
- Secretary, Rajya Zila Sainik Board.
- Officer-in-Charge, Record Office.
- 1st Class Stipendiary Magistrate.
- Ministry of Home Affairs (For Police Personnel in receipt of Gallantry Awards)

No other format shall be permissible. Proofs of the CW category in the form of ID card of parent or dependent, Medical card, Ration card, CSD card, etc. are not admissible in lieu of certificate in correct format. The priority must be clearly mentioned in the certificate. Certificates that do not mention the relevant priority will not be considered.

Note: For further details of Priority in respect to CW candidates refer to the University Bulletin of Information for UG Admissions (2022-23).

Reservation of Kashmiri Migrants (KM)

Up to 5% seats are reserved program-wise in all colleges for the wards of Kashmiri Migrants. All the wards of Kashmiri Migrants will have to upload a certificate of registration as Kashmiri Migrants issued by Divisional Commissioner/ Relief Commissioner.

Candidates desirous of taking admission under the Kashmiri Migrants quota must appear in CUET 2022.

Prime Minister's Special Scholarship Scheme for J&K students

Candidates desirous of taking admission under the Prime Minister's Special Scholarship Scheme for J&K students must appear in CUET 2022.

Nomination of Seats for Sikkimese Students

Candidates desirous of taking admission under the Sikkim nomination scheme must appear in CUET 2022. Sikkimese students nominated by the Govt. of Sikkim shall be considered for admission by the University in Colleges where hostel facilities are available (AC Resolutions 51 dated 05/06/1980 and 122 dated 17/12/1990).

The allocation of Sikkimese students for admission as well as for hostel accommodation in respective colleges will be made by the Vice-Chancellor at his discretion.

Ward Quota of Employees of University of Delhi

Candidates desirous of taking admission under the Ward Quota of Employees of University of Delhi must appear in CUET 2022.

Admission to the wards of University and its College employees, both teaching and non-teaching will be done as per Academic Council resolution 9a & b dated 27.11.2020 and subsequent amendments thereof.

Candidates must be in possession of a valid Employment Certificate issued by due officials at the time of registration. Only the Employment certificate uploaded at the time of registration will be considered. I-cards, Aadhar Card and/or any other document will not be accepted.

Extra-Curricular Activities (ECA) and Sports Quota

Candidates desirous of taking admission under the supernumerary quota for ECA and/or Sports must appear in CUET 2022.

For admissions to ECA and Sports supernumerary seats a weightage of 25% will be given to CUET score and 75% to certificates/trials/performances.

Further details shall be notified separately.

प्रवेश-प्रक्रिया और अन्य सूचनाएँ

दिल्ली विश्वविद्यालय के स्नातक-स्तरीय कार्यक्रमों में प्रवेश के लिए, सभी उम्मीदवारों (अतिरिक्त सीटों के लिए आवेदन करने वाले उम्मीदवारों सहित) को CUET-2022 के लिए <https://cuet.samarth.ac.in> पर पंजीकरण करना होगा।

विश्वविद्यालय उम्मीदवारों के सीयूईटी (यूजी)-2022 स्कोर कार्ड में एनटीए द्वारा घोषित विषय-आधारित "सामान्यीकृत स्कोर" पर विचार करेगा।

मेरिट केवल 'उन विषयों के संयोजन पर आधारित होगी जिसमें एक उम्मीदवार सीयूईटी में उपस्थित हुआ है' जैसा कि संबंधित कार्यक्रम-विशिष्ट पात्रता में उल्लिखित है।

1. सामान्य दिशानिर्देश

1. आवेदक भारत का नागरिक होना चाहिए (नोट: 10% अतिरिक्त सीटें विदेशी नागरिकों के लिए आरक्षित हैं। विदेशी छात्रों की श्रेणी के तहत प्रवेश पाने वाले उम्मीदवारों को विदेशी छात्रों की रजिस्ट्री वेबसाइट, <http://fsr.du.ac.in> पर आवेदन करना आवश्यक है।)
2. आवेदक को भारतीय विश्वविद्यालय संघ (एआईयू) द्वारा 10+2 प्रणाली के समकक्ष मान्यता प्राप्त भारत में या किसी विदेशी देश में किसी बोर्ड/विश्वविद्यालय परीक्षा की बारहवीं कक्षा उत्तीर्ण होना चाहिए।
3. दिल्ली विश्वविद्यालय में सभी स्नातक कार्यक्रमों में प्रवेश CUET 2022 में प्राप्त अंक के आधार पर होगा।
4. मेरिट केवल 'उन विषयों के संयोजन पर आधारित होगी जिसमें उम्मीदवार CUET उपस्थित हुआ है, जैसा कि संबंधित कार्यक्रम-विशिष्ट पात्रता में उल्लिखित है।
5. शैक्षणिक वर्ष 2022-23 में प्रवेश के लिए केवल CUET 2022 में प्राप्त अंकों पर विचार किया जाएगा।
6. विश्वविद्यालय के अध्यादेश-1 के अनुसार, विश्वविद्यालय और उसके कॉलेजों में स्नातक कार्यक्रम में प्रवेश के लिए कोई न्यूनतम आयु सीमा नहीं है।
7. स्नातक कार्यक्रमों में प्रवेश के लिए गैप ईयर रुकावट(बार) नहीं होगा। हालांकि, ऐसे उम्मीदवारों शैक्षणिक वर्ष-2022 में प्रवेश के लिए CUET-2022 में अवश्य उपस्थित हुए हों।

सीट आवंटन और प्रवेश

- आवंटन सूची/सूचियों की घोषणा होने पर, उम्मीदवार को सूचियों की सावधानीपूर्वक जांच करनी चाहिए और आवंटित सीट की स्वीकृति के लिए अपने सीएसएस-2022 डैशबोर्ड पर लॉग ऑन करना चाहिए, यदि पेशकश जाती है।
- यह उम्मीदवार की जिम्मेदारी है कि वह डैशबोर्ड में लॉग इन करे और जांचे कि सीट आवंटन के लिए दिए गए दौर में सीट आवंटित की गई है या नहीं, और यदि आवंटित किया गया है तो उसे समस्त प्रवेश- औपचारिकताओं को पूरा करना होगा।

4.1 अनंतिम रूप से आवंटित सीट की स्वीकृति

- एक विशेष दौर में एक बार सीट आवंटित हो जाने पर, उम्मीदवार को दिए गए आवंटन दौर के लिए निर्दिष्ट अंतिम तिथि/समय से पहले, आवंटित सीट को 'स्वीकार' करना होगा।
- किसी विशेष आवंटित सीट की स्वीकृति का प्रावधान केवल उसी दौर के लिए मान्य होगा जिसमें उम्मीदवार को सीट आवंटित की गई थी।
- यदि किसी उम्मीदवार को किसी विशेष दौर में कई सीटों की पेशकश की जाती है, तो उसे केवल एक आवंटित सीट को "स्वीकार" करना होगा।
- निष्क्रियता को आवंटित सीट के अस्वीकरण के रूप में लिया जाएगा। इसे अनंतिम रूप से आवंटित सीट में गिरावट के रूप में माना जाएगा और उम्मीदवार अब CSAS-2022 के बाद के दौर में भाग नहीं ले पाएंगे।

4.2: कॉलेज द्वारा ऑनलाइन स्वीकृति

एक बार जब उम्मीदवार अनंतिम रूप से आवंटित सीट को "स्वीकार" कर लेता है, तो संबंधित कॉलेज उम्मीदवार द्वारा अपलोड की गई पात्रता और दस्तावेजों की जांच करेगा। कॉलेज निर्धारित समय सीमा के भीतर निम्नलिखित का सत्यापन करेगा:

1. उम्मीदवार की न्यूनतम पात्रता।
2. उम्मीदवार की कार्यक्रम-विशिष्ट पात्रता।
3. विषय मानचित्रण: यूओडी केवल उन सीयूईटी विषयों पर विचार करेगा जिनमें उसने (उसने) कक्षा बारहवीं उत्तीर्ण की है।
4. उम्मीदवार द्वारा जमा किए गए दस्तावेजों/प्रमाणपत्रों की वैधता और प्रामाणिकता।

ऑनलाइन अनुमोदन प्रक्रिया के दौरान, यदि कोई कॉलेज उम्मीदवार से अधिक स्पष्टता/सूचना चाहता है, तो वह उम्मीदवार से एक प्रश्न पूछ सकता है (खंड 6.3 देखें)।

सत्यापन के बाद, कॉलेज उम्मीदवार की अस्थायी रूप से आवंटित सीट को 'स्वीकृत' या 'अस्वीकार' करेगा। महाविद्यालयों द्वारा कोई भी आवेदन अनुत्तरित नहीं छोड़ा जाएगा।

स्वीकृति के मामले में:

एक बार जब कॉलेज ने मंजूरी दे दी, तो उम्मीदवार को 'प्रवेश शुल्क' का भुगतान करना होगा

अस्वीकृति के मामले में:

ऑनलाइन सत्यापन के समय, यदि कोई आवेदन खारिज हो जाता है, तो कॉलेज अस्वीकृति का कारण बताएगा। किसी आवेदन को स्वीकार करने के लिए, कॉलेज निम्नलिखित कारणों में से किसी एक का संकेत देगा:

1. उम्मीदवार द्वारा न्यूनतम पात्रता की पूर्ति न करना।
2. उम्मीदवार द्वारा कार्यक्रम-विशिष्ट पात्रता की पूर्ति न करना।
3. विषय-मानचित्रण मानदंड की पूर्ति न करना।
4. उम्मीदवार द्वारा जमा किए गए अमान्य दस्तावेज/प्रमाण पत्र।
5. निर्धारित समय के भीतर कॉलेज द्वारा उठाए गए प्रश्नों का उत्तर देने में विफलता।

4.3: कॉलेज के अनुमोदन के दौरान प्रश्नों का उत्तर (यदि कोई हो)

- ऑनलाइन अनुमोदन प्रक्रिया के दौरान, यदि कोई कॉलेज कोई प्रश्न पूछता है तो उम्मीदवार को अवश्य ही निर्धारित समय के भीतर ऑनलाइन (उम्मीदवार के डैशबोर्ड के माध्यम से) जवाब दें।
- प्रश्न (प्रश्नों) का उत्तर देने में विफलता के कारण आवंटित सीट को रद्द कर दिया जाएगा और उम्मीदवार सीएसएस-2022 से बाहर हो जाएगा।

4.4: अनंतिम रूप से आवंटित सीट पर प्रवेश

- कॉलेज की मंजूरी के बाद उम्मीदवार को स्वीकृत सीट के लिए प्रवेश शुल्क का भुगतान करना होगा।
- प्रवेश -शुल्क के सफल भुगतान के बाद ही प्रवेश प्रक्रिया को पूर्ण माना जाएगा।
- यदि कोई उम्मीदवार निर्धारित समय के भीतर प्रवेश शुल्क का भुगतान करने में विफल रहता है, तो इसे अनंतिम रूप से आवंटित सीट को रद्द करने के रूप में माना जाएगा।
- आवंटित सीट को जब्त कर लिया जाएगा और उम्मीदवार को किसी भी बाद के CSAS-2022 आवंटन दौर के लिए स्वीकार नहीं किया जाएगा।
- उम्मीदवार आवंटित सीट के सभी अधिकारों को खो देगा और किसी भी बाद के सीएसएस आवंटन दौर के लिए उसपर विचार नहीं किया जाएगा।

5. आवंटन के बाद के दौर

- अस्वीकरण, रद्दीकरण और निकासी के कारण उत्पन्न होने वाली सीटों की उपलब्धता के आधार पर, विश्वविद्यालय कई आवंटन दौर की घोषणा कर सकता है।
- यूओडी प्रत्येक आवंटन दौर से पहले अपनी प्रवेश-वेबसाइट (admission.uod.ac.in) पर रिक्त सीटों को प्रदर्शित करेगा।
- सभी उम्मीदवार जिन्होंने सीएसएस-2022 के लिए आवेदन किया है, वे सभी आवंटन राउंड के लिए पात्र होंगे, सिवाय उनके जिनकी आवंटित सीट/प्रवेश किसी भी कारण से रद्द कर दिया गया है।
- सभी प्रवेशित उम्मीदवार जो किसी विशेष दौर में "अपग्रेड" विकल्प का विकल्प चुनते हैं, सीटों की उपलब्धता के अंतर्गत संबंधित CSAS-2022 आवंटन दौर के लिए उन पर विचार किया जाएगा।
- जिन उम्मीदवारों को किसी भी दौर में अपनी पहली वरीयता आवंटित की गई थी, आवंटन के दौर के बाद उन पर विचार नहीं किया जाएगा।

6. अपग्रेड या फ्रीज

एक दौर की घोषणा से पहले, विश्वविद्यालय सभी भर्ती किये गये उम्मीदवारों के लिए "अपग्रेड" विंडो खोलगा

6.1: उन्नयन

- एक प्रवेशित उम्मीदवार 'अपग्रेड' विकल्प का चयन कर सकता है, जो उम्मीदवार द्वारा प्रस्तुत उच्च वरीयता के लिए उन्नयन की अनुमति देगा। प्रवेशित उम्मीदवार जो उन्नयन का विकल्प चुनते हैं, आवंटन नीति के आधार पर स्वचालित रूप से अपग्रेड किए जाएंगे।
- 'अपग्रेड' विकल्प चुनने का अर्थ यह होगा कि उम्मीदवार बाद के दौर (यदि कोई हो) में अपनी उच्च वरीयता के एक कार्यक्रम + कॉलेज कॉम्बिनेशन में प्रवेश के प्रस्ताव पर विचार करने के लिए सहमति देता है। यदि नई वरीयताएँ आवंटित की जाती हैं, तो उनकी वर्तमान भर्ती सीट स्वतः रद्द हो जाएगी।
- एक उम्मीदवार जो 'अपग्रेड' का विकल्प चुनता है, वह प्रोग्राम + कॉलेज कॉम्बिनेशन को फिर से व्यवस्थित कर सकता है कि आवंटित सीट की तुलना में वरीयता में अधिक थे।
- वह प्रोग्राम + कॉलेज कॉम्बिनेशन जिसमें उसने पहले प्रवेश लिया था, किसी भी बाद के दौर में वह उम्मीदवार को ऑफर नहीं किया जाएगा।
- इसी प्रकार, प्रोग्राम + कॉलेज कॉम्बिनेशन जो वरीयता क्रम में नीचे थे, जिस पर उम्मीदवार ने पहले प्रवेश लिया था, किसी भी बाद के दौर में उम्मीदवार को फिर से पेश नहीं किया जाएगा।

- अपग्रेड विकल्प उस उम्मीदवार के लिए उपलब्ध नहीं होगा जिसे उसकी पहली वरीयता के रूप में आवंटित की गई थी। सीट आवंटन के सभी दौरों में 'अपग्रेड' विकल्पों की जाँच करते रहना उम्मीदवार की जिम्मेदारी होगी। अपग्रेडेशन प्रक्रिया में भाग लेने में विफलता/अक्षमता को किसी भी परस्थिति में शिकायत नहीं माना जाएगा।
- एक उम्मीदवार जो अपग्रेड हो जाता है, उसे अपग्रेड की गई सीट को 'स्वीकार' करना होगा और अपग्रेड की गई आवंटित सीट पर प्रवेश प्रक्रिया पूरी करनी होगी। यदि कोई उम्मीदवार अपग्रेड की गई सीट पर कोई गतिविधि नहीं करता है, तो यह डिफॉल्ट रूप से रद्द माना जाएगा और उम्मीदवार सीएसएस-2022 से बाहर हो जाएगा।
- यदि कोई उम्मीदवार अपग्रेड नहीं होता है, तो उसकी पिछली सीट पर प्रवेश बरकरार रखा जाएगा।

6.2: फ्रीज

- एक उम्मीदवार जिसने आवंटित सीट पर प्रवेश लिया है और इसे जारी रखना चाहता है, उसे अपने डैशबोर्ड के माध्यम से 'फ्रीज' अनुरोध प्रस्तुत करना चाहिए। 'फ्रीज' का चयन करने पर, ऐसे उम्मीदवार को कभी भी "अपग्रेडेशन" का विकल्प चुनने की अनुमति नहीं दी जाएगी।
- यदि कोई प्रवेशित उम्मीदवार न तो उन्नयन का विकल्प देता है और न ही फ्रीज का विकल्प देता है और किसी दौर के लिए निष्क्रिय रहता है, तो उसके द्वारा लिया गया प्रवेश बरकरार रखा जाएगा और उसके उन्नयन के लिए विचार नहीं किया जाएगा।

7. अंतिम रूप से आवंटित सीट/प्रवेश रद्द करना

1. निर्धारित समय सीमा के भीतर अंतिम रूप से आवंटित सीट को 'स्वीकार' करने में विफल रहने पर आवंटित सीट को रद्द कर दिया जाएगा।
2. यदि कोई उम्मीदवार प्रवेश शुल्क का भुगतान करने में विफल रहता है तो अंतिम रूप से आवंटित सीट निर्धारित समय के भीतर रद्द कर दी जाएगी।
3. अस्थायी रूप से आवंटित सीट/प्रवेश रद्द कर दिया जाएगा, यदि किसी भी समय, कोई भी दस्तावेज/प्रमाणपत्र अमान्य/धोखाधड़ी से युक्त पाया जाता है।
4. यदि किसी भी समय यह पाया जाता है कि उम्मीदवार यूओडी द्वारा घोषित न्यूनतम पात्रता मानदंड को पूरा नहीं करता है तो अस्थायी रूप से आवंटित सीट/प्रवेश रद्द कर दिया जाएगा।

एक उम्मीदवार जिसका अंतिम रूप से आवंटित सीट/प्रवेश उपर्युक्त कारणों से रद्द कर दिया गया है, सीएसएस-2022 के माध्यम से यूओडी में प्रवेश लेने का अधिकार खो देगा।

8. उम्मीदवार द्वारा प्रवेश वापस लेना

- एक उम्मीदवार जिसने प्रवेश लिया है, लेकिन वापस लेना चाहता है, वह अपने डैशबोर्ड के माध्यम से 'निकासी' विकल्प का चयन करके और 1000.00(अप्रतिदेय)रुपये की निकासी शुल्क का भुगतान करके ऐसा कर सकता है।
- जो उम्मीदवार अपना प्रवेश वापस ले लेता है, वह CSAS-2022 से बाहर हो जाएगा।
- वह यूओडी के यूजी कार्यक्रमों में प्रवेश के लिए अपनी पात्रता खो देगा।
- बाद के किसी भी आवंटन दौर (यदि कोई हो) में किसी भी तरह की भागीदारी की अनुमति नहीं दी जाएगी।
- स्पॉट एडमिशन राउंड की घोषणा के बाद प्रवेश वापस लेने का कोई विकल्प नहीं होगा।

9. मध्य(मिड)-प्रवेश

- उम्मीदवार जो निर्धारित समय के भीतर सीएसएस-2022 के लिए आवेदन करने में विफल रहे और सीएसएस-2022 में भाग लेने के इच्छुक हैं, वे मिड-एंट्री विंडो (जब भी विश्वविद्यालय इसकी घोषणा करता है) के माध्यम से, 1000.00(अप्रतिदेय)रुपये के मध्य-प्रवेश शुल्क का भुगतान करके भाग ले सकते हैं।
- एक उम्मीदवार जो मध्य(मिड)-प्रवेश करता है, उनके आवंटन पर उन सभी उम्मीदवारों के बाद ही विचार किया जा सकता है जिन्होंने पहले आवेदन किया था और जिन्होंने न्यूनतम घोषित स्कोर से अधिक योग्यता अंक आवंटित किए गए थे।
- एक उम्मीदवार जो सीएसएस-2022 के बीच में आवेदन करता है, उसके पास उन उम्मीदवारों के आवंटित सीटों पर दावा करने का कोई अधिकार नहीं होगा, जिन्होंने आवेदन करने के प्रारंभिक चरण के दौरान सीएसएस-2022 में आवेदन किया था।
- ऐसे उम्मीदवारों को सीटों के आवंटन पर बाद के दौर (यदि कोई हो) के लिए, पात्रता मानदंड, सीटों की उपलब्धता और अन्य सीएसएस-2022 नियमों की पूर्ति के अधीन विचार किया जा सकता है।
- यदि पेशकश की जाती है तो मिड-एंट्री के लिए अपने आवंटित सीट पर प्रवेश लेना अनिवार्य होगा। आवंटित सीट को स्वीकार करने में विफलता के लिए उम्मीदवार का यूओडी में प्रवेश रद्द कर दिया जाएगा।
- 'अपग्रेड' का कोई विकल्प नहीं होगा। एक विशेष आवंटन दौर में आवंटित सीट अंतिम होगा और किसी भी बाद के आवंटन दौर में अपग्रेड नहीं किया जाएगा।
- मिड-एंट्री शुल्क के सफल प्रेषण के बाद ही मिड-एंट्री पर विचार किया जाएगा। •केवल मिड-एंट्री के माध्यम से आवेदन करने से सीएसएस-2022 के माध्यम से सीट की गारंटी नहीं है।
- प्रदर्शन-आधारित कार्यक्रमों (बीए (ऑनर्स) संगीत, बीएससी शारीरिक शिक्षा, स्वास्थ्य शिक्षा और खेल) और ईसीए, स्पोर्ट्स सुपरन्यूमेरी कोटा के लिए मध्य-प्रवेश

की अनुमति नहीं होगी।

10. स्पोर्ट प्रवेश

- नियमित सीएसएस-2022 राउंड के पूरा होने के बाद, यदि सीटें खाली रहती हैं, तो यूओडी प्रवेश के स्पोर्ट राउंड की घोषणा कर सकता है
 - उम्मीदवार जिन्होंने सीएसएस-2022 के लिए आवेदन किया था, लेकिन स्पोर्ट एडमिशन राउंड की घोषणा की तिथि तक किसी भी कॉलेज में प्रवेश नहीं दिया गया था, स्पोर्ट एडमिशन में भाग ले सकती है।

 - ° कॉलेज की वरीयता का आदेश।
 - ° श्रेणी।
 - ° इस दस्तावेज़ (सीएसएस-2022),
- यूजी बीओआई-2022, या यूओडी की प्रवेश वेबसाइट पर प्रकाशित कोई अन्य आवंटन नियम, नीतियां या मानदंड।

एक स्पोर्ट राउंड में आवंटित सीट पर प्रवेश लेना उम्मीदवार के लिए अनिवार्य होगा। स्पोर्ट एडमिशन राउंड में आवंटित सीट को स्वीकार करने में विफल रहने पर यूओडी में प्रवेश के लिए उम्मीदवार की पात्रता समाप्त हो जाएगी और वह (वह) सीएसएस से बाहर हो जाएगा।

- स्पोर्ट एडमिशन राउंड के दौरान 'अपग्रेड' और 'विद्वृत्त' का कोई विकल्प नहीं होगा। किसी विशेष स्पोर्ट एडमिशन राउंड में आवंटित सीट अंतिम होगी और स्पोर्ट एडमिशन राउंड के किसी भी बाद के राउंड में अपग्रेड नहीं की जाएगी।

11. टाई-ब्रेकिंग नियम

एक टाई की स्थिति में, जहाँ कार्यक्रम + कॉलेज कंबिनेशन के लिए दो या दो से अधिक उम्मीदवारों के पास समान सीयूईटी (यूजी)-2022 मेरिट स्कोर है। वहाँ टाईब्रेक के लिए बताए गए क्रम में निम्नलिखित नियम लागू होंगे:

1. बारहवीं कक्षा के सर्वश्रेष्ठ 3 विषयों में कुल अंकों के उच्च प्रतिशत वाले उम्मीदवार को वरीयता दी जाएगी।
2. बारहवीं कक्षा के सर्वश्रेष्ठ 4 विषयों में कुल अंकों के उच्च प्रतिशत वाले उम्मीदवार को वरीयता दी जाएगी।
3. बारहवीं कक्षा के सर्वश्रेष्ठ 5 विषयों में कुल अंकों के उच्च प्रतिशत वाले उम्मीदवार को वरीयता दी जाएगी।
4. उम्मीदवार की आयु; पहले जन्म की तारीख वाले उम्मीदवार को वरीयता दी जाएगी (जैसा कि दसवीं कक्षा के प्रमाण पत्र में उल्लिखित)।

नोट:

1. यदि अंक पत्र में कक्षा XI और कक्षा XII दोनों के अंक हैं, तो केवल बारहवीं कक्षा के अंक पर विचार होंगे

The Candidates shall be required to produce the following original certificates/documents in original at the time of physical verification at the College along with two sets of self attested photocopies of the same.

1. Class X Certificate in the name of the candidate, indicating date of birth and Parents' names.
2. Class XII Marksheet in the name of the candidate. The name of the candidate must match with the CUET(UG)-2022 form.
3. SC/ST/OBC-NCL/EWS/Minority/CW/KM/PwBD Certificate (in the name of the Candidate) issued by the competent issuing authority for candidates applying under this category
 - a. For candidate claiming reservation under OBC -Non-Creamy Layer, OBC - Non-Creamy Layer Certificate (in the name of the Candidate) issued by the competent issuing authority, and wherein the caste is in the OBC Central List issued by <http://ncbc.nic.in>. Income certificate must be issued after March 31, 2022.
 - b. For candidates claiming reservation under the EWS category, EWS Certificate (in the name of the candidate) from the competent issuing authority certifying the candidate can claim reservation under this category. Income certificate must be issued after March 31, 2022.
 - c. Candidates claiming admission through ECA/Sports supernumerary quota must produce requisite certificates.
 - d. PwBD disability certificate should be in the name of the candidate issued by a recognized Government Hospital, bearing a photograph of the candidate. Disability Certificates issued after 01.06.2021 must be as per the Gazette Notification no. 1736 (E) dated 05.05.2021 issued by the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities and applied through UDID portal. However, Disability Certificates issued before 01.06.2021, will be considered as per other existing applicable rules and notifications of the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities and the University of Delhi.
 - e. For candidates applying for the CW category, Educational Concession Certificate (ECC), (in the name of the candidate) in the prescribed format wherein the Priority is clearly mentioned.
 - f. For candidates applying for the KM category, relevant certification in the correct format issued by Divisional Commissioner/Relief Commissioner.
4. For candidates applying for the University of Delhi Ward supernumerary quota, valid employment certificate of his/her parent/s issued by the due official. Only the employment certificate uploaded in CSAS Application form will be considered. I-cards, Aadhar Card and/or any other document will not be accepted.

NOTE

- Refer to University of Delhi admission website for the relevant prescribed formats of the certificates.
- The name of the candidate claiming reservation under any category must match with the name as it appears on his/her corresponding School Board qualifying certificate and in CUET(UG) - 2022; similarly, the parents' names must match in both sets of certificates.
- Candidates shall be responsible for the quality and authenticity of the certificate they upload. Candidates must take utmost care to ensure the uploaded documents/ certificates are authentic and accurate. Candidates will be responsible to produce documents/certificates as sought.
- If the original certificates are not in English/Hindi, the English/Hindi version/translation of such certificates, duly certified by the Principal/Director or other competent authority of the last Institute attended, will be required during the verification of documents.

UNDERGRADUATE CURRICULUM FRAMEWORK - 2022 BASED ON NATIONAL EDUCATION POLICY 2020

The Undergraduate Curriculum Framework- 2022 (UGCF) is meant to bring about systemic change in the higher education system in the University and align itself with the National Education Policy 2020.

1. DEFINITIONS

1. Academic credit – An academic credit is a unit by which the course work is measured. It determines the number of hours of instructions required per week. One credit is equivalent to one hour of teaching (lecture or tutorial) or two hours of practical work/field work per week.

2. Courses of study – Courses of the study indicate pursuance of study in a particular discipline. Every discipline shall offer three categories of courses of study, viz. Discipline Specific Core courses (DSCs), Discipline Specific Electives (DSEs) and Generic Electives (GEs).

a) Discipline Specific Core (DSC): Discipline Specific Core is a course of study, which should be pursued by a student as a mandatory requirement of his/her programme of study. DSCs shall be the core credit courses of that particular discipline which will be appropriately graded and arranged across the semesters of study, being undertaken by the student, with multiple exit options as per NEP 2020. The DSCs specified in the framework would be identified by the concerned Department as core courses to be taught in a Programme.

For example, for award of single discipline specific Honours degree, such as B.A. (Honours) History, B.Com. (Honours), B.Sc. (Honours) Physics and similar such programmes, DSCs shall be the core courses of History, Commerce and Physics, respectively.

However, to pursue Honours degree programme in a 'Field of Multidisciplinary courses of Study' (rather than a single discipline) such as B.Sc. (Honours) Life Sciences, B.A. (Honours) Social Sciences/ Humanities, the DSCs shall comprise of core credit courses of more than one discipline. For example, for B.Sc. (Honours) Life Sciences programme, a student shall study credit courses of three disciplines i.e., Botany, Zoology and Chemistry. DSC 1 may be of Discipline A1 (say, Botany), DSC 2 may be of Discipline B 1 (say, Zoology) and DSC 3 may be of Discipline C 1 (say, Chemistry). However, the fourth year of such honours degree programme shall be devoted to the study of only one discipline and hence the DSC courses in the VII and VIII semesters shall be of Discipline A/B/C and not a combination of these three disciplines. Please refer to the framework given as Illustration-I in Table-4.

b) Discipline Specific Elective (DSE): The Discipline Specific Electives (DSEs) shall be a pool of credit courses of that particular discipline (single discipline programme of study) or those disciplines (multidisciplinary programme of study), as the case may be, which a student chooses to study from his/her particular discipline(s). There shall be a pool of DSEs from which a student may choose a course of study. The DSEs specified in the framework would be identified by the concerned Department as elective courses to be taught in a Programme.

For example, to pursue B.Sc. (Honours) Physics, DSEs chosen should be from a pool of DSEs of Physics.

Similarly, to pursue B.Sc. (Honours) Life Sciences programme, the DSEs chosen should be a pool of courses of DSEs of Botany, Zoology and Chemistry, the core subjects for this programme of study.

However, to pursue Honours degree programme in a 'Field of Multidisciplinary courses of Study' (rather than a single discipline) such as B.Sc. (Honours) Life Sciences, B.A. (Honours) Social Sciences/Humanities, in the fourth year of such honours degree programme in the VII and VIII semesters, the student shall be required to choose DSEs from any one of the Disciplines A/B/C and not a combination of these three disciplines. Please refer to the framework given as Illustration-I in Table-4.

c) Generic Elective (GE): Generic Electives shall be a pool of courses which is meant to provide multidisciplinary or interdisciplinary education to students. GEs shall consist of a pool of courses offered by various disciplines of study (excluding the GEs offered by the parent discipline), in groups of odd and even semesters, from which a student can choose. The GEs specified in the framework would be identified by the concerned Department as GEs to be taught in a Programme.

In case a student opts for DSEs beyond his/her discipline specific course(s) of study, such DSEs shall be treated as GEs for that student.

d) Ability Enhancement course (AEC), Skill Enhancement Course (SEC) & Value Addition Course (VAC)

These three courses shall be a pool of courses offered by all the Departments in groups of odd and even semesters from which students can choose. A student who desires to make Academic Project/Entrepreneurship as Minor has to pick the appropriate combination of courses of GE, SEC, VAC, & Internship/ Apprenticeship/Project/ Community (IAPC) which shall be offered in the form of various modules as specified in the scheme of studies.

(i). AEC courses are the courses based upon the content that leads to knowledge enhancement through various areas of study. They are Language and Literature and Environmental Science and Sustainable Development which will be mandatory for all disciplines.

(ii). SEC are skill-based courses in all disciplines and are aimed at providing hands-on- training, competencies, proficiency and skills to students. SEC courses may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide skill-based instruction. Every discipline may provide skill based courses, some of which may be offered to students of its discipline while the rest can be open to students of all other disciplines.

(iii). VAC courses are common pool of courses offered by different disciplines and aimed towards personality building; embedding ethical, cultural and constitutional Values; promote critical thinking, Indian Knowledge Systems, scientific temperament, communication skills, creative writing, presentation skills, sports & physical education and teamwork which will help in all round development of students.

3. Major discipline

a) A student pursuing four-year undergraduate programme in a specific discipline (Core course) shall be awarded an appropriate Honours degree with Major in a Discipline on completion of VIII Semester, if he/she secures in that Discipline at least 50% of the total credits i.e., at least 88 credits in that Discipline out of the total of 176 credits. He/she shall study 20 DSCs and at least 2 DSEs in eight semesters. For instance, a student who pursues B.Com. (Honours) shall earn the minimum 88 credits from 20 DSCs and at least two DSEs in order to get Major in Commerce.

b) A student pursuing a four-year undergraduate programme in more than one discipline as Core Course (for example B.A. Social Sciences/ Humanities, B.Sc. Life Sciences, B.Sc. Physical Sciences, B.Sc. Mathematical Sciences, B.Com. and such other programmes) shall be awarded an appropriate Honours degree with Major in a Discipline on completion of VIII Semester, if he/she secures in that Discipline 80 credits out of a total of 176 credits. He/she shall study 6 DSCs and at least 3 DSEs in that discipline in the first six semesters and 2 DSCs, 6 DSEs and write a dissertation in that discipline in the VII and VIII semesters. For instance, a student who pursues four-year B.A. (Honours) Social Sciences/Humanities shall be eligible for Major in History, on completion of VIII semester, if he/she earns minimum 80 credits from 8 DSCs and at least 9 DSEs of History and writes dissertation on a topic related to History.

4. Minimum acceptable level of academic standards

The minimum acceptable level of achievement that a student must demonstrate to be eligible for the award of academic credit or a qualification is the minimum acceptable level of academic standards. The Letter Grades and Grade Points which shall be used to reflect the outcome of the assessment process of the student's performance is indicated in Table - 1.

5. Minor discipline

a) A student mentioned at 3 (a) above may be awarded Minor in a discipline, on completion of VIII Semester, if he/she earns minimum 28 credits from seven GE courses of that discipline. For example, if a student pursuing B.A. (Honours) History chooses seven GE courses of Political Science out of a total of ten GE courses and writes dissertation, he/she shall be awarded on successful completion of VIII Semester, Major in History and Minor in Political Science.

b) A student mentioned at 3 (b) above may be awarded Minor in a discipline, on completion of VIII Semester, if he/she earns a minimum 28 credits from six DSCs and one DSE of that discipline. For example, a student pursuing a four-year B.A. (Honours) Social Sciences/Humanities with Major in History (after securing at least 80 credits in History), may be awarded Minor in Hindi if he/she earns 28 credits from six DSCs and one DSE of Hindi (up to VI semester), on successful completion of VIII Semester.

This definition of Minor is independent of GEs for which there is a requirement of 28 credits to be treated as Minor.

Further, in case a student opts for two disciplines such as Physics and Chemistry instead of three disciplines such as Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics, major and minor shall be determined as per credits earned in the respective courses of study. The concept of Minor is relevant only when there is a Major discipline.

2. QUALIFICATION TYPE AND CREDITS REQUIREMENTS

Qualifications are formal 'awards' such as a certificate, diploma or a degree are awarded by a competent authority such as a college or university in recognition of the attainment by students of the expected learning outcomes on the successful completion of a particular programme of study. They are awarded after an assessment and evaluation of learning levels conducted by a competent body that determines the achievement by students of the expected learning outcomes to 2 given standards.

A student who exits at the end of any even semesters has to earn the requisite credits (stated in Table - 2) in order to be awarded the relevant certificate/diploma/ degree. The qualification title/nomenclature and corresponding credits requirements relevant for Level 5 to Level 8 of the undergraduate programmes are also clearly stated in Table-2.

*** There shall be choice in V and VI Semesters to choose either one 'SEC' or in the alternative 'Internship/Apprenticeship/Project/Research/Community Outreach' in each Semester for two credits each.

There shall be three choices in VII and VIII Semesters –

(i) to choose three DSEs of 4 credits each OR

(ii) to choose two DSEs and one GE of 4 credits each OR

(iii) to choose one DSE and two GEs of 4 credits each.

^ 'Research Methodology' shall be offered as one of the DSE courses in VI and VII Semesters. Students can opt for it either in VI semester or VII semester. However, a student pursuing multidisciplinary studies in three core disciplines shall have to choose research methodology in VI semester, if she/he wishes to Major in one of the three disciplines in the fourth year.

Suppose a student wishes to study the Research Methodology course offered by another discipline (as one of its DSEs). In that case, he/she may opt for it provided such discipline is his minor discipline. The Research Methodology of another discipline so opted shall be treated as GE for him/her.

4. NOTE

1. **Entry level eligibility:** The general feeder category for entry into Level 5 is the Secondary School Leaving Certificate obtained after successfully completing Grade 12. A programme of study leading to entry into the first year of the Bachelor's degree is open to those students who have met the entrance requirements, including specified levels of attainment at the secondary level of education mentioned in the programme admission regulations. Admission to the Bachelor degree programme of study is based on the evaluation of documentary evidence (including the academic record) of the applicant's ability to undertake and complete a Bachelor's degree programme which is specified in the UGC Guidelines for Multiple Entry and Exit Scheme in Academic Programmes Offered in Higher Education.

2. Number of hours of a credit course shall be defined by its component of lecture, tutorial and practical.

3. Every student has to study "Environmental Science and Sustainable Development" courses I and II of two credits each in the first year (I/II semester) and the second year (III/IV semester), respectively. The AEC pool will also consist of credit courses in languages listed in the Eighth Schedule of the Constitution of India, as updated from time to time. The University of Delhi shall extend necessary support to those Colleges (where faculty is not available) which may require it in course of teaching learning in these languages.
4. Design of degrees: Students shall be able to design their own degrees according to their mission and aspiration for a future befitting to their ability and attainment, rather than following the conventional pathway.
5. A student who pursues a three years undergraduate degree programme in a specific discipline as a Core course [for example, B.A. (Honours) English, B. Com (Honours), B.Sc. (Honours) Physics and such other Programmes] will earn at least 80 credits in that discipline (from 18 DSCs and at least 2 DSEs of that discipline) and shall be awarded Honours degree in that discipline, if he/she exits after completion of VI semester.
6. A student who pursues three years undergraduate degree programme in more than one discipline as core courses of study (for example B.A. in Social Sciences/ Humanities, B.Sc. in Life Sciences, B.Sc. in Physical Sciences, B.Sc. in Mathematical Sciences, Bachelor in Commerce Studies and such other programmes) he/she shall be awarded Bachelor's degree in that field of multidisciplinary course of study, if he/she exits after completion of VI semester.
7. If a student wishes to pursue four years Honours Degree with research, he/she shall compulsorily opt for a Research Methodology course in either VI Semester or VII Semester as DSE.
8. Dissertation/Academic Project/Entrepreneurship in the 4th year shall commence from VII semester and conclude in VIII semester. Detailed outcomes of each track chosen out of these three options shall be notified and assessment at the end of VII and VIII semesters shall be done accordingly.
9. Dissertation may be written in the Major or Minor or Interdisciplinary (combination of Major and Minor) discipline.
10. If a student mentioned at (6) above continues or re-enters the fourth year for pursuing an Honours degree in that field of multidisciplinary study, he/she has to choose only one of the disciplines he/she had studied as core courses of study in the previous six semesters and earn credits from the 2DSCs and 6DSEs of that chosen discipline in the VII and VIII semesters and write dissertation or opt for Academic Project or Entrepreneurship.
11. If a student mentioned at (5) above, continues or re-enters to study the VII and VIII semesters in the same discipline, and writes dissertation mentioned at (9) above, but no Minor discipline is made out (i.e., credits earned in the GEs of any one discipline is less than 28 credits), then he/she shall be awarded 'Honours with Research' with Major in that discipline on successful completion of VIII Semester.
12. A student mentioned at (6) above, shall be awarded 'Honours' degree in that field of multidisciplinary study on successful completion of VIII semester. For example, B.A. (Honours) Social Sciences/ Humanities, B.Sc. (Honours) Life Sciences, B.Sc. (Honours) Physical Sciences, B.Sc. (Honours) Mathematical Sciences and Bachelor in Commerce Studies (Honours). Major and Minor shall be indicated on fulfilment of the conditions mentioned above at III(3)(b) and III(5)(b), respectively. For instance, a student who pursues four years B.A. (Honours) in Social Sciences/ Humanities with History, Political Science and Hindi as core courses, shall get Major in History, on successful completion of VIII semester, if he/she earns minimum 80 credits in History from 8 DSCs and at least 9 DSEs of History and writes dissertation on a topic related to History. Such a student shall get a Minor in Political Science/Hindi, if he/she earns a minimum 28 credits from 6 DSCs and one DSE of Political Science/Hindi.
13. Only a student mentioned at (5) above who opts to write a dissertation in the Major/Minor subject in VII and VIII semesters in the fourth year, shall be awarded 'Bachelor of Field of Study/Discipline (Honours with Research) in Discipline'. For instance, a student who pursues B.Sc. (Honours) in Physics and writes a dissertation on a topic relating to Physics or the Minor in VII and VIII semesters shall be awarded 'Bachelor of Science (Honours with Research) Physics. Major and Minor shall be indicated on fulfilment of the conditions mentioned above at II(3)(a) and II(5)(a), respectively.
14. A student who opts for 'Academic Project' or 'Entrepreneurship' in VII and VIII semesters, instead of writing dissertations, and has earned 28 credits in the relevant GEs, SECs, AECs & IAPC, shall be awarded Minor in Academic Project or Entrepreneurship, as the case may be. 'Bachelor of Field of Study/Discipline (Honours with Academic Project/ Entrepreneurship) in Discipline (Major) & Academic Project/ Entrepreneurship (Minor)'. If he/she is unable to earn the requisite 28 credits, he/she shall be awarded 'Bachelor of Field of Study/Discipline (Honours with Academic Project/ Entrepreneurship) in Discipline (Major)'.

15. A student who pursues a four-year undergraduate degree programme shall be awarded after completion of the VIII semester an appropriate degree.
16. Exit Options: The minimum credit to be earned by a student per semester is 18 credits and the maximum is 26 credits. However, students are advised to earn 22 credits per semester. This provision is meant to provide students the comfort of the flexibility of semester-wise academic load and to learn at his/her own pace. However, the mandatory numbers of credits have to be secured for the purpose of award of Undergraduate Certificate/ Undergraduate Diploma/ Appropriate Bachelor's Degree in the field of Study/Discipline, to a student who chooses to exit at the end of even semesters (details provided in Table - 2).

The course title, code, number of credits, components of lecture, tutorial and practical, prerequisites to be fulfilled for choosing that course and the department offering the course shall be spelt out for each course. A student should fulfill the prerequisites of a course to be able to opt it for study.

Department of Biochemistry

The Department of Biochemistry was established in the Old Block (Now known as the **Dr. B.R Ambedkar** Block) of Deshbandhu College in the year 1988 and offers Bachelors with honors in Biochemistry which is one of the most sought-after science courses in the University. Biochemistry is a branch of science that amalgamates the chemistry of living organisms with that of their biological processes. It is a course that offers an opportunity to marvel at and understand the complex intricacies of metabolic regulations through theoretical as well as practical means. Multidisciplinary Courses offered by Science Departments

In Addition to B. Sc. (Hons) Courses, the Science Departments offer Courses in B.Sc. (Prog). The options available are: B. Sc. (Prog) Life Science, B. Sc. (Prog) Physical Science with Chemistry, B.Sc. (Prog) Physical Science with Computer Science, B.Sc. (Prog) Applied Physical Sciences with Industrial Chemistry.

B.Sc. (Programme) Life Science (Botany, Chemistry and Zoology)

B. Sc. (Programme) Life Science is a 4-year multi-disciplinary course offered jointly by three Departments of Deshbandhu College, University of Delhi, viz, Botany, Chemistry and Zoology under the National Education Policy 2020. The course is an integration of important and diverse subjects in biological and chemical sciences ranging from Biodiversity to Molecular biology and Biotechnology, and from Inorganic chemistry to Organic chemistry and Applied chemistry. The main objective of the course is to impart a more holistic and multidisciplinary education in science. In Deshbandhu College, specialized, experienced and dedicated teachers of the three departments meet the course and train the students to be well equipped with fundamental and technical knowledge of biological and chemical sciences and their research applications. Skill enhancement course (SEC) is an integral and essential part of this course which train and enhance technical skills on the applied subjects of zoology, botany and chemistry e.g., Medical diagnostics, Intellectual Property Rights, Public Health and Hygiene, Green Methods in Chemistry etc. SEC focuses on developing the skills of the students in translating the current trends of development in science and technology. The course also provides the opportunity of research internship or dissertation to the students in the University recognized research laboratories of any of the three departments to enhance their research and analytic skills. In addition to the academic activities, the teachers and students of the course come together under an umbrella society, SYNERGIA and organize different co-curricular activities, including a series of lectures of eminent personalities, scientists and professors and extra-curricular cultural activities. Visits to renowned Universities, Institutes and Science research laboratories are also organized every year to expose the students to advanced research technologies. Field trips to national parks and wildlife sanctuaries are integral exercises conducted regularly for the students to study biodiversity. The whole activities held and conducted in an academic year is reported in the college annual report and society's annual magazine, TRINITY. The magazine offers rich contents from students and faculty, viz, popular science articles, literary poems, stories etc. showcasing their creative and scientific talents.

Student of B.Sc. (Programme) Life Science are eligible for admission to M.Sc. in Botany, Zoology and Chemistry and other allied courses - M.Sc. Biotechnology, M.Sc. Biochemistry, M.Sc. Genetics, M.Sc. Microbiology, M.Sc. Bioinformatics etc.



B.Sc. (Programme) Physical Science with Chemistry (Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics)

Physical science which is the coordination of subjects, viz physics, chemistry and mathematics. Deshbandhu college (University of Delhi) offered a multiprofessional course B. Sc. Physical science (with chemistry). This course is a combination of diverse, important and widely used subjects. The study of physics and chemistry will provide benefits which last a lifetime and connect with nature and phenomena around us. These subjects complement each other as physics & chemistry are incomplete without mathematics. The course aims at improving critical, logical and reasoning thinking ability of students in all three domains. The students gain a deep and thorough understanding of the subjects. The experienced and dedicated teachers of three departments in this course will help to boost the knowledge and skills of students. Students are encouraged to do research under mentorship of very experienced teachers. They are ever ready to solve all academic pursuit related problems.

The course also gives a chance to get knowledge of different skill enhancement courses (SEC) which are basic analytical chemistry, Basic instrumentation skills, chemical technology and operating system: Linux, Renewable energy, Transportation and network flow problems and many more courses. As these help to understand the development of science and technology in today's world. In addition "nanomaterials and nanotechnology" which have a wide range of applications in the modern world and also the topic of future research also included in the physical science course.

Also In addition to all the academic activities, the teachers and students of physical science form a society "SPECTRA" (the physical science society) which aims to enhance the skills of students and boost their confidence level. It gives a chance to every student to participate in their different field of interest. Various lecture series are conducted where many renowned lecturers come and share their own knowledge with students. Society organizes cultural activities to bring out the hidden talent of students. Internships are offered by Placement cell of our college which help the students to gain the job skills which will help them from future career prospect. Society has started a series of e-Magazine for all round development of students as it will help them to develop a habit of writing and presenting the information and concepts they have studied in their own way of recognition.

Students of B.Sc. Physical Science are eligible for admission to M.Sc. in physics, chemistry and mathematics.



B.Sc. (Programme) Applied Physical Science with Industrial Chemistry

Department of Chemistry offers, undergraduate course in B.Sc. (P) Applied Physical Science, Industrial Chemistry. This course broadly deals with the chemistry of processing, transforming and manufacturing of raw materials of industrial importance to make it useful for mankind.

Beside the basic knowledge of Chemistry, physics and math, the syllabus of Industrial chemistry is designed to give the students a detailed theoretical and practical knowledge of environment remediation and numerous industries including petrochemicals, fuels, food additives, glass, ceramics cements, nanomaterial, alloys, dyes, polymers, pharmaceuticals etc. This course offers abundant opportunities in various industries such as chemist, quality controller, pharmacist, food inspector, research associate and many more.

Students of this course are the members of Chemical Society Resonance of the Department of Chemistry and can take part in all the activities of the same. They also have the opportunity to give their contributions in the wall magazine "Reactive" of the Department of Chemistry.

Student of B.Sc. (APS) Industrial Chemistry are eligible for M.Sc. in both Chemistry as well as Industrial Chemistry.



B.Sc. (Programme) Physical Science with Computer Science

The three year undergraduate course in B.Sc. (Prog) Physical Science with Computer Science offers students the opportunity to study papers from the disciplines of Computer Science, Physics and Mathematics. The courses are designed to promote logical thinking, analytical skills, develop programming skills and application of knowledge of computing to solve problems in other disciplines. It covers core computer science topics and offers electives so that students can apply these skills while studying other subjects.

The programme lays down the foundation of understanding the principles of computing, mathematics, and basic sciences and apply the same to the development of applications across various disciplines of study and utility. Learners will expand their skill sets and develop professional proficiency to establish themselves to either pursue higher studies in the field of Computer Science/Applications or to pursue jobs in the IT industry such as web designers, data analysts, database manager, and software programmers, among others.

Department of Environment Science

In today's time, due to the demands of the rapidly increasing population of the world, there has been an imbalance in the biotic and abiotic factors of all the three spheres of the earth (Atmosphere, Hydrosphere and Lithosphere). This imbalance has forced us to re-think, reassess and reevaluate the strategies, policies and laws related to the protection, conservation and management of the environment and the earth. We all know that the capacity of the earth to meet the needs of human beings is limited and day to day exhausting. The recent UN "IPCC report" states it is "UNEQUIVOCAL" that climate change is being caused by human activities.

Recognizing the serious consequences in the short and long term, the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India has from time to time interpreted Article 21 (Right to Life) of the Constitution of India to save human life and the environment and to maintain a balance between available environmental resources and development. The Hon'ble Supreme Court passed an order to educate and make students aware of the environment at school and graduate levels. The Government of India followed the orders of the Supreme Court while simultaneously believing in the philosophy that "prevention is better than cure" made the teaching of a specialized subject "Environmental Science" compulsory. Accordingly, a separate "Department of Environmental Studies" has been established in Deshbandhu College. The objective of the department is not only to provide environmental education but also to make students reflect on the values, philosophy, principles, ethics and need for environmental protection. The aim of imparting environmental education at Deshbandhu College is also to make the students aware of "nature and its biotic and abiotic components" and to motivate them to become "**Ambassadors and Protectors of The Environment**".

आज के समय में विश्व की तेज़ी से बढ़ती आबादी की मांगों के कारण पृथ्वी के तीनों मंडलों (वायुमंडल, जलमंडल और स्थलमंडल) के जैविक और अजैविक घटकों में असंतुलन हो गया है। इस असंतुलन के कारण हमें पर्यावरण और पृथ्वी के रक्षण, संरक्षण और प्रबंधन से संबंधित रणनीतियों, नीतियों और कानूनों को फिर से सोचने, आंकलन और मूल्यांकन करने के लिए हमें मजबूर कर दिया है। हम सभी जानते हैं कि मनुष्यों की जरूरतों को पूरा करने में पृथ्वी की क्षमता सीमित है और दिन-प्रतिदिन घटती जा रही है। हाल ही में संयुक्त राष्ट्र की "आईपीसीसी रिपोर्ट" में कहा गया है कि यह "स्पष्ट" है कि जलवायु परिवर्तन मानव गतिविधियों के कारण हो रहा है।

अल्प और दीर्घावधि में गंभीर परिणामों को समझते हुए भारत के माननीय उच्चतम न्यायालय ने समय-समय पर उपलब्ध पर्यावरणीय संसाधनों और विकास के बीच संतुलन बनाए रखने के लिए तथा मानव जीवन और पर्यावरण को बचाने के लिए भारत के संविधान के अनुच्छेद-21 (जीवन का अधिकार) की व्याख्या की है। मा० सुप्रीम कोर्ट ने स्कूल और स्नातक स्तरों पर छात्रों को पढ़ाने और पर्यावरण के प्रति जागरूक करने का आदेश पारित किया। भारत सरकार ने उच्चतम न्यायालय के आदेशों का पालन करते हुए, साथ ही साथ इस दर्शन में विश्वास करते हुए कि "रोकथाम इलाज से बेहतर है", पर्यावरण विज्ञान के शिक्षण को अनिवार्य बना दिया और तदनुसार, देशबंधु कॉलेज में एक अलग "पर्यावरण अध्ययन विभाग" की स्थापना की गई है। विभाग का उद्देश्य न केवल पर्यावरण शिक्षा प्रदान करना है बल्कि छात्रों को पर्यावरण के मूल्यों, दर्शन, सिद्धांतों, नैतिकता और पर्यावरण संरक्षण की आवश्यकता पर चिंतन करवाना भी है। देशबंधु कॉलेज में पर्यावरण शिक्षा प्रदान करने का उद्देश्य छात्रों को "प्रकृति और उसके जैविक और अजैविक घटकों" के प्रति जागरूक करने और उन्हें "पर्यावरण के राजदूत और संरक्षक" बनने के लिए प्रेरित करना भी है।

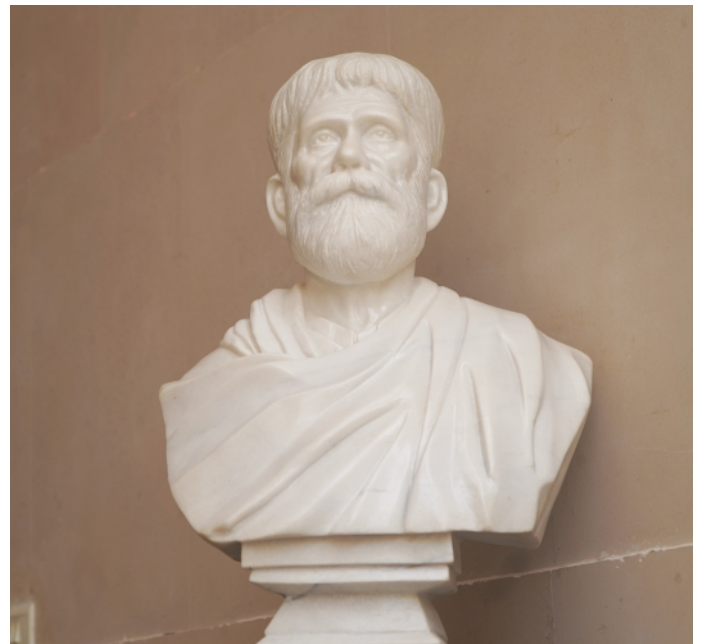

2. The prescribed fee for filing the application is Rs. 10/- in cash against proper receipt or through bank demand draft/banker's cheque or Indian Postal Order payable to the Principal Deshbandhu College, at Delhi.
3. An appeal can be preferred before the first Appellate Authority against the decision of the Public Information Officer of the college.

ACADEMIC REQUIREMENT

The students of the College are governed by the rules and regulations of the University of Delhi as laid down in Ordinance VII of the University Calendar. The students are required to attend all lectures, tutorials and practicals regularly. The candidates should have attended not less than two-thirds of lectures (including tutorials) and practicals separately i.e.

66.66% separately, delivered in the college for the course of study in each semester. 66.66% attendance is compulsory for students to appear in the University of Delhi semester examination. Students selected/deputed to participate in annual NCC camp or NSS assignments or inter-college/ National/International sports or extra-curricular activities approved by the Principal may be **condoned up to a maximum of one third lectures and practicals held.**

In case of illness the leave application must be accompanied by a medical certificate and fitness certificate which should be submitted to the college office after getting the signature of the teachers concerned. The Principal may consider exceptionally hard case of students illness, whether the lectures etc. delivered during the period of illness could be excluded for purpose of calculation of attendance and each case shall be decided on its own merit.

INTERNAL ASSESSMENT SCHEME

As per the decision of University of Delhi, 25% of the total marks in each paper will be allotted for the Internal Assessment as per Ordinance-VIII-E of the University Calendar. Following is the distribution of Internal Assessment marks:

5% weightage to be given for regularity in attendance including lectures and tutorials. The credit for attendance in each paper will be as follows:

At the end of the semester, the attendance of every student in each paper in lectures and tutorials will be summed up, converted into percentage, and marks will be awarded for Internal Assessment by the teacher. With the introduction of Internal Assessment, the maximum marks for the University Examination in each paper shall stand reduced accordingly. For Example:

- For a 100 marks paper, the University Examination shall be of 75 marks.
- For a 75 marks paper, the University Examination shall be of 55 marks.
- For a 50 marks paper, the University Examination shall be of 38 marks.
- For a 53 marks paper, the University Examination shall be of 25 marks.

In the case of a student who is selected as a member of the NCC to participate in the annual NCC Camps or is deputed to undertake Civil Defence work and allied duties, or in the case of a student who is enrolled in the National Service Scheme and is deputed to various public assignment by or with the approval of the Head of the institution concerned, or a student who is selected to participate in sports or other activities organized by the Inter-University Board or is selected to participate in sports or other activities organized by the Vice- Chancellor, or a student who is required to represent the University at the Inter University Youth Festival, or a student who is required to participate in periodical training in the Territorial Army, or a student who is deputed by the College to take part in Inter-College sports, fixtures, debates, seminars, symposia social work projects, or a student who is required to represent the College concerned in debates and other extra-curricular activities held in other Universities or such other activities approved by the Vice-Chancellor, the following provision will apply:

- i. A student in the categories listed above, will have to fulfill the requirement of written assignments and projects/term papers/seminars/field-work with the flexibility, however that she/he may, if necessary, be allowed additional time for submission of written assignments.
- ii. A student in the categories listed above, will get the benefit of attendance for Internal Assessment for the classes missed as per the existing provisions of Ordinance VII.2 (9) (a) (I).

The University reserves the right to review, and if necessary to moderate the marks in any paper/papers in any College/Department.

- Duration of medical certificates shall be excluded while calculating credit towards marks to be awarded for regularity, though such certificates shall continue to be taken into account for the purpose of calculating eligibility to appear for examinations as per the existing provisions of Ordinance VII.2.9.(a)(ii).
- The benefit of exclusion of lectures in either case stated above, either separately or jointly, shall in no case exceed 1/3 of the total number of lectures delivered.
- Deshbandhu College requires that a valid medical fitness certificate be submitted within one week of resuming classes.

UNIVERSITY EXAMINATION AND PROMOTIONS

The University examination schedule and rules of promotions and reappearance in examination as prescribed by the University of Delhi will be applicable. Students are advised to visit www.du.ac.in for detailed guidelines and rules.

FINANCIAL AID

- a) Fee concession is awarded to needy & deserving students who apply on a prescribed form available in the college office.
- b) Information regarding freeships granted by State Government are put on the notice board from time to time.
- c) Under the National Loan Scholarship Scheme, those students who have obtained a first division (60% marks or more) in their last examination can apply for a loan scholarship through the college.
- d) In addition, the college has a Financial Assistance Fund with the objective of extending financial assistance to needy students.

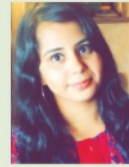

RELEVANT ORDINANCES

ORDINANCE XV-B

Maintenance of discipline among Students of the University

1. All powers relating to discipline and disciplinary action are vested in the Vice - Chancellor.
2. The Vice-Chancellor may delegate all or such powers as he/she deems proper to the Proctor and to such other persons as he/she may specify in this behalf.
3. Without prejudice to the generality of power to enforce discipline under the Ordinance the following shall amount to acts of gross indiscipline:
 - a. Physical assault, or threat to use physical force, against any member of the teaching and nonteaching staff of any Institution/Department and against any student within the University of Delhi
 - b. Carrying of, use of or threat to use of any weapons
 - c. Any violation of the provisions of the Civil Rights Protection Act, 1976
 - d. Violation of the status, dignity and honour of students belonging to the scheduled castes and tribes
 - e. Any practice-whether verbal or otherwise-derogatory of women
 - f. Any attempt at bribing or corruption in any manner
 - g. Willful destruction of institutional property
 - h. Creating ill-will or intolerance on religious or communal grounds
 - i. Causing disruption in any manner of the academic functioning of the University system
 - j. Prohibition of Ragging as per Ordinance XV-C. University Youth Festival, or a student who is required to participate in periodical training in the Territorial Army, or a student who is deputed by the College to take part in Inter-College sports, fixtures, debates, seminars, symposia social work projects, or a student who is required to represent the College concerned in debates and other extra-curricular activities held in other Universities or such other activities approved by the Vice-Chancellor, the following provision will apply:
4. Without prejudice to the generality of his/her powers relating to the maintenance of discipline and taking such action in the interest of maintaining discipline as may seem to him/her appropriate, the Vice-Chancellor, may in the exercise of his/her powers aforesaid order or direct that any student or students.
 - a. be expelled; or
 - b. be, for a stated period rusticated; or
 - c. be not for a stated period, admitted to a course or courses of study in a College, Department or Institution of the University; or
 - d. be fined with a sum of rupees that may be specified; or
 - e. be debarred from taking a University or College or Departmental Examination or Examinations for one or more years; or
 - f. that the result of the student or students concerned in the Examination or Examinations in which he/she or they have appeared be cancelled.
5. The Principals of the Colleges, Heads of the Halls, Deans of Faculties, Heads of Teaching Departments in the University, the Principal, School of Open Learning and Librarians shall have the authority to exercise all such disciplinary powers over students in their respective Colleges, Institutions, Faculties and Teaching Departments in the University as may be necessary for the proper conduct of the Institutions, Halls and teaching in the concerned Departments. They may exercise their authority through, or delegate authority to such of the teachers in their Colleges, Institutions or Departments as they may specify for these purposes.
6. Without prejudice to the powers of the Vice-Chancellor and the Proctor as aforesaid, detailed rules of discipline and proper conduct shall be framed. These rules may be supplemented, where necessary, by the Principals of Colleges, Heads of Halls, Deans of Faculties and Heads of Teaching Departments in this University. Each student shall be expected to provide himself/herself with a copy of these rules.
7. At the time of admission, every student shall be required to sign a declaration that on admission he/she submits himself/herself to the disciplinary jurisdiction of the Vice-Chancellor and several authorities of the University who may be vested with the authority to exercise discipline under the Acts, the Statutes, the Ordinances and the rules that have been framed therein by the University.

ORDINANCE XV-C

Prohibition and Punishment for Ragging

1. Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited, within the premises of College/Department or Institution and any part of Delhi University system as well as on public transport.
2. Any individual or collective act or practice of ragging constitutes gross indiscipline and shall be dealt with under this Ordinance.
3. Ragging for the purposes of this Ordinance, ordinarily means any act, conduct or practice by which dominant power or status of senior students is brought to bear on students freshly enrolled or students who are in any way considered junior or inferior by other students; and includes individual or collective acts or practices which -
 - a. involve physical assault or threat to use of physical force
 - b. violate the status, dignity and honour of women students
 - c. violate the status, dignity and honour of students belonging to the scheduled caste and tribe
 - d. expose students to ridicule and contempt and affect their self-esteem
 - e. entail verbal abuse and aggression, indecent gestures and obscene behavior.
4. The Principal of a College, the Head of the Department or an Institution, the authorities of College, or University Hostel or Halls of Residence shall take immediate action on any information of the occurrence of ragging.
5. Notwithstanding anything in Clause (4) above, the Proctor may also suo moto enquire into any incident of ragging and make a report to the Vice-Chancellor of the identity of those who have engaged in ragging and the nature of the incident.
6. The Proctor may also submit an initial report establishing the identity of the perpetrators of ragging and the nature of the ragging incident.
7. If the Principal of a College or Head of the Department or Institution or the Proctor is satisfied that for some reason, to be recorded in writing, it is not reasonably practical to hold such an enquiry, he/she may so advise the Vice-Chancellor accordingly.
8. When the Vice-Chancellor is satisfied that it is not expedient to hold such an enquiry, his/her decision shall be final.
9. On the receipt of a report under Clause (5) or (6) or a determination by the relevant authority under clause (7) disclosing the occurrence of ragging incidents described in Clause 3(a), (b) and (c), the Vice-Chancellor shall direct or order rustication of a student or students for a specific number of years.
10. The Vice-chancellor may in other cases of ragging order or direct that any student or students be expelled or be not for a stated period, admitted to a course of study in a college, departmental examination for one or more years or that the results of the student or students concerned in the examination or examinations in which they appeared be canceled.
11. In case any students who have obtained degrees or diplomas of Delhi University are found guilty; under this Ordinance, appropriate action will be taken under Statute 15 for withdrawal of degrees or diploma conferred by the University.
12. For the purpose of this Ordinance, abetment to ragging whether by way of any act, practice or incitement of ragging will also amount to ragging.
13. All Institutions within the Delhi University system shall be obligated to carry out instructions/ directions issued under this Ordinance, and to give aid assistance to the Vice-Chancellor to achieve the effective implementation of the Ordinance.

Note: Order of the Vice-Chancellor in pursuance of Ordinance XV-C:

Where incident(s) of ragging are reported to the Vice-Chancellor by any authority under this Ordinance, the student(s) involved in ragging, shall be expelled for a specified term, designated in the order. Non-students involved in reports of ragging will be proceeded with under the criminal law of India; they will also be rendered ineligible for a period of five years from seeking enrolment in any of the institutions of the University of Delhi. Students against whom necessary action is taken under this note, will be given post decisional hearing, with strict adherence to the rules of natural justice.

ORDINANCE XV-D

The Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition, and Redressal) Act, 2013 (MINISTRY OF LAW AND JUSTICE)

An Act to provide protection against sexual harassment of women at workplace and for the prevention and redressal of complaints of sexual harassment and for matters connected therewith or incidental thereto.

WHEREAS sexual harassment results in violation of the fundamental rights of a woman to equality under articles 14 and 15 of the Constitution of India and her right to life and to live with dignity under article 21 of the Constitution and right to practice any profession or to carry on any occupation, trade or business with includes a right to a safe environment free from sexual harassment;

AND WHEREAS the protection against sexual harassment and the right to work with dignity are universally recognised human rights by international conventions and instruments such as Convention on the Elimination of all Forms of Discrimination against Women, which has been ratified on the 25th June, 1993 by the Government of India;

AND WHEREAS it is expedient to make provisions for giving effect to the said Convention for protection of women against sexual harassment at workplace taken under this note, will be given post decisional hearing, with strict adherence to the rules of natural justice.

अध्यादेश

अध्यादेश XV-बी विश्वविद्यालय के विद्यार्थियों में अनुशासन का प्रतिपालन

1. अनुशासन और अनुशासनात्मक कार्यवाही से सम्बन्धित सभी अधिकार कुलपति के अधीन हैं।
 2. कुलपति यदि उचित समझें तो कुलानुशासक (प्रॉक्टर) अथवा ऐसे किसी अन्य व्यक्तियों को अपने सभी अथवा कुछ अधिकारों को प्रतिनिधित्व सौंप सकता है।
 3. इस अध्यादेश के अंतर्गत अनुशासन लागू करने के लिए शक्ति की व्यापकता का पूर्वाग्रह किये बिना निम्नलिखित कार्य पूर्ण अनुशासनहीनता के अंतर्गत आते हैं:-
 - (क) विश्वविद्यालय के अंतर्गत किसी संस्थान / विभाग के किसी भी शिक्षण अथवा गैर-शिक्षण सदस्यों अथवा विद्यार्थी पर शारीरिक हमला अथवा शारीरिक बल प्रयोग की धमकी देना।
 - (ख) किसी भी प्रकार का हथियार (अस्त्र) अपने पास रखना, प्रयोग करना, प्रयोग करने की धमकी देना।
 - (ग) नागरिक अधिकार संरक्षण अधिनियम 1976 के प्रावधानों का कोई उल्लंघन।
 - (घ) अनुसूचित जाति / जनजाति के विद्यार्थियों की प्रतिष्ठा, गरिमा और सम्मान का उल्लंघन।
 - (ङ) मौखिक अथवा अन्य किसी प्रकार से महिलाओं के प्रति अनादरसूचक टिप्पणी करने का प्रयास करना।
 - (च) किसी भी तरह भ्रष्टाचार अथवा रिश्वत लेने-देने का प्रयास।
 - (छ) संस्थागत संपत्ति को जानबूझ कर नष्ट करना।
 - (ज) धार्मिक अथवा सांप्रदायिक आधार पर वैमनस्य अथवा असहिष्णुता का वातावरण बनाना।
 - (झ) विश्वविद्यालय की शैक्षणिक कार्यपद्धति में किसी प्रकार का अवरोध पैदा करना
 - (ञ) अध्यादेश XV-सी के अनुसार रैगिंग का निषेध।
 4. कुलपति, अनुशासन के प्रतिपालन से सम्बन्धित अपनी शक्ति का बिना किसी पूर्वाग्रह के अनुशासन बनाये रखने के लिये ऐसी कार्यवाही करना जो उन्हें उपयुक्त लगे, वह अपने उपयुक्त अधिकारों का उपयोग करते हुये किसी भी विद्यार्थी अथवा विद्यार्थियों को :- (ए) निष्कासित कर सकता है, अथवा
 - (बी) किसी निश्चित अवधि के लिये निष्कासित कर सकता है, अथवा
 - (सी) किसी निश्चित अवधि के लिये विद्यार्थी को किसी महाविद्यालय, संस्था अथवा विश्वविद्यालय के किसी पाठ्यक्रम में प्रवेश लेने से रोक सकता है, अथवा
 - (डी) जैसा निर्धारित करना चाहे, अर्थदंड निरूपित कर सकता है, और
 - (ई) विश्वविद्यालय अथवा कॉलेज अथवा विभागीय परीक्षा / परीक्षाओं में बैठने से एक वर्ष या अधिक के लिये रोक लगा सकता है, अथवा परीक्षा या परीक्षाओं से संबद्ध विद्यार्थी / विद्यार्थियों के परीक्षा परिणाम को रद्द कर सकता है।
 5. संस्थान, हॉल्स एवं संबंधित विभागों में शिक्षक अपने प्राधिकार का स्वयं प्रयोग कर सकते हैं अथवा अपने महाविद्यालयों, संस्थानों अथवा विभागों में ऐसे शिक्षक प्रत्यायोजित प्राधिकार का प्रयोग कर सकते हैं जिसे वे इस प्रयोजनों के लिये निर्दिष्ट किया जा सके।
 6. कुलपति अथवा कुलानुशासक की शक्तियों पर प्रतिकूल प्रभाव डाले बिना जै पूर्वकथित है, अनुशासन एवं उचित आचरण के बारे में विस्तृत नियम बनाये जायेंगे। ये नियम इस विश्वविद्यालय में महाविद्यालय के प्राचार्यों, हॉल के प्रमुख, संकाय अधिष्ठाताओं और शिक्षण विभागों के विभागाध्यक्षों द्वारा जहाँ भी आवश्यक हो, वहाँ पूरक रूप में प्रयोग होंगे। प्रत्येक विद्यार्थी से आशा की जाती है कि वे नियमों की एक प्रति स्वयं के लिये सुरक्षित रख लें।
 7. प्रवेश के समय प्रत्येक विद्यार्थी को एक घोषणापत्र सत्यापित करना आवश्यक होगा कि वह विश्वविद्यालय के कुलपति एवं उन अन्य अधिकारियों के समक्ष अनुशासनात्मक कार्यवाही करने के लिये विश्वविद्यालय द्वारा बनाये गये अधिनियमों, संविधियों, अध्यादेशों एवं नियमों का पालन करने को उपस्थित रहेगी / रहेगा।
- अध्यादेश-XV-सी, रैगिंग निषेध और दंड व्यवस्था
1. महाविद्यालय / विभाग अथवा संस्थान के परिसर अथवा दिल्ली विश्वविद्यालय के अधीन किसी भी भाग में साथ ही सार्वजनिक परिवहन में किसी भी तरह की रैगिंग निषिद्ध है।
 2. रैगिंग की कार्यवाही, व्यक्तिगत अथवा सामूहिक प्रयास, घोर अनुशासनहीनता के कारण अक्षम्य है और इस अध्यादेश के अधीन विद्यार्थी कठोर अनुशासनात्मक कार्यवाही और दंड पाने के अधिकारी होंगे।
 3. इस अध्यादेश के अनुसार रैगिंग से आशय कक्षा में वरिष्ठ अथवा प्रभावी विद्यार्थियों द्वारा कमजोर अथवा कनिष्ठ नवागंतुक विद्यार्थियों को किसी ऐसे भद्दी टिप्पणी, आचरण अथवा शारीरिक-मानसिक तौर पर अपमानित करना है जो किसी भी प्रकार से प्रबल शक्ति का प्रभाव / दबाव का प्रयोग किया जाता है। यह व्यक्तिगत या सामूहिक दोनों स्तरों पर हो सकता है। इसके अंतर्गत निम्न कार्य आते हैं :-

- (ए) शारीरिक प्रताड़ना या शारीरिक बल प्रयोग की धमकी ।
(बी) महिला विद्यार्थियों की प्रतिष्ठा, गरिमा सम्मान को ठेस पहुँचाना ।
(सी) अनुसूचित जाति / जनजाति के विद्यार्थियों की प्रतिष्ठा, गरिमा सम्मान को ठेस पहुँचाना ।
(डी) अक्षम्य उपहास के लिये विद्यार्थियों को अनावृत एवं तिरस्कार करना और उनके आत्मसम्मान को ठेस पहुँचाना ।
(ई) अपशब्द कहना अथवा शारीरिक बल प्रयोग अथवा अश्लील व्यवहार करना ।

 - खंड (4) अतिरिक्त कुलानुशासक अपने तरीके से रैगिंग की किसी घटना की जाँच कर कुलपति को वृत्त (रिपोर्ट) देगा, जिसमें रैगिंग से संलिप्त विद्यार्थी की पहचान एवं घटना की प्रकृति का उल्लेख होगा ।
 - कुलानुशासक एक आरंभिक रिपोर्ट भी दर्ज करा सकता है जिसमें रैगिंग करने वाले अपराधियों की पहचान एवं रैगिंग घटना की प्रकृति का उल्लेख होगा ।
 - संस्था के अध्यक्ष अथवा विभागाध्यक्ष अथवा महाविद्यालय के प्राचार्य अथवा कुलानुशासक यदि लिखित दस्तावेज में दर्ज किसी विवरण से संतुष्ट हैं एवं पाते हैं कि आगे जाँच करना यथोचित उपयोगी नहीं है तो वह तदनुसार कुलपति को परामर्श दे सकता है ।
 - जब कुलपति भी संतुष्ट होते हैं कि ऐसी जाँच करना समीचीन नहीं है, तो उसका निर्णय अंतिम होगा ।
 - खंड 3 (ए), (बी) एवं (सी) में वर्णित रैगिंग की घटनाओं के संबंध में खंड (5) अथवा (6) के अधीन रिपोर्ट प्राप्त होने पर अथवा खंड (7) के अधीन संबन्धित अधिकारियों द्वारा रैगिंग घटनाओं के घटित होने की पुष्टि होने पर कुलपति रैगिंग करने वाले विद्यार्थी अथवा विद्यार्थियों को निश्चित वर्षों के लिये तुरंत निष्कासित करने का आदेश दे सकते हैं ।
 - रैगिंग के अन्य मामलों में कुलपति रैगिंग से संबंधित विद्यार्थियों के निष्कासन का आदेश दे सकते हैं अथवा एक अथवा एक से अधिक वर्षों की अवधि के लिये महाविद्यालय के किसी भी विभागीय परीक्षा में प्रवेश से रोक सकता है अथवा / उनके परीक्षा परिणाम / परिणामों को रद्द कर सकता है ।
 - यदि कोई विद्यार्थी जो दिल्ली विश्वविद्यालय से उपाधि अथवा डिप्लोमा प्राप्त कर चुका है वह इस अध्यादेश के अंतर्गत अपराधी पाया जाता है तो संविधि 15 के अधीन विश्वविद्यालय द्वारा प्रदत्त उपाधि अथवा डिप्लोमा की वापसी हेतु उचित कार्यवाही आरंभ की जा सकती है ।
 - इस अध्यादेश के तहत रैगिंग के लिये किसी भी प्रकार की दुष्प्रेरणा, दुर्व्यवहार के लिये उकसाना भी रैगिंग ही मानी जाएगी ।
 - दिल्ली विश्वविद्यालय प्रणाली के अंतर्गत सभी संस्थाएं इस अध्यादेश के अधीन जारी सभी अनुदेशों / निर्देशों का पालन करने के लिये एवं प्रभावी द्रुत कार्यान्वयन और कुलपति की सहायता एवं सहयोग देने के लिये बाध्य होंगे ।

नोट : अध्यादेश XV-सी के अनुसरण में कुलपति का आदेश : इस अध्यादेश के तहत किसी भी प्राधिकारी द्वारा कुलपति को रैगिंग की घटना / घटनाएं की रिपोर्ट की जाती है / हैं तो रैगिंग में संलिप्त विद्यार्थी / विद्यार्थियों आदेश में निर्धारित विनिर्दिष्ट समय हेतु निष्कासित किया जायेगा । रैगिंग में संलिप्त गैर-विद्यार्थियों के विरुद्ध भारत के अपराध नियम के तहत कार्यवाही की जाएगी, उन्हें दिल्ली विश्वविद्यालय के किसी भी संस्थान में प्रवेश प्राप्त करने हेतु पांच वर्षों तक अयोग्य भी कर दिया जाएगा ।

अध्यादेश XV-डी

महिलाओं का कार्यस्थल पर लैंगिक उत्पीड़न (निवारण, निषेध और प्रतितोष) अधिनियम, 2013 (विधि एवं न्याय मंत्रालय)
कार्यस्थल पर महिलाओं के लैंगिक उत्पीड़न के प्रति सुरक्षा प्रदान करने के लिए एक अधिनियम और लैंगिक उत्पीड़न की शिकायतों तथा इसके साथ जुड़े मामलों अथवा आकस्मिक मामलों की रोकथाम और निवारण ।
जहां भारत के संविधान के अनुच्छेद 14 और 15 के तहत समानता के लिये एक महिला के अधिकारों के उल्लंघन का परिणाम यौन उत्पीड़न और जीवन के अधिकार और संविधान के अनुच्छेद 21 तहत गरिमा के साथ जीने और किसी पेशे को करने अथवा किसी भी व्यवसाय, ट्रेड अथवा व्यापार करने का अधिकार है जिसमें लैंगिक उत्पीड़न से मुक्त एक सुरक्षित वातावरण का अधिकार शामिल है, और जहां लैंगिक उत्पीड़न और गरिमा के साथ काम करने का अधिकार अंतरराष्ट्रीय कन्वेंशन एवं इंस्ट्रुमेंट्स द्वारा सार्वभौमिक रूप से मान्यता प्राप्त है, जैसे कि महिलाओं के खिलाफ भेदभाव के सभी रूपों के उन्मूलन के कन्वेंशन, जिसकी 25 जून 1993 को भारत सरकार द्वारा अभिपुष्टि की गई है, और जहाँ कार्यस्थल पर लैंगिक उत्पीड़न के खिलाफ महिलाओं की सुरक्षा के लिए कहे गये कन्वेंशन को प्रभावी बनाने के लिए प्रावधान करना फायदेमंद है ।

The Mantra of the Library

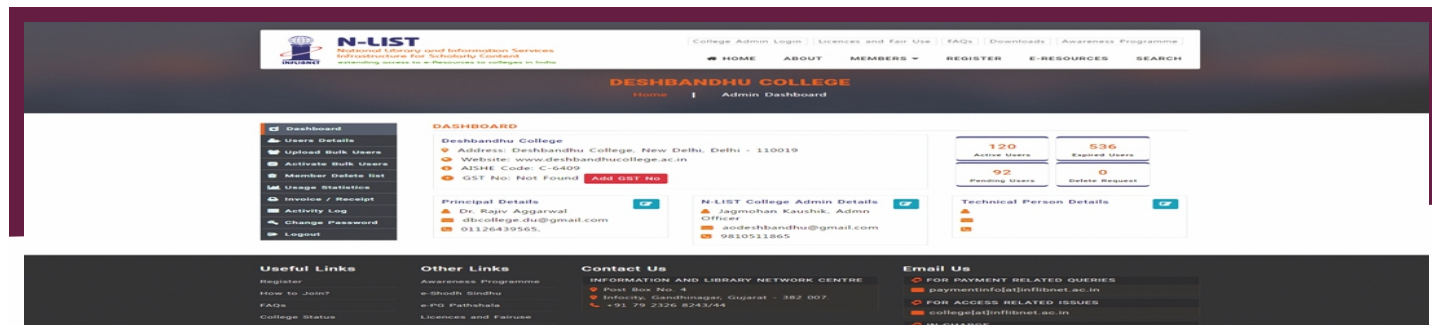
“The right book to the right user at the right time”

The college library provides impetus to services with the introduction of new and modern ICT infrastructure. The library is connected with Delhi University-wide area campus network and provides access to electronic resources to library users from Delhi University Library System (DULS) e-ShodhSindhu: Consortium for Higher Education Electronic Resources. The library provides various services such as Reference service, Circulation service, Question & Syllabus Bank, Book Bank service, Current Awareness Service, and Reprographic service. An orientation program is conducted at the beginning of the new academic session. All the books are bar-coded and made easily searchable through the online public access catalog (OPAC). The library has a massive collection of more than 121163 books, 47 periodicals, 15 Newspapers and 450 CDs.

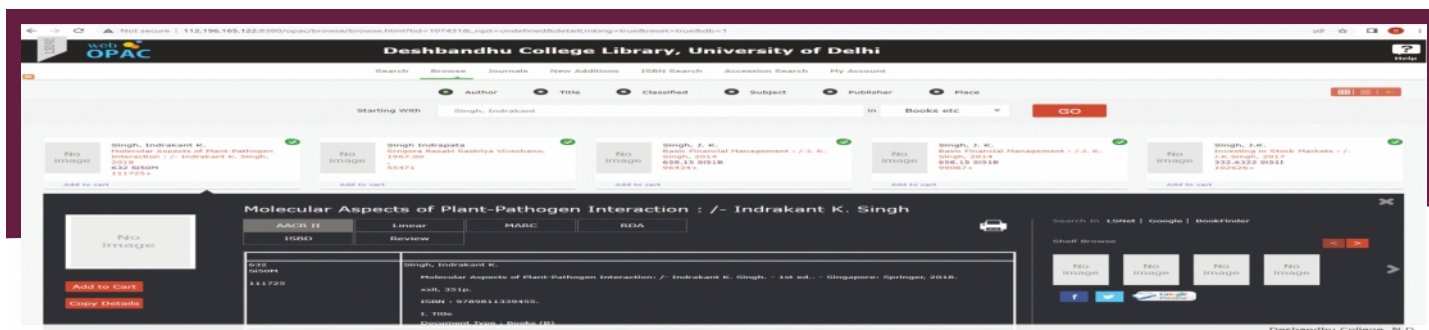


The College Library also subscribed National Library and Information Services Infrastructure for Scholarly Content (N-LIST). It is an initiative of the Ministry of Human Resources Development (MHRD) under the NME-ICT now funded by UGC, as a college component under UGC-INFONET Digital Library Consortium. Under NLIST Programme, the library users are able to access more than 6000 e-journals and 200000 e-Books. The library also subscribed to DELNET (Developing Library Network) for accessing Union catalog of books and periodicals.

The college library has an E-facility for visually impaired students and a dedicated computer lab with a scanner and

Under the guidance of the WDC Convenor, and the committee members, the Women Development Cell has proactively organized several programs/ webinars covering a wide range of topics like gender equality, women empowerment, fight against patriarchy, decoding bias, and menstrual hygiene.

Among the events hosted by the WDC on the International Women's Day, was an extremely engaging talk entitled 'Why Women's Day?' presented by Dr. Hema V. Raghavan, former Principal, Gargi College and Dean, Student's Welfare, Delhi University.

WDC also organised a webinar themed on 'Understanding Modern Women: Prism of Ancient Wisdom.' Ms. Annu Kalra, a spiritually inspired author was invited as the chief speaker. She helped us see modern women with a fresh perspective and shared how her dilemmas were answered through the ancient wisdom.

An inherently thought provoking session on 'Decoding Bias- A conversation with filmmaker Anandana Kapur' was another event hosted by us in the recent past. The discussion explored systemic bias against women in society and in filmmaking through the lens of filmmaker Anandana Kapur, an award winning filmmaker, educationist and founder-director Cinemad India.

Other Facilities

- **Girls' Common Room:** For female students, there is a spacious and comfortable air conditioned common room, along with attached washroom facilities. There is also a female security attendant. It is located on the first floor in the Admin Block, adjacent to the faculty Department rooms.
- **Boys' Common Room:** It is located adjacent to the canteen .
- **Canteen:** The College has a very traditional yet extremely sumptuous food offered at a reasonable cost by the canteen. It is located adjacent to the main gate and is run on contract. In addition to the canteen, there is also a coffee and snack kiosk behind the New Science Block, that offers some light bites on the go.
- **Photocopying Service :** Photocopy facility on payment basis is available in the college premises.
- **Web Access Centre:** The whole college campus is wi-fi enabled and web access centre computers provide faculty members and students with access to online journals and content provided by University of Delhi on its Internet.
- **Medical Room:** There is a medical room adjacent to the college office for providing basic first aid to the students.
- **Banking:** The college has a branch of Punjab & Sind Bank on its premises. Students can open their account as well as take advantage of other banking facilities. The bank also has an ATM on the campus.
- **Auditorium:** The college has a fully air-conditioned auditorium with good seating arrangement for seminars, conferences and other activities.
- **Seminar/Conference facilities:** Two air conditioned IT enabled Committee rooms with optimum seating capacity are situated on the ground floor in front of the Principal's Office, and on the first floor. There is a large conference room, in addition, there is a small seminar room in the library as well. These facilities are used for meetings, seminars and discussions.
- **Laboratories:** The college has well equipped laboratories for all the Science courses namely Biochemistry, Botany, Chemistry, Mathematics, Physics, and Zoology. The Computer Science department has its own centre for computer related practicals.
- **Botanical Garden:** The College has a well maintained Botanical Garden with diverse forms of plants. It has a well maintained pond ecosystem apart from a variety of terrestrial flora. The Garden now has a thriving Mushroom culture unit, along with a Bonsai and a Japanese style Rock Garden. The Botanical Garden provides experimental material for class work and has a good nursery also.
- **Aravalli Biodiversity Park:** 3.75 Acres of jungle have now been converted into a biodiversity park with nearly 2000 varieties of flora in various stages of growth. Special care has been taken to introduce four different varieties of grass. A 1000 billion years old rock was unearthed and has now been given the pride of the place. It belongs to the Delhi Aravalli range, part of the oldest rock formation on earth.
- **Parking:** The College has a gated parking facility for staff members which is guarded by the security staff round-the clock.
- The College is working towards reducing consumption of non environment friendly sources of power and expanding the solar power capacity.
- The College entrance gate and courtyard area have been aesthetically renovated recently.

DBT Star College Scheme was launched by DBT, Ministry of Science & Technology, Govt. of India, in 2008 to support colleges and universities offering undergraduate education to improve science teaching across the country. This scheme was initiated for improving critical thinking and 'hands on' experimental work at undergraduate (college) level in sciences. Deshbandhu College was awarded DBT-STAR College scheme in 2019 and five departments of this college are actively involved under this scheme i.e Department of Biochemistry, Botany, Chemistry, Physics and Zoology.

Insect Reproduction Laboratory

Group Leader: Prof. Kamal Kumar Gupta, Department of Zoology, DBC

The Insect Reproduction Laboratory was established in 1999 at Deshbandhu College.

The laboratory has adequate infrastructure and expertise to pursue research in Insect-Plant Interaction, Insect Reproductive Behavior and Physiology, Vector Biology and Management. The principal investigator has completed five research projects funded by various Indian funding agencies. At present, six students are continuing research in this laboratory. Three scholars have completed their Ph. D. degree from the University of Delhi from this laboratory. Besides, the laboratory provides opportunities for summer internships to undergraduate and postgraduate students. Thirty research papers have been published in the journal of national and international repute from the research work conducted in the laboratory. Research scholars in the laboratory regularly attend national and international conferences to present their research findings.

Molecular Biology Research Laboratory (MBR Lab)

Group Leader: Dr Indrakant Kumar Singh, Department of Zoology, DBC

The MBR lab established in 2014 follows an unconventional research approach with a concept of integrative applied science wherein the research group tries to venture and answer a few unresolved biological problems. Here the research group uses bioinformatics and basic molecular biology techniques to screen the best hit molecules and design new candidate drugs, bioinformatics tools, and diagnostic kits. MBR lab's research interest revolves around diseases such as Cancer, Tuberculosis, and Rare genetic disorders.

Presently the MBR Lab includes 2 Post-doctoral Fellows, 5 Ph.D. students, and 2 Junior Research Fellows and 3 M.tech/ M.Sc. trainees. The group have published more than 50 research papers in peer-reviewed journals and 2 Patents application in India and USA besides 30 book chapters and more than 50 presentations in India and abroad. The MBR labs have National and International collaboration for the student exchange, partial support and work collaboration with prestigious academic and research institutes.

Catalysis & Bioinorganic Research Laboratory (CBR)

Group Leader: Dr Umesh Kumar, Department of Chemistry, DBC

The CBR lab established in 2017 with aim to perform cutting-edge research in the area of Inorganic Chemistry, especially in Coordination Chemistry, Organometallics, Supramolecular Chemistry, Materials Chemistry, Bioinorganic Chemistry and Catalysis. This research group involves in synthesizing new coordination and organometallic compounds (including air and moisture sensitive) for catalytic and biological evaluations. The CBR lab catalysis lies at the heart of clean and cost-effective energy generation and storage. On the other hand in biological activities, we design the molecules for anticancer and antimicrobial studies. The CBR lab received the funding from University Grant commission (UGC) and Science and Engineering Research Board (SERB), Department of Science and Technology, New Delhi, India. The CBR lab gives training for Ph. D. Thesis, M.D./M.Sc. Dissertation and UG/PG trainee. We also have collaboration with various national and international academic/research institutes.



Bioorganic Material Research Laboratory

Group Leader : Dr Pratibha Kumari, Department of Chemistry, DBC

The research interest of the Bioorganic Material Research Laboratory resides in the designing and development of newer organic and bioorganic-based materials for their application in environmental remediation, catalysis, sensing, and medicinal chemistry. Our research group is involved in the green synthesis of novel and efficient functional materials. We have developed different bioorganic as well as organic-inorganic hybrid porous materials for water remediation applications. The removal of contaminants through adsorption and photodegradation of organic pollutants using different porous materials is the main focus of our research group. We are also working in the area of the development of bio-based sensors for the detection of contaminants. Our research lab has been receiving research grants from different government agencies such as the University Grants Commission (UGC), the Science and Engineering Research Board (SERB), and the Defence Research and Development Organization (DRDO).

National Cadets Corps (NCC)

The N.C.C was introduced in Universities and Colleges in 1948 through an Act of Parliament under the chairmanship of Pt. H. N. Kunjru with the aim to groom the youth and unleash their hidden potential to face challenges, be winners in life, build leadership qualities and a spirit of sportsmanship. It also aims to create a pool of organized, trained and motivated youth with leadership qualities in all walks of life, who will serve the Nation regardless of which career they choose.

The college has two Senior Division NCC (Army Wing) companies with a strength of 160 cadets each for girls and boys. The College also has one Senior Division NCC (Air Wing) sub unit with a strength of 50 boy cadets. In addition, Naval Wing vacancies are also available for 40 boy cadets (SD) and 10 girl cadets (SW).

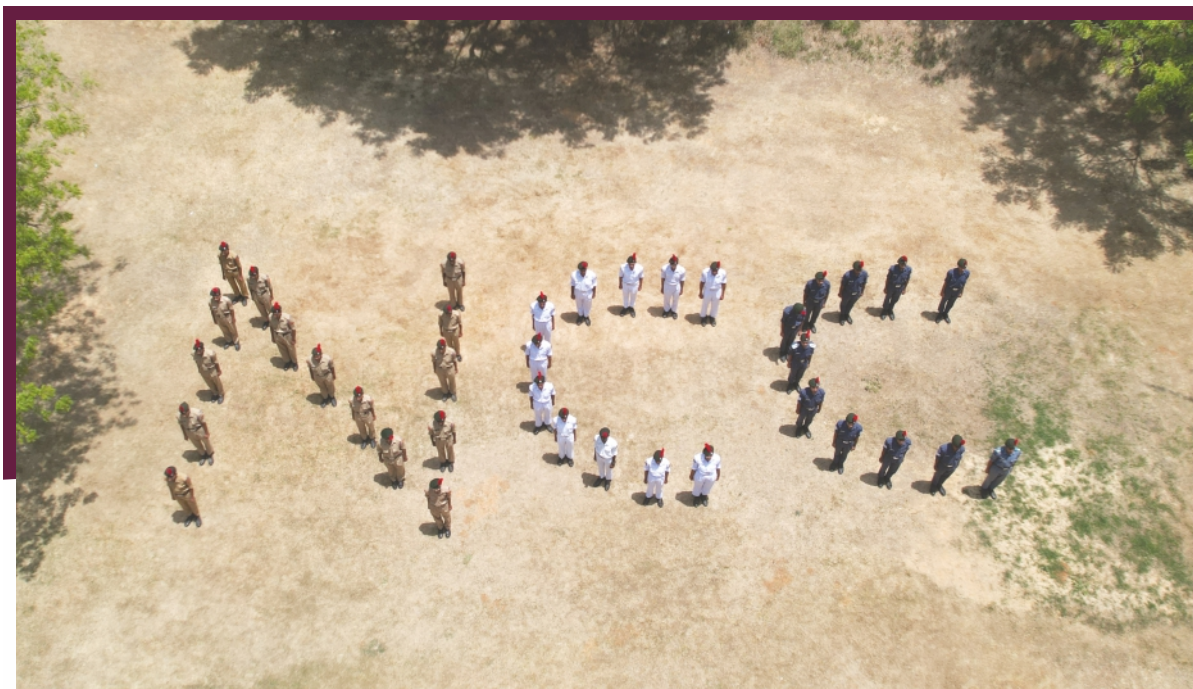
NCC organizes many camps throughout the year in which the youth are trained professionally by experts from the Army, Navy and Air Force, and the Cadets are awarded 'B' certificates after proficiency in training. This enables them to obtain a 5-10% advantage in securing employment with the Armed forces, Police and CRPF. After rigorous training of three years, they are awarded 'C' certificates which make them eligible for special NCC entry scheme as commissioned officers in Indian Armed Forces. In addition, the NCC also provides various kinds of scholarships.

How to Join

The enrolment for first year students as cadets starts just after completion of admission process of the college and remains open till mid of September at the concerned N.C.C offices. Students interested in training programmes may contact the respective Associate NCC Officer (ANO).

About our ANOs

ANO is an important link in the NCC organization between the Battalion/Unit and the Cadets. Colleges have NCC troops/platoons/companies that are under the command of an Assistant Professor, who has received formal NCC training at Officers' Training Academy, Kamptee. ANO is the feeder node of NCC since s/he is the one who is in direct contact with the cadets throughout the year.

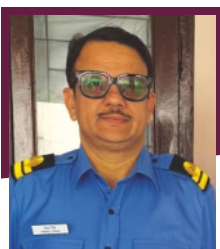

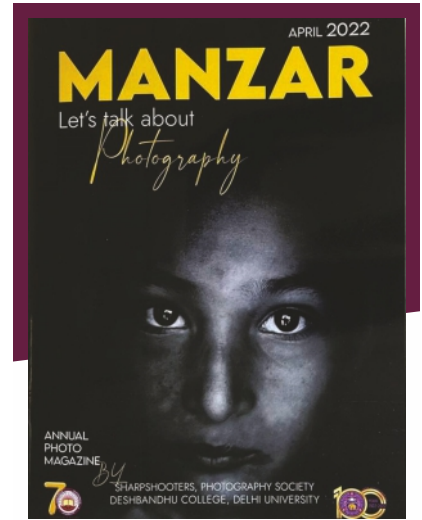


Photography Society: Sharpshooters

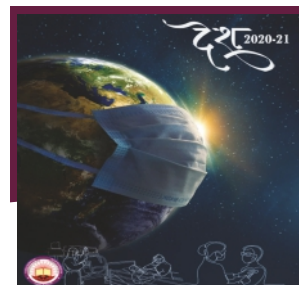


The College Magazine: DESH

FAQs

Q1: Please tell me what subjects I should appear for in the CUET.

Ans.: It depends on the courses you wish to appear for at the University of Delhi. Please check the eligibility for different undergraduate courses in the Bulletin of Information issued by the University of Delhi. Remember, the subjects that you choose should be the ones that you have studied in Class XII.

Q2: I have not studied a particular subject in Class XII, but I want to appear in that paper in CUET. Can I do so for meeting the eligibility of a particular program?

Ans: For admission to all undergraduate programs at the University of Delhi, candidates must appear in only those papers in CUET in which s/he have passed Class XII board exams.

Q3: I have not studied Mathematics in Class XII, but I want to appear in Mathematics at CUET. Will my application for B.Sc. (Hons) Physics at the University of Delhi be considered?

Ans: For admissions to all programs of the University of Delhi where a specific subject is a compulsory subject in the eligibility, having studied that subject in Class XII and appearing in that subject is compulsory.

Q4: I have studied Food Technology in Class XII, but Food Technology is not in CUET. Which subject should I choose in CUET?

Ans: In case the subject studied in Class XII is not there in CUET, you should appear in a subject closely related/similar to the subject studied in Class XII. In your case, check the syllabus of Home Science and decide.

Q5: I gave my Class XII from CBSE but have cleared Economics from NIOS. Will Delhi University consider my Economics marks from CUET?

Ans: If you have passed Economics in Class XII, you may choose Mathematics in CUET.

Q6: Will the medium Language of CUET be considered for admissions to the University of Delhi?

Ans: Yes, all 33 languages of CUET will be considered for admission to the University of Delhi.

Q7: I am applying for improvement in one of my subjects, can I take admission in DU?

Ans: For admission to the University of Delhi, you should have passed Class XII.

Q8: I have studied Business Mathematics in class XII. How can I apply for B.Sc. (Hons) Mathematics program?

Ans: You must appear in Mathematics at CUET.

Q9: Currently, I am pursuing my graduation from the School of Open Learning, at the University of Delhi and I want to give CUET for admission to regular undergraduate courses at the University of Delhi, so can I give CUET without cancelling my admission from the School of Open Learning?

Ans: Yes, you can appear in CUET without cancelling your current admission.

Q10: Last year I got infected with COVID and could not take admission in any College. Will my Class XII mark sheet be considered for admissions this year?

Ans: Yes, you can take admission this year provided you appear in CUET-2022.

Q11: I have applied for CUET and added a few undergraduate programs at the University of Delhi, but there was no provision to select Colleges. How will I know where my admission will be?

Ans: After the registration process of CUET, you will be required to fill the counselling form of the University of Delhi. Details of selecting the Programs and Colleges will be published on the website. Keep looking at the admission website on a regular basis.

Q12: Every University's eligibility for admission to similar programs is different. How should I select Domain-Specific subjects in CUET so that I meet the eligibility of all the Central Universities where I am planning to get admission?

Ans: You should select the Domain-Specific Subjects as per the eligibility for whichever university you wish to apply for. Every University has its own requirements.

Q13: Can I apply for B.A. (Hons) Hindi at the University of Delhi if I have not studied and passed Hindi in the Class XII board examination?

Ans: For admission to B.A. (Hons) Hindi the applicant must have studied and passed Hindi at the Class XII board examination and should have also appeared in Hindi in CUET.

Q14: While applying to CUET do I have to upload Class XII marks of all the subjects or only for the Best five/four?

Ans: You should upload marks for all the subjects you have appeared in Class XII in case your result is declared.

Q15: How will I apply for the Extra-Curricular Activities quota at the University of Delhi?

Ans: Appear in CUET 2022 and wait for the announcement of the University of Delhi in this regard.

Q16: Is there any weightage to Class XII board marks for taking admission in undergraduate programs at the University of Delhi?

Ans: Applicants must have passed Class XII board examination or its equivalent from a single recognized Board.

Q17: How will colleges at the University of Delhi be allotted after the declaration of CUET results?

Ans: After the registration process of CUET, you will have to fill the counselling form of the University of Delhi. Details of selecting the program and Colleges will be published on the website. Keep looking at the admission website for all updated information.

Q18: Is Section III (General Test) compulsory for admission to DU?

Ans: Appearing in Section III (General Test) may be compulsory for some of the programs of the University of Delhi. You must check the Program-Specific eligibility of the programs in which you wish to take admission.

Q19: If an applicant is from the science stream in Class XII and wants to apply for B.A.(H) History then which subjects should she choose?

Ans: You must appear in the subjects in which you have passed Class XII. There will be no penalty for changing the stream.

Q20: I had English, Physics, Chemistry, Economics, Mathematics, and Music in Class XII but I did not choose Mathematics in CUET. Can I still take admission in B.A.(Hons) Economics?

Ans: For admission to B.A.(Hons) Economics, the candidates must appear in Mathematics in CUET.

Q21: For admission to B.A.(Hons) Political Science will there be any benefit if I choose Political Science in CUET?

Ans: There is no advantage to choosing Political Science at CUET. All applicants who are meeting the eligibility will be considered at par and their CUET scores will be used for calculating their merit.

Q22: In case I score fewer marks in a subject in the Class XII board examination but got good marks in CUET in that subject, will it affect my admission?

Ans: Class XII marks will be checked only for the minimum eligibility. For admission to a particular undergraduate program at the University of Delhi, the score obtained by the applicant in CUET 2022 will be considered according to the program-specific eligibility of that program.

Q23: What is the validity of the CUET 2022 score, can it be used for getting admission in 2023?

Ans: No, marks of CUET 2022 will be considered for admission to the academic year 2022-23 only.

Q24: Is it necessary to appear in CUET?

Ans: Yes, it is the only way to get admitted to the University of Delhi, except in the School of Open Learning, and Non-Collegiate Women Education Board.

Q25: How much weightage will be given to my Class XII marks?

Ans: There is no weightage for Class XII marks.

Q26: I will be taking the CUET in four subjects. In what courses will I be eligible to apply after clearing the exam?

Ans: Please check the Program-Specific eligibility as each program has its own specific requirements.

Q27: Where do I find all the information related to admissions at the University of Delhi?

Ans: All information related to admission can be found at www.admissison.uod.ac.in

A Bulletin of Information is also available on the same website, which contains information about various courses offered by the University.
