

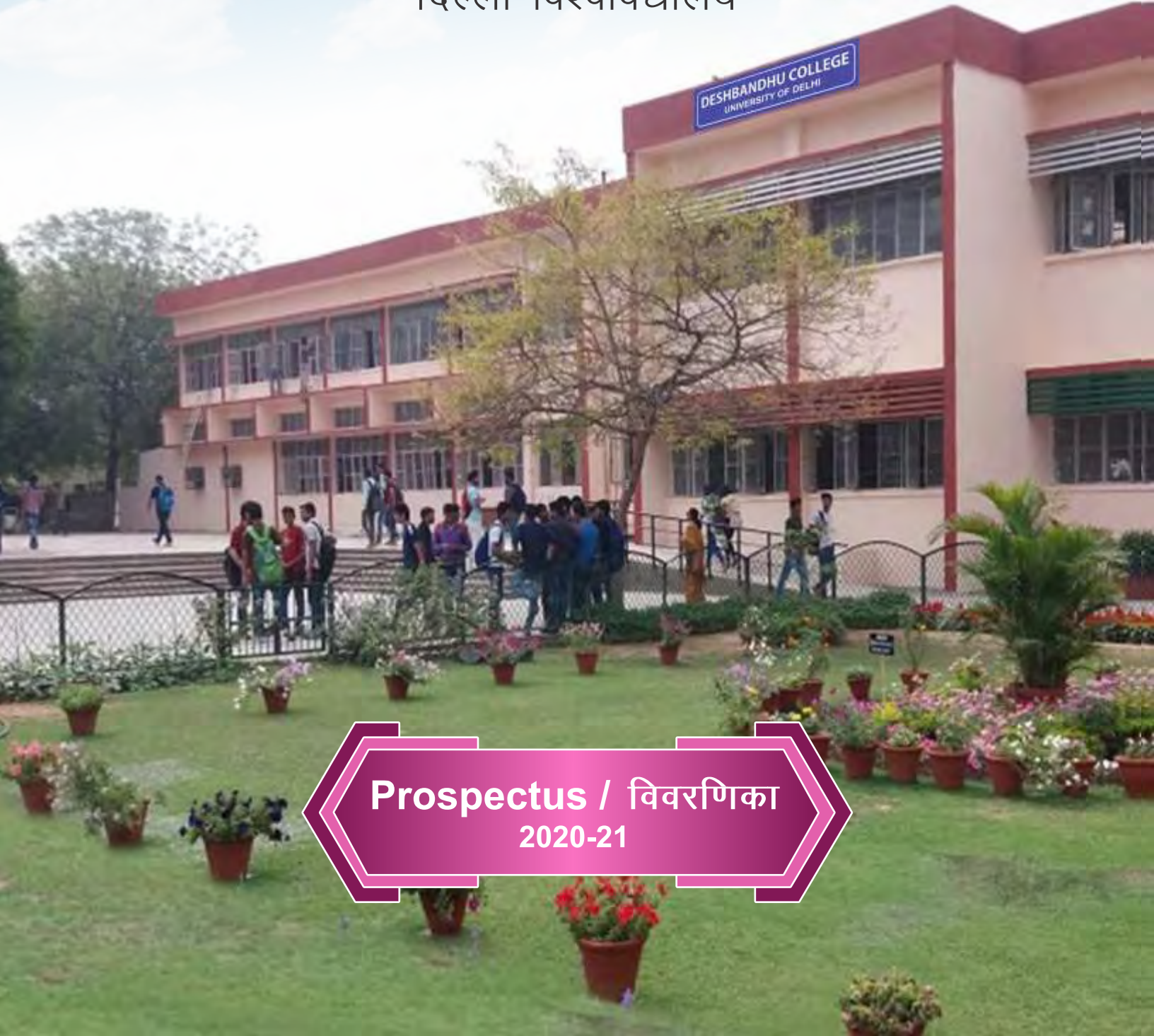

लाला देशबंधु गुप्ता भारत के स्वतंत्रता संग्राम सेनानी एवं पत्रकार थे। उन्होंने लाला लाजपत राय के समाचार पत्र वंदेमातरम में संपादक के रूप में सहयोग दिया। गुप्ता ने बाल गंगाधर तिलक के लेखों से प्रभावित होकर अपना जीवन स्वतंत्रता आंदोलन के लिए समर्पित किया। साइमन कमीशन के दिल्ली पहुंचन पर उसका विरोध किया। वे अनेक बार जेल भी गए। लालाजी संविधान सभा के विशिष्ट सदस्य थे।

उनका जन्म पानीपत में हुआ था, लेकिन उनकी कर्मभूमि दिल्ली रही। देश के विभाजन के समय लाला जी ने दिल्ली और आस-पास के क्षेत्रों में साम्प्रदायिक सदभाव बनाये रखने में महत्वपूर्ण भूमिका निभाई। दुर्भाग्य से 1951 में कलकत्ता जाते समय विमान दुर्घटना में उनका निधन हो गया।

THE COLLEGE



Deshbandhu College was established in the year 1952 by the Ministry of Rehabilitation, in the memory of Late Lala Deshbandhu Gupta – a veteran freedom fighter. The college made a humble beginning with just 72 students and courses like Prep (Arts), Prep (Science) and Pre-medical. The college was transferred to the Ministry of Education and later taken over by the University of Delhi.

Guided by the mantra “Karmanyevadhikaraste” – our motto, the college continues to grow both in size and stature. Today, Deshbandhu college is a fully maintained constituent college of University of Delhi and has the distinction of being one of the oldest and the largest co-educational institution in South Delhi promoting Arts, Commerce and Science courses. The college offers seven post graduate and eighteen undergraduate courses in disciplines ranging from Languages/Literature, History, Political Science, Economics, and Commerce to all the major branches of Science and Mathematics and caters to over 4500 students every year.

The sprawling campus of Deshbandhu College, with its lawns, gardens and playgrounds provide a healthy environment for all round development of the generation. The campus is dotted with an Administrative Block, Dr. B. R. Ambedkar Block, Dr. A. P. J. Abdul Kalam Block, Swami Vivekananda Auditorium, a huge library and with well equipped laboratories, together with students’ common rooms, canteen, photocopy, web-access

वर्ष 1952 में पुनर्वास मंत्रालय द्वारा महान स्वतंत्रता सेनानी स्वर्गीय लाला देशबंदु गुप्ता की स्मृति में मात्र 72 छात्रों और आर्ट्स, साइंस व प्री-मेडिकल जैसे पाठ्यक्रमों के साथ ‘देशबंदु कॉलेज’ की नींव रखी गई थी। आगे चलकर इस संस्था को शिक्षा मंत्रालय में स्थानांतरित किया गया और बाद में दिल्ली विश्वविद्यालय द्वारा अधिगृहीत कर लिया गया।

‘कर्मण्येवाधिकारस्ते’ जैसे शीर्ष-वाक्य के साथ कॉलेज ने जिस आदर्श को निर्धारित किया था, उसी से निर्देशित होते हुए आज यह आकार, कद और गुणवत्ता में चारों तरफ फलता-फूलता नजर आ रहा है। कला, वाणिज्य और विज्ञान जैसे पाठ्यक्रमों को बढ़ावा देने वाले दक्षिणी दिल्ली के सबसे पुराने और सबसे बड़े सह-शैक्षणिक संस्थानों में से एक देशबंदु कॉलेज आज दिल्ली विश्वविद्यालय का पूर्ण रूप से घटक कॉलेज है। सम्प्रति हमारा कॉलेज भाषा-साहित्य, इतिहास, राजनीति विज्ञान, अर्थशास्त्र, और वाणिज्य से लेकर विज्ञान और गणित की सभी प्रमुख शाखाओं में अठारह स्नातक और सात स्नातकोत्तर पाठ्यक्रमों के माध्यम से लगभग 4500 से अधिक छात्र-छात्राओं को हर साल डिग्री प्रदान करता है।

देशबंदु कॉलेज का विशाल परिसर, इसका लॉन, उद्यान, खेल के मैदान सभी मिलकर यहाँ के युवा प्रतिभाओं के लिए एक स्वस्थ वातावरण का निर्माण करते हैं। यह परिसर अपने एक प्रशासनिक ब्लॉक, डॉ. बी.आर. अम्बेडकर ब्लॉक, डॉ. एपीजे अब्दुल कलाम ब्लॉक, स्वामी विवेकानंद सभागार, एक विशाल पुस्तकालय और अच्छी तरह से सुसज्जित प्रयोगशालाओं के साथ-साथ छात्र एवं छात्राओं के लिए अलग-अलग बने कॉमन रूम, कैंटीन, फोटोकॉपी व वेब-एक्सेस केंद्र, चिकित्सा कक्ष, बैंकिंग सुविधा, व्यायामशाला, सेमिनार हॉल, वनस्पति उद्यान और पार्किंग जैसी कितनी ही उपलब्ध सेवाओं के रूप में शोभा पाता है।

हमें यह बताने में गौरव की अनुभूति हो रही है कि कॉलेज स्तर पर हमारी लाइब्रेरी को दिल्ली विश्वविद्यालय की एक ऐसी सबसे बड़ी लाइब्रेरी होने का गौरव प्राप्त है, जहाँ 1.17.253 पुस्तकों का विशाल संग्रह, शिक्षकों व विद्यार्थियों को आकृष्ट करता



centre, medical room, banking facility, a gymnasium, a seminar hall, botanical garden, parking and so on.

To encourage self learning and to satisfy the thirst for knowledge of the students, the college library has a massive collection of about 1,17,253 books, a host of journals and magazines, a spacious reading room, a separate floor for teachers and research scholars, and a book bank section which lends text books to needy students. The college has created a spacious “Web Access Center” in which 80 computers and server provided by the Delhi University are housed. The server have optical fiber connectivity and the college campus is Wi-Fi enabled. In addition there is a dedicated facility for use of computers and Internet connectivity in the library.

The college promotes organization of seminars, lectures, workshops, sports activities, NSS, NCC and other co-curricular activities. Every student finds his/her expression through College Students’ Union, affiliated to the Delhi University Students’ Union. A number of scholarships and financial aid is provided to meritorious and needy students every year. The Career-counselling and Placement Cell of the college provide suitable employment opportunities to graduating students through campus recruitment.

There are also some important Cells for the betterment of different sections of the society such as Equal Opportunity Cell, SC-ST Cell, OBC Cell and North-East Cell.

Deshbandhu college has an active Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC), as a mechanism to build and ensure a quality culture at the college level. The college also has a Women Development Cell (WDC), which is a group of passionate feminist scholars and activists coming together to discuss Gender related issues.

The college is well equipped with all infra-structural/ academic support that a student requires. Deshbandhu college has also been awarded the ‘Star College Project’ in the year 2019 by the Department of Biotechnology, Government of India to promote undergraduate scientific research.

The College and the faculty offer a holistic environment to the students and gives preference to their psychological/academic needs. This creates an informal, close-knit, friendly and supportive environment that encourages hard work and academic achievement.

रहता है। विद्यार्थियों के बीच स्वयं सीखने को प्रोत्साहित करने व उनके ज्ञान की प्यास बुझाने के लिए, कॉलेज पुस्तकालय में किताबें, जर्नल्स व पत्रिकाओं के साथ-साथ एक विशाल अध्ययन-कक्ष भी उपलब्ध है। अनुसंधानपरक अध्ययन को प्रोत्साहित करते हुए कॉलेज ने शोध-विद्वानों व शिक्षकों के लिए एक अलग मंजिल की भी योजना बनाई है। लाइब्रेरी में ही एक पुस्तक-बैंक अनुभाग भी है जो जरूरतमंद छात्रों को पाठ्य पुस्तकें उधार देता है।

कॉलेज ने एक विशाल वेब एक्सेस सेंटर बनाया है जिसमें दिल्ली विश्वविद्यालय द्वारा प्रदान किए गए 80 कंप्यूटर और सर्वर रखे गए हैं। सर्वर में ऑप्टिकल फाइबर कनेक्टिविटी है। साथ ही कॉलेज परिसर में वाई-फाई उपलब्धता भी सक्षम है। हमारा पुस्तकालय कंप्यूटर और इंटरनेट कनेक्टिविटी से पूरी तरह जुड़ा हुआ विद्यार्थियों व शिक्षकों को समर्पित है।

कॉलेज में विभिन्न समितियों की मदद से राष्ट्रीय व अंतर्राष्ट्रीय सेमिनार, व्याख्यान, कार्यशाला, कान्फ्रेंस, वाद-विवाद व क्विज जैसे विविध उपयोगी शैक्षणिक कार्यक्रमों के अलावा शिक्षणोत्तर कार्य व उपलब्धियों में एन.एस.एस., एन.सी.सी., स्पोर्ट्स यूनिट की भी अहम भूमिका रहती है। अपने विभिन्न कार्यक्रमों के आयोजन के माध्यम से कॉलेज में नयी प्रतिभाओं को खोजने, उन्हें तराशने और उपलब्धियों को हासिल करने के लिए उन्हें प्रेरित करने में इनका उल्लेखनीय योगदान रहता है।

हमारे कॉलेज का हर विद्यार्थी दिल्ली विश्वविद्यालय छात्र संघ से जुड़कर जहाँ नई अभिव्यक्ति पाता है, वहीं छात्र राजनीति को एक नया आयाम भी प्रदान करता है।

हमारा कॉलेज प्रति वर्ष मेधावी व जरूरतमंद छात्र-छात्राओं को छात्रवृत्ति व वित्तीय सहायता भी प्रदान करता है। कॉलेज की कैरियर-कार्डसलिंग और प्लेसमेंट सेल कैंपस-रिक्रूटमेंट आदि आयोजनों के माध्यम से ग्रेजुएशन कर रहे छात्र-छात्राओं को उपयुक्त रोजगार के अवसर भी प्रदान कराता है।

कॉलेज में समाज के विभिन्न वर्गों की बेहतरी के लिए कुछ महत्वपूर्ण सेल भी हैं जैसे कि समान अवसर सेल, एससी-एसटी सेल, ओबीसी सेल और नॉर्थ-ईस्ट सेल।

देशबंधु कॉलेज में कॉलेज स्तर पर एक गुणवत्ता आधारित संस्कृति बनाने और सुनिश्चित करने के लिए एक तंत्र के रूप में सक्रिय आंतरिक गुणवत्ता आश्वासन सेल (IQAC) भी है। कॉलेज में एक महिला विकास प्रकोष्ठ (WDC) भी है, जहाँ नारीवादी विद्वान और कार्यकर्ताओं का समूह जेंडर से संबंधित मुद्दों पर चर्चा करने के लिए एक साथ आते हैं।

इस तरह हमारा कॉलेज सभी तरह के आधुनिक आधार-संरचनात्मक शैक्षणिक सहायता से लैस है जो कि एक बेहतरीन शैक्षणिक माहौल के लिए किसी भी छात्र एवं शिक्षक की आवश्यकता होती है। स्नातक स्तर पर वैज्ञानिक अनुसंधान को बढ़ावा देने के लिए भारत सरकार के जैव प्रौद्योगिकी विभाग द्वारा देशबंधु कॉलेज को वर्ष 2019 में ‘स्टार कॉलेज प्रोजेक्ट’ से सम्मानित किया गया है।

कुल मिलाकर हमारा कॉलेज और यहाँ के फ़ैक्टलीज़ अपने विद्यार्थियों को एक समग्र शैक्षणिक वातावरण प्रदान करते हैं। उस वातावरण में मनोवैज्ञानिक और शैक्षणिक आवश्यकताओं को प्राथमिकता दी जाती है, जिसके फलस्वरूप एक ऐसा अनौपचारिक, घनिष्ठ, दोस्ताना और सहायक वातावरण बनता है जो विद्यार्थियों एवं शिक्षकों दोनों को ही कड़ी मेहनत और शैक्षणिक उपलब्धियां हासिल करने के लिए प्रोत्साहित करता रहता है।

ADMISSION PROCESS

Admissions to undergraduate (UG) courses at the University of Delhi are **Merit-Based** (that is, based on marks scored in Class XII Board/qualifying examinations) or **Entrance-Based** (that is, based on written/practical tests depending on the course selected by an aspiring student).

- All applicants must register through the University of Delhi online admissions portal <https://ug.du.ac.in>
- All undergraduate admissions for Session 2020 - 21 will be administered only through this portal.
- **There is no offline admission for any applicant.**
- Only eligible applicants who have registered online through the university portal can be considered for admission.
- Applicants will be required to appear in person at the University of Delhi only at the very end of the admission process, for verification of certificates as per the schedule to be announced by the University/College.
- All other admission procedures are to be completed by the applicant using the unique login ID they create on the Delhi University Undergraduate admissions portal.

Eligibility Criteria for Undergraduate Courses

- The applicant must be a citizen of India. (Applicants seeking **admission under Foreign Students' category** to **apply separately** on Foreign Students' Registry website, <http://fsr.du.ac.in>.)
- The applicant should have passed the Class XII examination of any Board/ University examination in India or in any foreign country recognized as equivalent to the 10+2 system by the Association of Indian Universities (AIU).
- The applicant should have "passed" individually in each subject required (including practicals if any) for calculating merit and eligibility to the course they seek admission in.
- **Applicants with gap year(s) will not be at any disadvantage for the purpose of admission to undergraduate courses.**
- Applicants under the UR/SC/ST/OBC/EWS categories are eligible to seek admission based on both merit and entrance tests to courses in all Colleges/ Departments (except Minority Colleges, wherein some categories may not be applicable).

For Equivalence Criteria, Grade Conversion, IB students, University of Cambridge students refer to University Admission Bulletin (2020-21), section 9.3 & 9.4

The following categories are designated "**supernumerary**":

- i) PwD (Persons with Disabilities);
- ii) CW (Children/Widows of Personnel of the Armed Forces including Para-Military);
- iii) KM (Kashmiri Migrants);
- iv) Prime Minister's special scholarship for Jammu and Kashmir;
- v) SS (Nominated Sikkimese Students);
- vi) WQ (Ward Quota);
- vii) ECA (Extra-Curricular Activities);
- viii) Sports.

Categories **(i-viii)** above are applicable to courses where admission is based on merit. Only categories **i and ii** above are applicable to courses where admission is based on entrance tests.



Merit-Based Admission to Undergraduate Courses offered by the University

Course-wise Merit List for Merit-based UG Admissions

The suggested course-wise and category-wise merit list published on the University website shall be adhered to by all Colleges/ Departments of University of Delhi. The marks entered by the applicant will serve as the basis for computing the total marks for course-specific combinations of **Best Four** for admission in courses through the faculties of Arts, Commerce, Mathematical Sciences, Music, Social Sciences, Applied Social Sciences & Humanities, and **Three Subjects** for admission in courses under faculties of Sciences and Applied Sciences. This may be displayed on the Admissions portal before the declaration of First Cut-Off marks by the Colleges/Departments. A separate updated merit list will be published as an Annexure for applicants whose marks are updated after the publication of the Suggested Course and Category-wise merit list. In order to facilitate the said Merit List, the applicant may choose subjects as relevant from List A and List B.

Computing Merit Score: General Guidelines

Course specific eligibility criteria determine the merit score on which admission to each course is based. Applicants must study these criteria carefully to understand if they qualify. The detailed course specific criteria are given in subsequent section.

1. All academic subjects may be treated as “elective”. The subjects eligible for computation (subject to course-specific criteria) are listed above in List A and List B.
2. The University may define any other relevant subjects as academic/elective for a particular course.
3. Merit is calculated through course-specific combinations of marks obtained in the qualifying examination in the “**Best Four**” subjects for admission to courses through the faculties of Arts, Commerce, Mathematical Sciences, Music, Social Sciences, Applied Social Sciences & Humanities, and course-specific combinations of “**Three Subjects**” for admission to courses under the faculties of Sciences and Applied Sciences.

For the details and examples of calculation of Best Four/PCM/PCB candidates are advised to refer University Information Bulletin (2020-21) ANNEXURE IX.

Relaxations in Course-specific Eligibility Criteria

- To determine their eligibility and merit, applicants from the SC/ST categories shall be given a relaxation to the extent of 5% in the respective eligibility criteria and merit for admission prescribed for applicants from the UR category. If, after giving 5% relaxation, these reserved seats still remain vacant, further relaxation would be given to the extent required in order to fill all the reserved seats in the course concerned. Eligibility in such cases is pass percentage.
- To determine the eligibility and merit, applicants from the OBC category shall be given a relaxation in the respective eligibility in the qualifying examination to the extent of 10% of the eligibility marks prescribed for applicants from the UR Category. For example, if the minimum eligibility for admission to a course is 40% for the UR Category applicants, the minimum eligibility for the OBC category will be 36% (i.e. 40% minus 10% of 40%).
- Applicants from the PwBD category shall be given a relaxation in the respective eligibility for the course concerned in the qualifying examination to the extent of 5% of the eligibility marks



prescribed for applicants from the UR category. For example, if the minimum eligibility for admission to a course is 40% for the UR Category applicants, the minimum eligibility for the PwBD category will be 38% (i.e. 40% minus 5% of 40%).

- Applicants from the CW category shall be given a relaxation of 5% in the respective eligibility for the course concerned in the qualifying examination. For example, if the minimum eligibility for admission to a course is 40% for the UR category applicants, the minimum eligibility for the CW category will be 38% (i.e. 40% minus 5% of 40%).
- Eligibility criteria for merit-based admissions under the EWS category shall be identical to that of UR category.

Special Instructions for Boards other than CBSE

1. If a paper's title does not match with what is specified in List A and List B above, it is mandatory for the applicant to provide a content equivalence certificate from the Principal/Head of the Institution last attended, certifying that the paper's content is equivalent to NCERT Class XII syllabus for that paper. This equivalence certificate must be accompanied by a copy of the syllabus of the paper attested by the Principal/Head of the Institution. However, the University of Delhi's decision on the matter will be final and binding.
2. If the applicant has studied "Botany" and "Zoology" separately, the total of marks in both these papers must be entered in the respective fields for theory and practicals under the heading "Biology" in the field provided in your admission form.
3. If the applicant's marksheets contain both Class XI and XII marks, the applicant must enter only the Class XII marks in the respective fields provided in the admission forms.
4. Applicants should have passed theory and practical separately. Any paper with both theory and practical component will be considered only in the ratio 70 (theory) : 30 (practical) if the theory component of the paper is less than 70%. The applicant should separately fill into the online Admission Form the marks obtained and maximum marks for theory and practical each, and the totals, as per their marksheet. In case the theory/practical breakup is not specified, the applicant will be required to enter only their total marks in the first field ("Theory") for that paper in the online Registration form.
5. "Internal Assessment" marks mentioned in the marksheet will not be used for any calculations.
6. Any discrepancy in the entry of marks pertaining to theory, practicals or totals will be the sole responsibility of the applicant. Your application form may be summarily rejected.



Eligibility criteria for U.G. Admission 2020-21

ADMISSION STEPS

Step I: Registration on the UG portal

The applicant uses the University UG Admissions portal to create their personal username and password, fills in their registration form, chooses their courses of interest, and upload the required documents. Much of the information entered by the applicants into the form will not be possible to edit and correct after submission of the form.

- All the candidates seeking admission to the Undergraduate (UG) courses are required to register online.
- The applicants needs to keep this e-mail ID handy because it will be required to access his / her account on the portal as well as for all the future correspondence throughout the admission process.
- The default settings allow all applicants to register for all courses (without any penalties). The applicants will be eligible to take admission in all the colleges and courses, provided they satisfy the cut-off of the colleges and the eligibility for the selected courses.
- If applicants have examination results pending or have reappeared in papers, they will be able to update their marks by logging into their Dashboards till the last date of admissions in the University.
- Utmost care must be exercised in uploading the documents. Applicants will need scanned copies of the following certificates on the basis of which they wish to claim admission
 - (a) Class X certificate
 - (b) Class XII certificate
 - (c) Relevant reservation certificate issued by competent authority
 - (d) Self attested copies of requisite certificates for admission under sports/ ECA category
 - (e) Link of the uploaded clip for admission against music
 - (f) Photo identity card (Aadhar Card, Driving License, PAN Card, Voter Identity Card, Passport or School Identity Card)
- Applicants will be responsible for all information they upload including copies of certificates. They will also be responsible for the quality and authenticity of the files they upload. The applicants will be able to see the preview of their form and the uploaded documents. The applicants are advised to take all care to avoid rejection on this basis during the admission process.

Step II: Payment of the registration fees

The application form will be deemed submitted only when the applicant has paid the relevant registration fee. This fee must be paid only through the link provided through the applicant's Dashboard. There is no method available to applicants other than this online link generated for payment of the registration fee. When the applicant has successfully submitted the registration fee online, they are advised to keep records of the payment's transaction ID, Credit Card/ Debit card/ Net-banking details and date of transaction as proof for future reference. Further, the applicants are advised to complete the process well before the deadline in order to avoid any last minute glitches.



Step III: Reopening of the portal

The applicant will be allowed to update the marks and make minor corrections in the form during this window provided to them. This will only be a onetime process.

Step IV: Declaration of Cut-off

The University shall declare a minimum of five Cut-Offs. In case, there are still some vacant seats left, further Cut-Offs may be announced by the University. If needed, the University may also conduct special drive in order to fill vacant seats against reserved category. In case of vacant seats left after the first five Cut-Offs, there will be a special Cut-Off only for those candidates who could not/ did not take admission in the initial five Cut-Offs for whatsoever reasons.

Special Cut-Off

1. The cut-off for the Special Cut-Off admissions will be the last cut-off declared by the college for a particular course. That is, if a college had declared 3rd cut-off for a particular course and no further cut-off was declared thereafter, and there are vacant seats after the University has completed the 5th round of cut-off, the Special Cut-Off for this particular course of the College will be that as declared in the 3rd cut-off.
2. The colleges will declare the number of seats left vacant in each course after the 5th Cut-Off.
3. There will be no movement allowed during this Special Cut-Off.
4. The applicant gives his/ her preferences of the available course (A) and available colleges (B).
5. The allotments to the course and the colleges, only for the Special Cut-Off, will be made centrally using the formula (min A + min B) where A is the preference to a course and B the preference to a college, B will be dependent on A.

Step V: Selection of Course and College

Upon declaration of the nth Cut-Off list, applicants must log in to their Dashboards on the UG admission portal to choose the course and college they wish to claim admission 'in' from the list of colleges and courses they are eligible for. At a time, during a cut-off list, the applicant is allowed to choose only one course and one college. Multiple simultaneous admissions are not permitted.

- i. Please note selection of applicant's college and course can be made only online through their own Dashboard on the UG admissions portal. There will be no physical visit to the colleges at this point in the process.
- ii. The procedure for choosing the course and the college by the applicant must be completed within the stipulated time interval.
- iii. **Within a 'cut-off' the applicant will not be allowed to change his/ her choice of course and college.**

Step VI: Online verification of documents by respective colleges

The College shall verify the documents uploaded by the applicant for eligibility and meeting the required Cut - Off.

- i. Course in-charge to verify the minimum qualifications and cut-off requirement, else to decline.



- ii. Convenor admission to recheck and approve the admission or decline.
- iii. Principal to approve admission for cases approved in (ii) and to confirm declining admission for those declined by the Convenor.
- iv. In case of lack of necessary documents, candidate to be contacted on email/phone so that the same may be provided. In case the candidate does not respond, or where documents remain insufficient, the admission to be declined citing reason. No application will be left undecided. It will either be approved or declined.
- v. The applicant to be communicated the status of the application on their dashboard.
- vi. Those approved are required to pay the fee and receive a confirmation of their admission. Those declined admission are provided a link to raise any objection with the Grievance Committee.

Step VII: Payment of fees to confirm admission

Once the Principal of the College has approved their admission, the applicants will receive a link on their Dashboard on the UG Admissions portal through which they must submit the collegecourse fees due. This fee can only be paid online through the portal.

- i. The applicant is advised to pay the fee without delay within 24 hours of the approval of admission by the Principal of the College, and save the acknowledgement slip bearing transaction ID, Credit Card/ Debit card/Netbanking details and date of transaction as a proof for future reference. On successful payment of fees, the applicant is granted provisional admission to the said college.
- ii. It is extremely important that applicants pay the fee within the timeframe allocated, failing which it will be concluded that the applicant is not interested in the course of study at that college, and the admission will be automatically cancelled.
- iii. Once the applicant has gained admission, they will have to sign an online declaration stating, "All the information provided by me are correct. In case any information provided by me is found to be false and/or is not supported by the documents presented by me, I understand that the admission will be immediately cancelled and no fees will be refunded. I shall abide by all the rules and regulations laid down by the University and the College."

Step VIII: Physical verification of the original documents

The uploaded documents will be verified by the respective colleges within the stipulated time period. If at this stage it is found that the information given by the applicants is false and/or is not supported by the documents presented, the admission will be immediately cancelled. No fees will be refunded in such cases.

Process for change of Course/College in subsequent Cut-Offs

If, in subsequent lists, the applicants find themselves eligible for admission to any other colleges/courses, they should ensure their eligibility by carefully examining the eligibility requirements of the Course/College/ Department.

- i. Applicants are advised to exercise extreme care to ensure that they meet the requirements for the Course/College. Once they are certain they wish to cancel admission in the course/college they initially had gained admission to in the previous list, the applicant must log in to the UG Admissions portal to cancel their admission through their Dashboard.



- ii. A cancellation fee will be levied, and they may now choose a new combination of course and college, subject to eligibility and meeting course-specific requirements. Once again, the applicant must complete steps V-VIII.
- iii. Only one cancellation is allowed per Cut-off list. Cancellation for readmission in another merit-based college/course will not be possible in the first Cut-off list. Such cancellations wherein the applicant seeks readmission in another merit-based college/course, option may be attempted only in subsequent list onwards. Within a cut-off the applicant will not be allowed to change his/ her choice of course and college. The total number of cancellations will be restricted to $(n-1)$ where "n" is the total number of Cut-off Lists.
- iv. Once an applicants has cancelled his/her admission, he/she cannot be re-admitted to that course/college automatically, and must undergo the admission process anew, subject to availability of seats and the applicant meeting course-specific eligibility requirements.
- v. When the applicant cancels their previous admission in the subsequent Cut-Off List, the refunded fee amount will be visible in the "Wallet" section of the Dashboard. A cancellation fee of Rs. 1,000 (Rupees One thousand only) will be deducted and this will be reflected in the refunded amount visible in the "Wallet".
- vi. Through the Dashboard after the subsequent admission is approved, the admission fee will be adjusted automatically and the applicant will have to pay only the balance fee if it is more than the fees already paid at the previous college. If the fee in the latter college is less, the balance will be refunded to the applicant's account or to an account declared by the applicant as per the College/University rules after the admissions are closed.

In case of any change in the admission process for Merit-based UG admission, it will be notified on the website of the University of Delhi. All aspirants must register online as per the procedure and schedule notified on the University of Delhi website (www.du.ac.in).



RESERVATIONS

The merit list for the unreserved category (UR) seats will comprise all the applicants in order of merit. No one will be excluded from the same. In other words, the merit list will also include SC/ST/OBC /EWS applicants, irrespective of category, if they meet the criterion of merit for UR category. Such an applicant is entitled to be considered under the UR category, as well as under the reserved category. Admission to UR category seats will be strictly in order of merit without excluding SC/ST/OBC/EWS applicants.

Applicants seeking admission under SC/ST/OBC/EWS category will have to 'produce for verification' certificates in their own names.

Reservation of Seats for Scheduled Caste (SC) and Scheduled Tribe (ST) applicants

- 22½% of the total numbers of seats is reserved for applicants belonging to Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribes (15% for Scheduled Caste and 7½% for Scheduled Tribes, interchangeable if necessary).
- Relaxation to the extent of 5% in the minimum marks shall be given to the applicants belonging to SC and ST to determine their eligibility and merit for admission to the course concerned.
- In case, after giving 5% relaxation, the reserved seats still remain vacant, further relaxation would be given to the extent required in order to fill all the reserved seats. (AC Resolution A88, 14.6.1983) (EC Resolution 157, 24.12.2001). **It is obligatory for all Colleges/Departments to fill all the seats reserved for SC/ST applicants. Eligibility in these cases is pass percentage.**

Reservation of Seats for Other Backward Classes (OBC, Non-Creamy Layer, Central List)

- 27% seats will be reserved for the applicants belonging to Other Backward Classes (OBC) **(Non-Creamy Layer, Central List)**.
- The certificate must mention non-creamy layer status of the applicant (Non-creamy layer status issued by an authority mentioned in DoPT Office Memorandum no. 36012/22/93-Estt. (SCT) dated 15.11.1993).
- The OBC applicants who belong to the 'Non-Creamy Layer' and whose caste appears in the Central List of the OBCs only, shall be eligible to be considered for admission under the OBC category (Validity period of OBC certificate in respect of 'non-creamy layer' status of the applicants as per DoPT Office Memorandum No. 36036/2/2013-Estt. (Res-I) dated 31 March 2016). The validity of the non-creamy layer certificate shall be for the financial year 2019-2020, issued after 31st March, 2020.
- The OBC applicants shall be given a relaxation of 10% in the minimum eligibility marks of the said course and for the admission entrance test a relaxation of 10% of the minimum eligibility marks prescribed for General/UR Category applicants.

It is a statutory obligation on the part of Colleges to fill all the seats reserved for OBC applicants.



Reservation policy for Economically Weaker Sections (EWS)

As per the University of Delhi notifications, Reference No. Aca. I / Reservation of EWSs / 2019 / 63 Dated 28th March 2019 and Reference No. Aca. I / Reservation of EWSs / 2019 / 101 Dated 15th May 2019, for the reservation for Economically Weaker Sections (EWSs) Category, the University Departments/Centres/Colleges have reserved 10% seats for admission for the same in the Academic Year, 2020-21. The eligibility of such applicants will be decided on the basis of fulfilling criteria prescribed in the above notifications, and subject to submission of documents, issued by the competent authority, in the format provided in Appendix V of University UG admission Bulletin. For further details, applicants can visit: <http://www.du.ac.in/du/uploads/Notifications/04042019-Notification-EWS.pdf>.

Reservation of Seats for Persons with Disabilities (PwBD)

As per the provisions of Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016, not less than five percent (5%) seats are reserved for Persons with Benchmark Disabilities. "Person with benchmark disability" means a person with not less than forty percent (40%) of a specified disability where specified disability has not been defined in measurable terms and includes a person with disability where specified disability has been defined in measurable terms, as certified by the certifying authority. It may be noted that the erstwhile Persons with Disability Act, 1995, under which reservation for Persons with Disabilities in admissions was provided earlier has now been repealed. PwD applicants shall be given a relaxation in the course-specific eligibility in the qualifying examination and in the admission entrance test to the extent of 5%, till seats are filled.

Note: For further details and concession/waiver of fees in respect to PwD candidates refer section 5 of University UG admission bulletin (2020-21).

Applicants must furnish a valid disability certificate issued by a recognized Government hospital, bearing a photograph of the applicant.

Reservation for Children/Widows of Personnel of the Armed Forces (CW)

Five percent (5%) of seats are reserved for applicants under this category, course-wise in all colleges. All such applicants have to upload the Educational Concession Certificate (as per the format provided in Appendix VII) issued by the authorities on the proper letterhead as given in the UG admission guidelines (2020-21).

Reservation of Kashmiri Migrants (KM) (Supernumerary Seats)

1. All the wards (sons/daughters) of Kashmiri Migrants who wish to be considered for admission to various undergraduate courses of the University have to register online as per the schedule notified by the University.
2. Up to 5% seats are reserved course-wise in all colleges for the wards of Kashmiri Migrants.
3. Admission of Wards of Kashmiri Migrants will be based on cut-offs to be announced by the Colleges. A concession of maximum 10% in the last cut-off marks fixed for unreserved category applicants shall be extended to the Kashmiri Migrants.

**Prime Minister's Special Scholarship Scheme for J&K students**

The applicants selected under Prime Minister's special scholarship scheme for J&K students will be admitted directly to the Colleges.

Seats for Ward Quota

Admission to wards (children) of the permanent in-service employees at the college where employees are working be given on the basis of merit among such applicants subject to ordinarily one seat for every unit of up to sixty students in a course and subject to fulfilment of course-specific eligibility conditions.

Extra-curricular and Sports Quota (Supernumerary Seats)

Due to the unprecedented situation of COVID-19 pandemic and prevailing public health guidelines, admissions under ECA and sports will be done based on the Merit/Participation certificates of the applicants uploaded during registration process. स्नातक पाठ्यक्रमों में प्रवेश 2020-21

सभी आवेदकों को दिल्ली विश्वविद्यालय के ऑनलाइन प्रवेश पोर्टल <https://ug.du.ac.in> के माध्यम से पंजीकरण कराना होगा । वर्ष 2020-21 के लिए सभी स्नातक प्रवेश केवल इस पोर्टल के माध्यम से ही दिए जाएँगे ।

स्नातक पाठ्यक्रमों के लिए पात्रता मानदंड

- आवेदक का भारत का नागरिक होना अनिवार्य है । (विदेशी छात्रों की श्रेणी के अंतर्गत प्रवेश के इच्छुक आवेदक विदेशी छात्रों के पंजीकरण वेबसाइट <http://fsr.du.ac.in> पर अलग से आवेदन करें)
- आवेदक को भारत में या विदेश में एसोसिएशन ऑफ इंडियन यूनिवर्सिटीज (एआईयू) द्वारा 10+2 प्रणाली के समकक्ष मान्यता प्राप्त किसी भी बोर्ड / विश्वविद्यालय की कक्षा 12^{वीं} की परीक्षा उत्तीर्ण होना आवश्यक है ।
- पाठ्यक्रम में प्रवेश के लिए आवेदक को योग्यता और पात्रता की गणना के लिए आवश्यक प्रत्येक विषय में अलग-अलग "उत्तीर्ण" होना अनिवार्य है (प्रायोगिक परीक्षा यदि कोई हो तो) ।
- स्नातक पाठ्यक्रमों में प्रवेश के उद्देश्य से अंतर वर्ष वाले आवेदकों को कोई नुकसान नहीं होगा ।
- अनारक्षित / अजा / अजजा / अपिव / ईडब्ल्यूएस श्रेणियों के अंतर्गत आवेदक सभी महाविद्यालयों / विभागों के पाठ्यक्रमों (अल्पसंख्यकों के महाविद्यालयों को छोड़कर, जहां कुछ श्रेणियाँ लागू नहीं भी हो सकती हैं) में योग्यता और प्रवेश परीक्षा दोनों के आधार पर प्रवेश पाने के लिए पात्र हैं ।

सीटों का आरक्षण

अनारक्षित श्रेणी (यूआर) स्थानों के लिए सभी आवेदक योग्यता सूची में योग्यता के क्रम में शामिल होंगे। दूसरे शब्दों में, योग्यता सूची में अनुसूचित जाति/अनुसूचित जनजाति/अन्य पिछड़ा वर्ग/ईडब्ल्यूएस आवेदक भी शामिल होंगे, भले ही वे श्रेणी के मापदंड के अनुसार अनारक्षित श्रेणी के हों।

अजा/अजजा/अपिव/ईडब्ल्यूएस श्रेणी के अंतर्गत प्रवेश पानेवाले आवेदकों को अपने नाम से सत्यापन प्रमाण-पत्र प्रस्तुत करना होगा।

- **अनुसूचित जाति (एससी)/अनुसूचित जनजाति (एसटी) आवेदकों के लिए आरक्षण**
- कुल स्थानों में से 22.5% स्थान अनुसूचित जाति और अनुसूचित जनजाति के लिए आरक्षित है। (अनुसूचित जाति के लिए 15% और अनुसूचित जनजाति के लिए 7.5%, आवश्यकता पड़ने पर अंतरपरिवर्तनीय)।
- जहाँ कहीं लागू हो वहाँ पाठ्यक्रम में प्रवेश के लिए न्यूनतम अंतिम स्थिति और योग्यता निर्धारित करने के प्रयोजनार्थ एससी/एसटी से संबंधित आवेदकों को न्यूनतम 5% अंकों की छूट दी जाएगी।
- यदि 5% छूट देने के बावजूद आरक्षित स्थान फिर भी खाली रहती है तो सभी आरक्षित स्थान को भरने हेतु अपेक्षित सीमा तक और छूट दी जाएगी (एससी संकल्प क 88, 14-06-1983, ईसी संकल्प 157, 24-12-2001)
- महाविद्यालयों/विभागों का यह संविधिक दायित्व है कि वे अ.जा. (अनुसूचित जाति)/अ. जनजाति (अनुसूचित जनजाति) आवेदकों के लिए आरक्षित सभी स्थानों को भरें। इन मामलों में न्यूनतम पात्रता उत्तीर्णता मात्र है।

अन्य पिछड़ा वर्ग के लिए स्थानों का आरक्षण

- 27% सीट उन ओबीसी (अन्य पिछड़ा वर्ग) आवेदकों के लिए आरक्षित है जो क्रीमी-लेयर से सम्बन्धित नहीं है और जिनकी जाति ओबीसी की केन्द्रीय सूची में आती है। केन्द्रीय सूची <http://ncbc.nic.in/backwardclasses/index.html> पर उपलब्ध है।
- ओबीसी प्रमाणपत्र में स्पष्ट रूप से आवेदक की नॉन-क्रीमी लेयर की स्थिति का उल्लेख होना चाहिए। आवेदक को उसकी नॉन-क्रीमी लेयर (गैर क्रीमी स्थिति) सुनिश्चित करने के लिए परिवार की आय का नवीनतम आय प्रमाण पत्र (वित्तीय वर्ष 2020-21) लाने की आवश्यकता है। नॉन-क्रीमी लेयर प्रमाणपत्र की वैधता वित्तीय वर्ष मार्च 2020-21 के लिए होगी जो 31 मार्च 2020 के बाद जारी किया गया हो।
- ओबीसी आवेदकों को सामान्य/अनारक्षित श्रेणी के आवेदकों के लिए निर्धारित न्यूनतम पात्रता अंकों के 10% तक छूट दी जाएगी। उदाहरण के लिए, यदि पाठ्यक्रम में प्रवेश की न्यूनतम योग्यता सामान्य श्रेणी के आवेदकों के लिए 50% है तो ओबीसी के लिए 45% होगी (50% का 10% कम अर्थात् 5% कम)। **ओबीसी आवेदकों के लिए आरक्षित सभी स्थानों को भरना महाविद्यालयों का एक वैधानिक दायित्व है।**

आर्थिक रूप से कमजोर वर्ग (ईडब्ल्यूएस) के आवेदकों के लिए आरक्षण

- दिव्यांग व्यक्तियों के अधिकारों के प्रावधान से संबंधित अधिनियम 2016 के अनुसार 5% (इससे कम नहीं) सीटें दिव्यांगता के मापदण्ड अर्थात् **Benchmark Disability** वाले अभ्यर्थियों के लिए आरक्षित हैं। बेंचमार्क विकलांगता का अर्थ है- व्यक्ति की निर्दिष्ट विकलांगता 40% से कम न हो।

सशस्त्र बलों (सीडबल्यू) आरक्षण के कार्मिकों के बच्चों / पत्नियों लिए आरक्षण (सुपन्यूरररि / अतिरिक्त सीटें)–

- दिल्ली विश्वविद्यालय के विभिन्न स्नातक कार्यक्रमों के लिए सभी आवेदकों को विश्वविद्यालय द्वारा अधिसूचित अनुसूची के अनुसार ऑनलाइन आवेदन करना होगा।
- सभी महाविद्यालयों में 5% सीटें सीडबल्यू श्रेणी के आवेदकों के लिए आरक्षित हैं। (विवरण के लिए विश्वविद्यालय बुलेटिन देखें)

कश्मीरी प्रवासियों के लिए आरक्षण व्यवस्था (अतिरिक्त सीटें)–

CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (CBCS)

Some of the guidelines of CBCS are as follows

1. One credit is equivalent to one hour of teaching (Lecture/Tutorial) or two hours of practical work or field work per week.
2. The examination scheme as approved by the Academic Council and Executive Council for the Undergraduate Course under CBCS by amending Ordinance VIII (2) and Ordinance IX will be as per Annexure (2) of the University of Delhi.
3. Student admitted in a particular department can opt for Generic Elective Courses offered by the other departments, for example, a student admitted under B.A. (H) History programme cannot opt for Generic Elective Courses offered by Department of History.
4. The student of B. Sc. (H) Botany & B. Sc. (H) Zoology must opt one or two Generic Elective papers offered by Department of Chemistry so that their eligibility for admission in P.G. Courses in various Institutions is not hampered.
5. Similarly, students admitted under B. Sc. (Prog) and willing to pursue Post-graduation in Physics/Chemistry/Electronics must opt a paper of Mathematics as Generic Elective, if Mathematics is not one of the Core Discipline being studied.
6. The Students of B. Sc. (H)/B.A. (H)/B.Com. (H) in order to be eligible for Post graduate in another discipline may opt for the Generic Elective of a particular subject in each semester to earn 24 credits in the concerned discipline.
7. The core papers of English/Hindi/MIL as part of two languages required to be studied is different from the courses of English/Hindi/MIL under Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC)

AECC: AECC is compulsory for all students in Semester I and II under CBCS. Environmental Science is compulsory in one semester. For another semester you can choose any one out of English/Hindi/MIL Communications (Bengali/Punjabi/Sanskrit/Sindhi).

DSE: Discipline Specific Elective to be from the same discipline studied as Discipline 1 and 2.

GE: Generic Elective is an interdisciplinary paper which is chosen from discipline other than Discipline 1 and 2.

SEC: Under this course different papers are offered based upon value/skill based subjects. SEC is related to the same discipline opted as Discipline 1 and 2.

Important Points to B.A. (Prog) Aspirants:

- Each student will have to study minimum 4 papers in each semester.
- Each student will have to choose 2 Discipline papers from set of combination offered by college. Seats are limited for each combination. Discipline papers cannot be changed during the course of three years.
- Language paper: Each student will have to study 2 languages (2 paper each) during semester I-IV.
 - Language 1: English (Compulsory)
 - Language 2: Any one of the following: Hindi/MIL (Bengali/Punjabi/Sanskrit/Sindhi)
- Those opting Bengali/Punjabi should have studied Bengali/Punjabi at least till class X.
- For Sindhi students who have not studied Sindhi should be from Sindhi Family (Either or both parents should be of Sindhi background).
- Students who have studied English/Hindi/Sanskrit up to class XII or X or VIII will do stream A, stream B and stream C respectively.
- For language paper of English/Hindi/MIL, the students of North East and Foreign Nationals may opt for Political Science/Philosophy/History/ Economics in lieu of MIL.

हिंदी (ऑनर्स) पाठ्यक्रम के अन्तर्गत समय की मांग के अनुसार पिछले कुछ वर्षों में व्यापक परिवर्तन किए गये हैं। बदले समय में वैश्विक परिदृश्य में नयी चुनौतियाँ उभरी हैं। उनसे जूझने और तारतम्य स्थापित करने में यह पाठ्यक्रम विद्यार्थियों को तैयार करता है। अब उसमें साहित्य की विविध विधाओं के अतिरिक्त ऐसे विषयों का भी समावेश किया गया है जिनसे विद्यार्थियों को रोजगार के बेहतर विकल्प उपलब्ध हो सकें। जैसे – पत्रकारिता और मीडिया लेखन, विज्ञापन लेखन, हिंदी सिनेमा, रंगमंच, भाषा, विज्ञान आदि। इन विषयों के अध्ययन से हिंदी के विद्यार्थियों को सूचना क्रांति के फलस्वरूप उत्पन्न हुए अवसरों से लाभान्वित होने का मौका मिलता है। विविध क्षेत्रों में हिंदी का प्रयोग बढ़ने से यह पाठ्यक्रम अधिक प्रासंगिक और उपादेय हो चला है। देशबंधु महाविद्यालय का हिंदी विभाग छात्र-छात्राओं में साहित्य की रचनात्मकता के साथ-साथ आलोचनात्मक अंतर्दृष्टि भी विकसित करता है। छात्र-छात्राओं में आत्मविश्वास जगाकर उन्हें सक्षम बनाना विभाग की प्राथमिकता है ताकि स्नातक की उपाधि प्राप्त करने के पश्चात् वे किसी भी चुनौती को स्वीकार करने में समर्थ हों। विभाग प्रतिवर्ष "साहित्यिक अंत्याक्षरी प्रतियोगिता" और "विनीता अग्रवाल स्मृति रचना-पाठ" जैसे कई कार्यक्रम और व्याख्यान आयोजित करता है, जिससे विद्यार्थियों को विभिन्न साहित्यकारों के प्रत्यक्ष सम्पर्क से लाभान्वित होने का अवसर मिलता है।

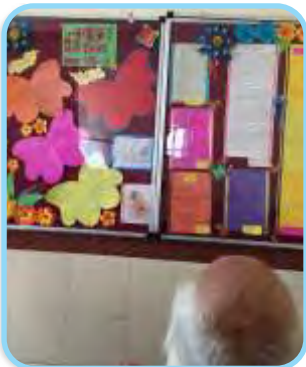

देशबंधु कॉलेज का हिंदी विभाग कई सर्वेक्षणों में देश के सर्वश्रेष्ठ हिंदी विभागों में गिना जाता रहा है।

सत्र 2020-21 के दौरान विभाग के उत्साही विद्यार्थियों ने कॉलेज की रचनात्मक प्रतिभा को प्रोत्साहन देने के उद्देश्य से 'नवांकुर' नाम से भित्ति पत्रिका की भी शुरुआत कर दी है।

1. An application for obtaining Information under the Right to Information Act, 2005 is required to be made to the Public Information Officer.

ACADEMIC REQUIREMENT

ATTENDANCE RULES

The students of the College are governed by the rules and regulations of the University of Delhi as laid down in Ordinance VII of the University Calendar. The students are required to attend all lectures, tutorials and practicals regularly. The candidates should have attended not less than two-thirds of lectures (including tutorials) and practicals separately i.e. 66.66% separately, delivered in the college for the course of study in each semester. **66.66% attendance is compulsory for students to appear in the University of Delhi semester examination.** Students selected/deputed to participate in annual NCC camp or NSS assignments or inter-college/ National/International sports or extra-curricular activities approved by the Principal may be **condoned up to a maximum of one third lectures and practicals held.**

In case of illness the leave application must be accompanied by a medical certificate and fitness certificate which should be submitted to the college office after getting the signature of the teachers concerned. The Principal may consider exceptionally hard case of students illness, whether the lectures etc. delivered during the period of illness could be excluded for purpose of calculation of attendance and each case shall be decided on its own merit.

INTERNAL ASSESSMENT SCHEME

As per the decision of University of Delhi, 25% of the total marks in each paper will be allotted for the Internal Assessment as per Ordinance-VIII-E of the University Calendar. Following is the distribution of Internal Assessment marks:

Activity	Weightage
Attendance (Lectures including tutorials)	5%
Written Assignment/Tutorial/Project work/Seminars	10%
Class Test/Quiz	10%

5% weightage to be given for regularity in attendance including lectures and tutorials. The credit for attendance in each paper will be as follows:

More than 67 % but less than 70 %	1 Mark
70 % or more but less than 75 %	2 Marks
75 % or more but less than 80 %	3 Marks
80 % or more but less than 85%	4 Marks
85 % and above	5 Marks

At the end of the semester, the attendance of every student in each paper in lectures and tutorials will be summed up, converted into percentage, and marks will be awarded for Internal Assessment by the teacher. With the introduction of Internal Assessment, the maximum marks for the University Examination in each paper shall stand reduced accordingly. For Example:

- For a 100 marks paper, the University Examination shall be of 75 marks.
- For a 75 marks paper, the University Examination shall be of 55 marks.
- For a 50 marks paper, the University Examination shall be of 38 marks.
- For a 53 marks paper, the University Examination shall be of 25 marks.



In the case of a student who is selected as a member of the NCC to participate in the annual NCC Camps or is deputed to undertake Civil Defence work and allied duties, or in the case of a student who is enrolled in the National Service Scheme and is deputed to various public assignment by or with the approval of the Head of the institution concerned, or a student who is selected to participate in sports or other activities organized by the Inter-University Board or is selected to participate in sports or other activities organized by the Vice-Chancellor, or a student who is required to represent the University at the Inter University Youth Festival, or a student who is required to participate in periodical training in the Territorial Army, or a student who is deputed by the College to take part in Inter-College sports, fixtures, debates, seminars, symposia social work projects, or a student who is required to represent the College concerned in debates and other extra-curricular activities held in other Universities or such other activities approved by the Vice-Chancellor, the following provision will apply:

- i. A student in the categories listed above, will have to fulfill the requirement of written assignments and projects/term papers/seminars/field-work with the flexibility, however that she/he may, if necessary, be allowed additional time for submission of written assignments.
- ii. A student in the categories listed above, will get the benefit of attendance for Internal Assessment for the classes missed as per the existing provisions of Ordinance VII.2 (9) (a) (i).

The University reserves the right to review, and if necessary to moderate the marks in any paper/papers in any College/Department.

- **Duration of medical certificates shall be excluded while calculating credit towards marks to be awarded for regularity, though such certificates shall continue to be taken into account for the purpose of calculating eligibility to appear for examinations as per the existing provisions of Ordinance VII.2.9.(a)(ii).**
- **The benefit of exclusion of lectures in either case stated above, either separately or jointly, shall in no case exceed 1/3 of the total number of lectures delivered.**
- **Deshbandhu College requires that a valid medical fitness certificate be submitted within one week of resuming classes.**

UNIVERSITY EXAMINATION AND PROMOTIONS

The University examination schedule and rules of promotions and reappearance in examination as prescribed by the University of Delhi will be applicable. Students are advised to visit www.du.ac.in for detailed guidelines and rules.



FINANCIAL AID

- a) The college grants fee concession to a maximum of 20% of the total number of students on its rolls every year.
- b) Fee concession is awarded to deserving students who apply on a prescribed form available in the college office.
- c) Information regarding freeships granted by State Government are put on the notice board from time to time.
- d) Under the National Loan Scholarship Scheme, those students who have obtained a first division (60% marks or more) in their last examination can apply for a loan scholarship through the college.
- e) In addition, the college has a Financial Assistance Fund with the objective of extending financial assistance to needy students.

RELEVANT ORDINANCES

ORDINANCE XV-B

Maintenance of discipline among Students of the University

1. All powers relating to discipline and disciplinary action are vested in the Vice - Chancellor.
2. The Vice-Chancellor may delegate all or such powers as he/she deems proper to the Proctor and to such other persons as he/she may specify in this behalf.
3. Without prejudice to the generality of power to enforce discipline under the Ordinance the following shall amount to acts of gross indiscipline:
 - a. Physical assault or threat to use physical force, against any member of the teaching and nonteaching staff of any Institution/Department and against any student within the University of Delhi
 - b. Carrying of, use of or threat to use of any weapons.
 - c. Any violation of the provisions of the Civil Rights Protection Act, 1976
 - d. Violation of the status, dignity and honour of students belonging to the scheduled castes and tribes.
 - e. Any practice-whether verbal or otherwise-derogatory of women.
 - f. Any attempt at bribing or corruption in any manner.
 - g. Wilful destruction of institutional property.
 - h. Creating ill-will or intolerance on religious or communal grounds.
 - i. Causing disruption in any manner of the academic functioning of the University system.
 - j. Prohibition of Ragging as per Ordinance XV-C.
4. Without prejudice to the generality of his/her powers relating to the maintenance of discipline and taking such action in the interest of maintaining discipline as may seem to him/her appropriate, the Vice-Chancellor, May in the exercise of his/her powers aforesaid order, or direct that any student or students -
 - a. be expelled; or
 - b. be, for a stated period rusticated; or
 - c. be not for a stated period, admitted to a programme or programmes of study in a College, Department or Institution of the University; or
 - d. be fined with a sum of rupees that may be specified; or
 - e. be debarred from taking a University or College or Departmental Examination or Examinations for one or more years; or that the result of the student or students concerned in the Examination or Examinations in which he/she or they have appeared be cancelled.
5. Institutions, Halls and teaching in the concerned Departments. They may exercise their authority through, or delegate authority to such of the teachers in their Colleges, Institutions or Departments as they may specify for these purposes. University of Delhi Bulletin of Information 636. Without prejudice to the powers of the Vice-Chancellor and the Proctor as aforesaid, detailed rules of discipline and proper conduct shall be framed. These rules may be supplemented, where necessary, by the Principals of Colleges, Heads of Halls, Deans of Faculties and Heads of Teaching Departments in this University. Each student shall be expected to provide himself/herself with a



copy of these rules. At the time of admission, every student shall be required to sign a declaration that on admission he/she submits himself/herself to the disciplinary jurisdiction of the Vice Chancellor and several authorities of the University who may be vested with the authority to exercise discipline under the Acts, the Statutes, the Ordinances and the rules that have been framed therein by the University.

6. Without prejudice to the powers of the Vice - Chancellor and the Proctor as aforesaid, detailed rules of discipline and proper conduct shall be framed. These rules may be supplemented, where necessary, by the Principals of Colleges, Heads of Halls, Deans of Faculties and Heads of Teaching Departments in this University. Each student shall be expected to provide himself/herself with a copy of these rules. At the time of admission, every student shall be required to sign a declaration that on admission he/she submits himself/herself to the disciplinary jurisdiction of the Vice - Chancellor and several authorities of the University who may be vested with the authority to exercise discipline under the Acts, the Statutes, the Ordinances and the rules that have been framed therein by the University
7. At the time of admission, every student shall be required to sign a declaration that upon admission he/she submits/herself to the disciplinary jurisdiction of the Vice Chancellor and other authorities of the University who may be vested with the power to exercise discipline under the Acts, Statutes, Ordinances and the rules that have been framed by the University.

ORDINANCE XV-C

Prohibition and Punishment for Ragging

1. Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited, within the premises of College/Department or Institution and any part of Delhi University system as well as on public transport
2. Any individual or collective act or practice of ragging constitutes gross indiscipline and shall be dealt with under this Ordinance.
3. Ragging for the purposes of this Ordinance, ordinarily means any act, conduct or practice by which dominant power or status of senior students is brought to bear on students freshly enrolled or students who are in any way considered junior or inferior by other students; and includes individual or collective acts or practices which
 - a. Involve physical assault or threat to use of physical force.
 - b. Violate the status, dignity and honour of women students.
 - c. Violate the status, dignity and honour of students belonging to the scheduled caste and tribe.
 - d. Expose students to ridicule and contempt and affect their self-esteem.
 - e. Entail verbal abuse and aggression, indecent gestures and obscene behaviour.
4. The Principal of a College, the Head of the Department or an Institution, the authorities of College, or University Hostel or Halls of Residence shall take immediate action on any information of the occurrence of ragging.
5. Notwithstanding anything in Clause (4) above, the Proctor may also Suo moto enquire into any incident of ragging and make a report to the Vice-Chancellor of the identity of those who have engaged in ragging and the nature of the incident.
6. The Proctor may also submit an initial report establishing the identity of the perpetrators of ragging and the nature of the ragging incident.
7. If the Principal of a College or Head of the Department or Institution or the Proctor is satisfied that for some reason, to be recorded in writing, it is not reasonably practical to hold such an enquiry, he/she may so advise the Vice-Chancellor accordingly.



8. When the Vice-Chancellor is satisfied that it is not expedient to hold such an enquiry, his/her decision shall be final.
9. On the receipt of a report under Clause (5) or (6) or a determination by the relevant authority under clause (7) disclosing the occurrence of ragging incidents described in Clause 3(a), (b) and (c) the Vice-Chancellor shall direct or order rustication of a student or students for a specific number of years.
10. The Vice-chancellor may in other cases of ragging order or direct that any student or students be expelled or be not for a stated period, admitted to a programme of study in a college, departmental examination for one or more years or that the results of the student or students concerned in the examination or examinations in which they appeared be cancelled.
11. In case any students who have obtained degrees or diplomas of the University of Delhi are found guilty; under this Ordinance, appropriate action will be taken under Statute 15 for withdrawal of degrees or diploma conferred by the University.
12. For the purpose of this Ordinance, abetment to ragging whether by way of any act, practice or incitement of ragging will also amount to ragging.
13. All Institutions within the Delhi University system shall be obligated to carry out instructions/ directions issued under this Ordinance, and to give aid assistance to the Vice-Chancellor to achieve the effective implementation of the Ordinance.

Note: Order of the Vice-Chancellor in pursuance of Ordinance XV-C: Where incident(s) of ragging are reported to the Vice-Chancellor by any authority under this Ordinance, the students(s) involved in ragging, shall be expelled for a specified term, designated in the order. Non-students involved in reports of ragging will be proceeded with under the criminal law of India; they will also be rendered ineligible for a period of five years from seeking enrolment in any of the institutions of the University of Delhi. Students against whom necessary action is taken under this note, will be given post decisional hearing, with strict adherence to the rules of natural justice.

ORDINANCE XV-D

The Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013 (MINISTRY OF LAW AND JUSTICE)

An Act to provide protection against sexual harassment of women at workplace and for the prevention and redressal of complaints of sexual harassment and for matters connected there with incidental thereto.

WHEREAS sexual harassment results in violation of the fundamental rights of a woman to equality under articles 14 and 15 of the Constitution of India and her right to life and to live with dignity under article 21 of the Constitution and right to practice any profession or to carry on any occupation, trade or business which includes a right to a safe environment free from sexual harassment.

AND WHEREAS the protection against sexual harassment and the right to work with dignity are universally recognized human rights by international conventions and instruments such as Convention on the Elimination of all forms of discrimination against Women, which has been ratified on the 25th June 1993 by the Government of India.

AND WHEREAS it is expedient to make provisions for giving effect to the said Convention for protection of women against sexual harassment at workplace.

अध्यादेश

अध्यादेश XV—बी विश्वविद्यालय के विद्यार्थियों में अनुशासन का प्रतिपालन

1. अनुशासन और अनुशासनात्मक कार्यवाही से सम्बन्धित सभी अधिकार कुलपति के अधीन हैं।
2. कुलपति यदि उचित समझे तो कुलानुशासक (प्रॉक्टर) अथवा ऐसे किसी अन्य व्यक्तियों को अपने सभी अथवा कुछ अधिकारों को प्रतिनिधित्व सौंप सकता है।
3. इस अध्यादेश के अंतर्गत अनुशासन लागू करने के लिए शक्ति की व्यापकता का पूर्वाग्रह किए बिना निम्नलिखित कार्य पूर्ण अनुशासनहीनता के अंतर्गत आते हैं :—
 - (क) विश्वविद्यालय के अंतर्गत किसी संस्थान/विभाग के किसी भी शिक्षण अथवा गैर-शिक्षण सदस्यों अथवा विद्यार्थी पर शारीरिक हमला अथवा शारीरिक बल प्रयोग की धमकी देना।
 - (ख) किसी भी तरह का हथियार अपने पास रखना, प्रयोग करना अथवा प्रयोग करने की धमकी देना।
 - (ग) नागरिक अधिकार संरक्षण अधिनियम 1976 के प्रावधानों का कोई उल्लंघन।
 - (घ) अनुसूचित जाति/जनजाति के विद्यार्थियों की प्रतिष्ठा, गरिमा और सम्मान का उल्लंघन।
 - (ङ) मौखिक अथवा अन्य किसी प्रकार से महिलाओं के प्रति अनादरसूचक टिप्पणी करने का प्रयास करना।
 - (च) किसी भी तरह भ्रष्टाचार अथवा रिश्वत लेने-देने का प्रयास।
 - (छ) संस्थागत संपत्ति को जानबूझ कर नष्ट करना।
 - (ज) धार्मिक अथवा सांप्रदायिक आधार पर वैमनस्य अथवा असहिष्णुता का माहौल बनाना।
 - (झ) विश्वविद्यालय की शैक्षणिक कार्यपद्धति में किसी भी प्रकार का अवरोध पैदा करना।
 - (ञ) अध्यादेश XV—सी के अनुसार रैगिंग का निषेध।
4. कुलपति, अनुशासन के प्रतिपालन से सम्बन्धित अपनी शक्ति का बिना किसी पूर्वाग्रह के अनुशासन बनाये रखने के लिए ऐसी कार्यवाही करना जो उन्हें उपयुक्त लगे, वह अपने उपयुक्त अधिकारों का उपयोग करते हुए किसी भी विद्यार्थी अथवा विद्यार्थियों को :—
 - (ए) निष्कासित कर सकता है, अथवा
 - (बी) किसी निश्चित अवधि के लिए निष्कासित कर सकता है, अथवा
 - (सी) किसी निश्चित अवधि के लिए विद्यार्थी को किसी महाविद्यालय, संस्था अथवा विश्वविद्यालय के किसी पाठ्यक्रम में प्रवेश लेने से रोक सकता है, अथवा
 - (डी) जैसा निर्धारित करना चाहे, अर्थदंड निरूपित कर सकता है, और
 - (ई) विश्वविद्यालय अथवा कॉलेज अथवा विभागीय परीक्षा/परीक्षाओं में बैठने से एक वर्ष या अधिक के लिए रोक लगा सकता है, अथवा परीक्षा या परीक्षाओं से संबद्ध विद्यार्थी/विद्यार्थियों के परीक्षा परिणाम को रद्द कर सकता है।
5. संस्थान, हाल्स एवं संबंधित विभागों में शिक्षक अपने प्राधिकार का स्वयं प्रयोग कर सकते हैं अथवा अपने महाविद्यालयों, संस्थानों अथवा विभागों में ऐसे शिक्षक प्रत्यायोजित प्राधिकार का प्रयोग कर सकते हैं जिसे वे इस प्रयोजनों के लिए निर्दिष्ट किया जा सके।
6. कुलपति अथवा कुलानुशासक की शक्तियों पर प्रतिकूल प्रभाव डाले बिना जैसा पूर्वकथित है, अनुशासन एवं उचित आचरण के बारे में विस्तृत नियम बनाए जायेंगे। ये नियम इस विश्वविद्यालय में महाविद्यालय के प्राचार्यो, हॉल के प्रमुख, संकाय अधिष्ठाताओं और शिक्षण विभागों के विभागाध्यक्षों द्वारा जहाँ भी आवश्यक हो, वहाँ पूरक रूप में प्रयोग होंगे। प्रत्येक विद्यार्थी से आशा की जाती है कि वे नियमों की एक प्रति स्वयं के लिए सुरक्षित रख लें।
7. प्रवेश के समय प्रत्येक विद्यार्थी को एक घोषणापत्र सत्यापित करना आवश्यक होगा कि वह विश्वविद्यालय के कुलपति एवं उन अन्य अधिकारियों के समक्ष अनुशासनात्मक कार्यवाही करने के लिए विश्वविद्यालय द्वारा बनाये गये अधिनियमों, संविधियों, अध्यादेशों एवं नियमों का पालन करने को उपस्थित रहेगा/रहेगी।



अध्यादेश—XV—सी, रैगिंग निषेध और दंड व्यवस्था

1. महाविद्यालय/विभाग अथवा संस्थान के परिसर अथवा दिल्ली विश्वविद्यालय के अधीन किसी भी भाग में साथ ही सार्वजनिक परिवहन में किसी भी तरह की रैगिंग निषिद्ध है।
 2. रैगिंग की कार्यवाही, व्यक्तिगत अथवा सामूहिक प्रयास, घोर अनुशासनहीनता के कारण अक्षम्य है और इस अध्यादेश के अधीन विद्यार्थी कठोर अनुशासनात्मक कार्यवाही और दंड पाने के अधिकारी होंगे।
 3. इस अध्यादेश के अनुसार रैगिंग से आशय कक्षा में वरिष्ठ अथवा प्रभावी विद्यार्थियों द्वारा कमजोर अथवा कनिष्ठ नवागंतुक विद्यार्थियों को किसी ऐसे भद्दी टिप्पणी, आचरण अथवा शारीरिक—मानसिक तौर पर अपमानित करना है जो किसी भी प्रकार से प्रबल शक्ति का प्रभाव/दबाव का प्रयोग किया जाता है। यह व्यक्तिगत या सामूहिक दोनों स्तरों पर हो सकता है। इसके अंतर्गत निम्न कार्य आते हैं :—
 - (ए) शारीरिक प्रताड़ना या शारीरिक बल प्रयोग की धमकी।
 - (बी) महिला विद्यार्थियों की प्रतिष्ठा, गरिमा सम्मान को ठेस पहुँचाना।
 - (सी) अनुसूचित जाति/जनजाति के विद्यार्थियों की प्रतिष्ठा, गरिमा सम्मान को ठेस पहुँचाना।
 - (डी) अक्षम्य उपहास के लिए विद्यार्थियों को अनावृत एवं तिरस्कृत करना और उनके आत्मसम्मान को ठेस पहुँचाना।
 - (ई) अपशब्द कहना अथवा शारीरिक बल प्रयोग अथवा अश्लील व्यवहार करना।
 4. रैगिंग होने के विषय में जानकारी मिलने पर महाविद्यालय के प्राचार्य, विभागाध्यक्ष, संस्था के अध्यक्ष, महाविद्यालय के अधिकारी अथवा विश्वविद्यालय के छात्रावास अथवा हाल के प्रमुख को तत्काल कार्यवाही करनी होगी।
 5. खंड (4) के अतिरिक्त, कुलानुशासक अपने तरीके से रैगिंग की किसी घटना की जाँच कर कुलपति को रिपोर्ट देगा जिसमें रैगिंग में संलिप्त विद्यार्थी की पहचान एवं घटना की प्रकृति का उल्लेख होगा।
 6. कुलानुशासक एक आरंभिक रिपोर्ट भी दर्ज कर सकता है जिसमें रैगिंग करने वाले अपराधियों की पहचान एवं रैगिंग घटना की प्रकृति का उल्लेख होगा।
 7. संस्था के अध्यक्ष अथवा विभागाध्यक्ष अथवा महाविद्यालय के प्राचार्य अथवा कुलानुशासक यदि लिखित दस्तावेज में दर्ज किसी विवरण से संतुष्ट है एवं पाते हैं कि आगे जाँच करना यथोचित उपयोगी नहीं है तो वह तदनुसार कुलपति को सलाह दे सकता है।
 8. जब कुलपति भी संतुष्ट होते हैं कि ऐसी जाँच करना समीचीन नहीं है, तो उसका निर्णय अंतिम होगा।
 9. खंड 3 (ए), (बी) एवं (सी) में वर्णित रैगिंग घटनाओं के संबंध में खंड (5) अथवा (6) के अधीन रिपोर्ट प्राप्त होने पर अथवा खंड (7) के अधीन संबन्धित अधिकारियों द्वारा रैगिंग घटनाओं के घटित होने की पुष्टि होने पर कुलपति रैगिंग करने वाले विद्यार्थी अथवा विद्यार्थियों को निश्चित वर्षों के लिए तुरंत निष्कासित करने का आदेश दे सकते हैं।
 10. रैगिंग के अन्य मामलों में कुलपति रैगिंग से संबंधित विद्यार्थियों के निष्कासन का आदेश दे सकता है अथवा एक अथवा एक से अधिक वर्षों की अवधि के लिए महाविद्यालय की किसी विभागीय परीक्षा में प्रवेश से रोक सकता है अथवा उसके/उनके परीक्षा परिणाम/परिणामों को रद्द कर सकता है।
 11. यदि कोई विद्यार्थी जो दिल्ली विश्वविद्यालय से उपाधि अथवा डिप्लोमा प्राप्त कर चुका है वह इस अध्यादेश के अंतर्गत अपराधी पाया जाता है तो संविधि 15 के अधीन विश्वविद्यालय द्वारा प्रदत्त उपाधि अथवा डिप्लोमा की वापसी हेतु उचित कार्यवाही आरंभ की जा सकती है।
 12. इस अध्यादेश के तहत रैगिंग के लिए किसी भी प्रकार से दुष्प्रेरणा, दुर्व्यवहार के लिए उकसाना भी रैगिंग ही मानी जाएगी।
 13. दिल्ली विश्वविद्यालय प्रणाली के अंतर्गत सभी संस्थाएँ इस अध्यादेश के अधीन जारी सभी अनुदेशों/निर्देशों का पालन करने के लिए एवं प्रभावी द्रुत कार्यान्वयन और कुलपति की सहायता एवं सहयोग देने के लिये बाध्य होंगे।
- नोट : अध्यादेश XV—सी के अनुसरण में कुलपति का आदेश : इस अध्यादेश के तहत किसी भी प्राधिकारी द्वारा कुलपति को रैगिंग की घटना/घटनाएं की रिपोर्ट की जाती है/हैं तो रैगिंग में संलिप्त विद्यार्थी/विद्यार्थियों आदेश में निर्धारित विनिर्दिष्ट समय हेतु निष्कासित किया जाएगा। रैगिंग में संलिप्त गैर विद्यार्थियों के खिलाफ भारत के अपराध नियम के तहत कार्यवाही की जाएगी, उन्हें दिल्ली विश्वविद्यालय के किसी भी संस्थान में दाखिला प्राप्त करने हेतु पांच वर्षों तक अयोग्य भी कर दिया जाएगा।

**अध्यादेश XV-डी**

महिलाओं का कार्यस्थल पर लैंगिक उत्पीड़न (निवारण, निषेध और प्रतितोष) अधिनियम, 2013 (विधि एवं न्याय मंत्रालय)

कार्यस्थल पर महिलाओं के लैंगिक उत्पीड़न के प्रति सुरक्षा प्रदान करने के लिए एक अधिनियम और लैंगिक उत्पीड़न की शिकायतों तथा इसके साथ जुड़े मामलों अथवा आकस्मिक मामलों की रोकथाम और निवारण।

जहां भारत के संविधान के अनुच्छेद 14 और 15 के तहत समानता के लिए एक महिला के मौलिक अधिकारों के उल्लंघन का परिणाम यौन उत्पीड़न और जीवन के अधिकार और संविधान के अनुच्छेद 21 के तहत गरिमा के साथ जीने और किसी पेशे को करने अथवा किसी भी व्यवसाय, ट्रेड अथवा व्यापार करने का अधिकार है जिसमें लैंगिक उत्पीड़न से मुक्त एक सुरक्षित वातावरण का अधिकार शामिल है, और जहां लैंगिक उत्पीड़न और गरिमा के साथ काम करने का अधिकार अंतरराष्ट्रीय कन्वेंशन्स एवं इंस्ट्रुमेंट्स द्वारा सार्वभौमिक रूप से मान्यता प्राप्त है, जैसे कि महिलाओं के खिलाफ भेदभाव के सभी रूपों के उन्मूलन पर कन्वेंशन, जिसकी 25 जून 1993 को भारत सरकार द्वारा अभिपुष्टि की गई है। और जहां कार्यस्थल पर लैंगिक उत्पीड़न के खिलाफ महिलाओं की सुरक्षा के लिए कहे गए कन्वेंशन को प्रभावी बनाने के लिए प्रावधान करना फायदेमंद है।

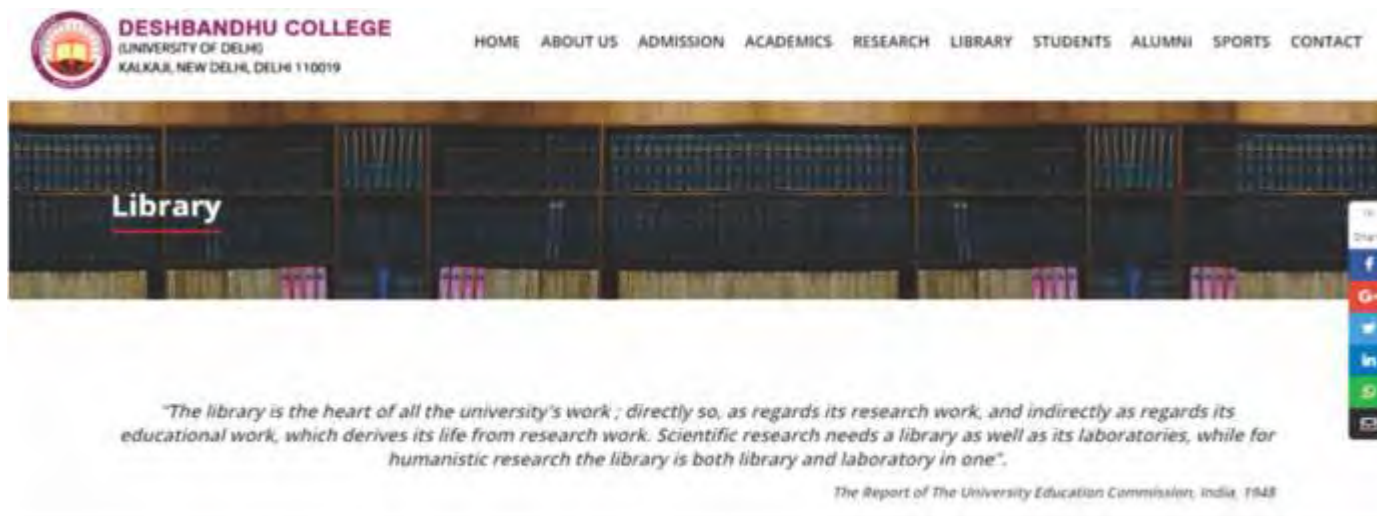


FACILITIES AND RESOURCES

LIBRARY

The Mantra of the Library
 “The right book to the right user at the right time”

The college library provides impetus to services with the introduction of new and modern ICT infrastructure. The library has well equipped air conditioned reading hall and is connected with Wi-Fi network. The library is connected with Delhi University wide area campus network and provides access to electronic resources to library clientele from Delhi University Library System (DULS) and UGC-Infonet Consortium. The library provides various services such as Reference service, Circulation service, Newspaper clipping service, Question & Syllabus Bank, Book Bank service. The orientation programme is conducted at the beginning of new academic session every year. All the books are bar-coded and made easily searchable through the Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC). The library has a massive collection of more than 117253 books, 51 periodicals, 15 Newspapers and 450 CDs.



The College Library also subscribed National Library and Information Services Infrastructure for Scholarly Content (N-LIST). It is an initiative of the Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD) under the NME-ICT now funded by UGC, as college component under UGC-INFONET Digital Library Consortium. Under N-LIST Programme, the library users are able to access more than 6,000 e-Journals and 2,00,000 e-Books.



The library also subscribed DELNET (Developing Library Network) for accessing Union catalogue of books and periodicals.





The college library has the e-facility for visually impaired students and dedicated computer lab with scanner and internet connectivity. The library users can access the library catalogue online and library has two state-of-the-art touch screen information kiosk for accessing the library catalogue inside the library.

The Deshbandhu College Library has salient features. These are followings:

- a) CCTV Monitoring with 32 High Definition cameras inside the library at various locations to cover all the corners of the library.
- b) Two 40 inches LED Screens at circulation counter for seeing the library transaction through Libsys.
- c) Webopac Facility.
- d) Air conditioned reading room facility with capacity of 100 students and also have air conditioned reading room facility for the teachers.



- e) Teachers information resource centre
- f) Students information resource centre
- g) Library Seminar Room
- h) Digital Library of Deshbandhu College: The library users are able to access e-Shodh Sindhu, N-LIST, Open Access E-resources and other useful e-resources through college website

- **Girls Common Room:** For female students, there is a common room with good seating arrangement and ambience along with a female security attendant. It is situated next to the staff room.
- **Boys Common Room:** It is located adjacent to the canteen .
- **Canteen:** College has a very traditional yet extremely sumptuous food offered by the canteen. It is adjacent to the main gate and is run on a contract.
- **Photocopying Service :** Photocopy facility on payment bases is available in the college premises.
- **Web Access Centre:** The whole college campus is wi-fi enabled and web access centre computers provide faculty members and students with access to online journals and content provided by University of Delhi on its Internet.
- **Medical Room:** There is a medical room adjacent to the college office for providing basic first aid to the students.
- **Banking:** The college has services of Punjab & Sind Bank. Students can open their account as well as take advantage of other banking facilities. Bank also has an ATM in college premises.
- **Auditorium:** The college has a fully air-conditioned auditorium with good seating arrangement for seminars, conferences and other activities.
- **Committee Room:** An air conditioned IT enabled committee room with optimum seating capacity is situated in front of Principal Office. This room is used for meetings, seminars and discussions.
- **Laboratories:** College has well equipped laboratories for all the science courses namely Biochemistry, Botany, Chemistry, Physics, Zoology. Computer Science department has its own centre for computer related practicals.
- **Botanical Garden:** College has well maintained Botanical Garden with diverse forms of plants. It has a well maintained pond ecosystem apart from variety of terrestrial flora. Botanical Garden provides experimental material for class work and has a good nursery also.
- **Parking:** College has a gated parking facility for staff members which is guarded by the security staff round-the clock.
- **Placement Cell- CYFLE**

The college started its Placement Cell actively working for career guidance and providing jobs to the students. It has always been a guiding force for the students and continuously strives to help them work on their skills, aptitudes, strengths and weaknesses by providing multivarious opportunities. National Cadets Corps (NCC)

The college has two Senior Division NCC (Army Wing) company with strength of 160 cadets each for girls and boys. The College also has one Senior Division NCC (Air Wing) sub unit with a strength of 50 boy cadets. Additionally, Naval Wing vacancies are also available for 40 boy cadets (SD) and 10 girl cadets (SW). The NCC aims to develop qualities like character, comradeship, discipline, secular outlook, sportsmanship and selfless service of the country in the cadets. FAQ

Q1. Can I take admission in two different courses or the same course in different colleges after declaration of a cut off?

Ans. No, you cannot take admission simultaneously in two different courses or the same course in different colleges. In case you take admission at two places, your admission will be cancelled from both the colleges/courses.

Q2. Will the applicants be given admission on a first-come, first served policy after declaration of cut-offs?

Ans. Admissions in the colleges are not based on first come, first served policy. Instead, the applicant who has filled the online registration form and satisfies the criteria and cut-off for a particular course in a particular college will be considered for admission as per the schedule of admission specified.

Q3 Will there be any disadvantage for gap year students?

Ans. No, there is no disadvantage to gap year students and they will be treated at par with regular students. They should meet the requisite course-specific criteria for admission and must possess the necessary documents/certificates.

Q4 Is it important to have caste or tribe certificate in the name of the applicant?

Ans. Yes, if you are applying under any reserved category, then you must have the relevant reservation certificate issued by competent authority, in the name of the applicant. An OBC certificate must also specify that the applicant belongs to non-creamy layer and the caste is listed in the Central Government list. The applicant applying under any category should have the caste certificate (in this case OBC non-creamy layer certificate) of the current financial year that is issued on or after 31st March 2020. The student's name and the father's name mentioned in caste certificate must be the same as those mentioned in Class X certificate/ mark sheet.

Q5. Is there any reservation for students who are residents of Delhi?

Ans. No, the University of Delhi does not provide any such reservation to the residents of Delhi.

Q6. Is there any Student Union quota or Faculty quota under which an applicant is permitted to get admission in any courses?

Ans. No, University of Delhi does not provide any Student Union quota or Faculty quota for admission to any applicants. If anybody promises admission to any applicant under these quotas, he/she is making a false promise. However, there exists a Teaching/Non-teaching Ward Quota that is available only for the children of employees of University of Delhi.

Q7. Is there a quota for Jammu and Kashmir migrants?

Ans. The wards of Kashmiri migrants will be registered centrally by the university for admission to various undergraduate courses in different streams. The allotment of seats to the courses/colleges will be made on the basis of preference-cum-merit, not more than three seats in one college, one seat in one stream. One seat in merit quota as an additional seat will be reserved in each technical institute under the Faculty of Technology for admission to BE courses for the academic session.

Q8. I have completed my class XII from NIOS (National Institute of Open Schooling). Can I get admission in a regular college?

Ans. Yes, you can get admission in a regular college provided you have applied in an available program/course and meet the cut-off criteria.



Q9. Are the marks of Internal Assessment considered for the calculation of Best four/Best three subjects for admission?

Ans. No. Internal Assessment marks are not considered for calculation of Best four/Best three subjects for admission.

Q10. What is pro-rata calculation? When do we apply such a calculation?

Ans. When the theory and practical marks are not in accordance with 70:30 ratio there is a requirement of pro-rata calculation, which is mentioned in the Brochure of University of Delhi. .

Q11. How to select Generic Elective papers?

Ans. Generic Elective (GE) papers are offered to the students in semester I, II, III and IV. The GE papers being offered by various departments of the college are floated on the college website. Please note that the students should select GE papers from other courses and not from his/her course. Students are expected to provide their choices of GE papers in a preferential order via their admission form (for semester I) or via online form (for semester II, III and IV).

Q12. What is the main purpose of GE papers?

Ans. An elective course chosen generally from an unrelated discipline/subject, with an intention to seek exposure is called a Generic Elective. Generic elective (GE) papers are offered for the students, who have interest to learn subjects other than the core subject. It is compulsory to take GE papers.

Q13 How to select (GE) papers for B.Sc. (H) Zoology?

Ans. Taking future scope of studying Zoology into consideration, students of B. Sc. (H) Zoology are hereby advised to study at least one GE paper of Botany and Chemistry each, during their undergraduate course. Please refer to Q 11 for more details.

Q14. What is the basis for selection for B.Sc. (H) Botany?

Ans. Selection will be made on the basis of aggregate of marks in 3 Science Subjects i.e. Physics, Chemistry and Biology (PCB) only in class XII examination with English as a language.

Q14 What are the various prerequisites for admission to the B. Sc. (H) Chemistry?

Ans. B.Sc. (H) Chemistry is an undergraduate program of 3 years duration. Candidates must have passed 10+2 or any other equivalent examination in Science stream with Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics as compulsory subjects and English as a language.

Q15 I did not have Mathematics in Class XII. Can I opt for B.A. (H) Economics or B.Com. (H)?

Ans. No, you cannot opt for B.A. (H) Economics or B. Com. (H) without having studied Mathematics in Class XII. The applicant must have studied and passed Mathematics at the qualifying examination for admission to B.A. (H) Economics. The merit shall be determined on the basis of one language and three best academic/elective subjects as specified in List A and List B.

Q16 What is the Admission Eligibility Criterion for taking admission in B.Sc. (H) Physics?

Ans. Selection will be made on the basis of aggregate of marks in 3 Science Subjects i.e. Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics (PCM) in class XII examination with English as a language. .
