

Identifying Zombie Banks

Multivariate regressions highlight the differential lending behaviour of zombies, after accounting for bank-specific controls and year effects. — Saibal Ghosh

Trade Reforms, Technology Import, and Firm Productivity

The impact of technology import on the productivity of Indian manufacturing firms during 1995–2016 is examined. The empirics are based on an unbalanced sample of 4,616 firms, which is further segregated into four use-based categories of production. This analysis tends to support the predictions of new trade and growth theories that international trade provides opportunities for dynamic productivity gains. — R Rijesh

Faith-based Financial Exclusion in India

One of the key determinants of access to financial services is branch density as loan-making depends on information that necessitates local presence. This paper hypothesises that the proportion of Muslim population has an inverse relationship with branch density in India. The hypothesis is tested using data on commercial bank branches from the Reserve Bank of India and census data.
